

Overall Sentiment







Our industry pumps millions of dollars into our local economy...money that mostly stays on island and is therefore reinvested in our community. Our industry is a collection of locally owned businesses, employing thousands of Maui residents. These are quality jobs that allow locals to have families, buy houses, afford food and live a good life thanks to their hard work.

Just one average wedding employs: Coordinators Florists Venues Photographers Videographers Musicians
Caterers
Hair and Makeup
Performers
Officiants
Bar Services
Decor, Furniture And Tent Rentals
Transportation
Bakers
Photobooths
Lighting and Sound
Calligraphers and Sign Painters
Wedding Dress Attendants
Many more

That's just the vendors at the wedding. These weddings typically consist of 40-100 (or more) guests who turn their trip into a vacation. They will all book flights, rent cars, book accommodations, go to bars and restaurants, shop at local stores, buy groceries, book excursions, buy gifts, etc.

One wedding with 60 guests can easily pump \$500,000+ into the local economy. That's just one wedding.

I can tell you after filming over 400 weddings these are the kind of people we want as visitors. They are here to participate in one of life's most important days and this gives them a special attachment to Maui that the average visitor might not have. In other words, they are overjoyed to be here and they want to come back! These are respectful visitors who often volunteer during their time on island. Imagine taking time off from your wedding week in paradise to help distribute food...that's the kind of visitor Maui needs.

We need your help NOW! Weddings take a year or more to plan so immediate action is needed or our industry will continue to collapse and more good people will lose their homes and businesses. A huge part of our local economy will simply disappear and the ripple effect in our local communities will be devastating.

The Maui wedding industry has been quietly responsible for bringing in millions of dollars and employing thousands of locals. We have done so without asking anyone for help, but since the pandemic and the fires we are struggling to barely survive. Our industry needs your help and honestly we deserve it.
