

## WIOA AJC Partner legend

AEFLA	Adult Education and Family Literacy Act. Provides support for adult basic and literacy education programs for adults who lack basic skills, a high school diploma, or proficiency in English
CSBG	Community Services Block Grant. An anti-poverty block grant that funds a network of agencies that create, coordinate, and deliver programs and services to low-income Americans.
DVR	Division of Vocational Rehabilitation. Provides counseling, training, education, transportation, job placement, assistive technology and other support services to people with disabilities.
Job Corps	A free residential education and job training program for young adults ages 16-24.
JVSG	Jobs for Veterans State Grants. Provides individualized career and training-related services to veterans (and other eligible persons) with significant barriers to employment and assists employers fill their workforce needs with job-seeking veterans.
Native Hawaiian	Provides quality employment and training services to tribes, tribal organizations, Alaska Native entities, Indian controlled organizations and Native Hawaiian organizations serving unemployed and low income Native Americans, Alaska Natives and Native Hawaiians.
NFJP	National Farmworker Jobs Program. Services for migrant and seasonal farmworkers. Programs partners with community organizations and state agencies to counter the chronic unemployment and underemployment experienced by farmworkers who depend primarily on jobs in agricultural labor performed across the county.
Perkins	Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education grant. To develop more fully the academic, and career and technical skills of secondary education students and postsecondary education students who elect to enroll in career and technical education programs.
SCSEP	Senior Community Services Employment Program. A community service and work-based job training program for older Americans.
TAA	Trade Adjustment Assistance. Intended to foster fair and open international trade.
TANF	Temporary Assistance for Needy Families. Designed to help needy families achieve self-sufficiency.

Unemployment Insurance	Benefits to eligible workers who are unemployed through no fault of their own (as determined under state law), and meet other eligibility requirements of state law.
Wagner-Peyser	The Wagner-Peyser Act of 1933 established a nationwide system of public employment offices known as the Employment Service. Focus is on providing a variety of employment related labor exchanges services including but not limited to job search assistance, job referral, and placement assistance for job seekers, re-employment services to unemployment insurance claimants, and recruitment services to employers with job openings.
WIOA Adult	Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Adult Program. Prepares workers – particularly individuals with barriers to employment – for good jobs by providing job search assistance and training. The Adult Program provides an emphasis on serving public assistance recipients, other low-income individuals, and individuals who are low-skilled.
WIOA DW	Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Dislocated Worker Program. Designed to help dislocated workers become reemployed through job search assistance and/or training that builds their occupational skills to meet labor market needs.
WIOA Youth	Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Youth Program. A comprehensive youth employment program for serving eligible youth, ages 14-24, who face barriers to education, training, and employment.
