IT MEMORIALIZING THE UNFORTUNATE PASSING OF 19-YEAR-OLD HANNAH BROWN. WHO WAS KILLED BY A DRUNK DRIVER IN 2019. THESE KIND OF ACCIDENTS ARE TOTALLY AVOIDABLE AND SHE WOULD BE HERE TODAY HAD IT NOT BEEN FOR THAT ACCIDENT. INTERESTING ENOUGH WHEN SHE WAS IN HIGH SCHOOL, SHE SAID HER MOM SAID TO ME ONE YEAR AGO, THAT HER GRADUATION HIGH SCHOOL PROJECT WAS ABOUT DRUNK-DRIVING AND THE DANGERS OF DRUNK-DRIVING. AND HERE SHE WAS WITH US FOR THE 6TH ANNUAL HANNAH BROWN MEMORIAL RALLY. HER FAMILY SHARED THAT THEY LIVE EACH DAY MISSING HER, AND HAVING TAKEN THIS TRAGEDY. IT'S MAKING THEM AWARE THAT THIS WAS TOTALLY AVOIDABLE.\r\n\r\nSPEAKERS THAT TONIGHT WAS OUR MAYOR, WHO WAS THE PROSECUTING ATTORNEY AND HE, TOO, SHARED THAT THESE WERE ONE OF THE SADDEST KINDS OF CASES THEY TOOK, BECAUSE IT WAS TOTALLY AVOIDABLE. I WANT TO THANK LIEUTENANT RETIRED LIEUTENANT WILLIAM HANKINS, AN DREA AND THEIR FAMILY WAS IMPACTED BY DRUNK-DRIVING AND ANDREW MARTIN, AND IT WAS VERY SAD JUST TO HEAR HOW AVOIDABLE THIS IS ALL. WHY I WANTED TO TALK ABOUT THIS TODAY IS THAT THIS COUNCIL IN 2019 GOT PASSED A TOWING BILL. SO AT CHECKPOINTS NOW, IF YOU GOT -- IF YOU WERE DEEMED TO BE IMPAIRED,

AND TAKEN AWAY, IN THE PAST YOU COULD JUST DRIVE YOUR CAR AWAY. BUT ON THE NIGHT OF ANY KIND OF ARREST FOR IMPAIRED DRIVING, THE CAR IS TAKEN AWAY, AND I WAS REALLY SHOCKED TO HEAR THAT FROM 2019 WHEN THIS LAW WAS IMPLEMENTED, THERE WERE 8393 VEHICLES THAT WERE TAKEN AWAY. LAST YEAR, THERE WERE 2007 VEHICLES TAKEN AWAY. AND THE SPEAKER WAS A POLICE OFFICER, I DON'T HAVE HIS NAME, BUT HE TALKED ABOUT HOW THE LAST INCIDENT THAT HE TOOK AWAY WAS A 12-PASSENGER VAN.\r\n\r\nTHE DRIVER WOULD HAVE GONE OFF TO PICK UP VISITORS AT THE HOTEL TO TAKE THEM TO THEIR DESTINATION, BUT HE WAS TOTALLY INTOXICATED. UU-HODGINS, MEMBER UU-HODGINS, DO YOU WANT TO CALL UP ANYBODY IN PARTICULAR? >> I DON'T WANT TO FORCE ANYBODY'S HAND TO SPEAK, BUT IF THEY WOULD LOVE TO, I WOULD LOVE TO HEAR FROM THEM.\r\n\r\nIF NOT, IF WE COULD PLEASE ASK THEM TO COME TAKE PHOTOS WITH US AND WE WILL PRESENT THEM WITH LEIS. >> MR. LU'UWAI. HELEN IS YOUR MOTHER? I HAVE TO TELL THIS STORY -- BUT A BROTHER, PROBABLY NOT YOU, BUT WE WERE IN LAS VEGAS, ON THE CRAP TABLE, AND HERE COMES THIS LU'UWAI BOY, AND HE SAYS EVERYONE JUST RELAX, GET YOUR PUPUS, BECAUSE I'M GOING TO BE HERE ALL DAY, ALL DAY. AT THE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS IS NOT ONLY A GOLD MEDAL FOR THE GIRLS, IT'S A GOLD MEDAL FOR THE FAMILIES, IT'S A GOLD MEDAL FOR OUR CLUB, AND IT'S A GOLD MEDAL FOR MAUI, AND WE REPRESENT THE STATE OF HAWAI'I. IT'S A BIG THING FOR US AS PADDLERS AND I JUST WANT TO APPRECIATE YOU GUYS RECOGNIZING OUR KIDS. THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU VERY MUCH. >> PAUL LU'UWAI, THEY ASKED ME TO SAY MY NAME. >> ANY QUESTIONS FOR THE TESTIFIER? ANYONE ELSE LIKE TO SAY SOMETHING? COME ON UP AND STATE YOUR NAME FOR THE RECORD.\r\n\r\nON THE MICROPHONE. >> FIRST, THANK YOU, CHAIRPERSON AND COUNCIL. THIS IS SUCH AN HONOR. I WAS HERE TWO YEARS AGO, WHEN YOU HONORED MY TEAM THEN AND I SAID I WOULD BE BACK. SO I GUESS I KEPT MY WORD. LIKE PAUL, I'M IN CHARGE OF A LOT OF WOMEN. I COACH OF THE SENIOR WOMEN, WHICH WOULD INCLUDE 60, 70, 75 AND 80S. SO THOSE ARE THE DIVISIONS THAT NOW WE'RE RACING AT THE INTERNATIONAL-LEVEL AND I BROUGHT WITH ME TWO OF MY TEAMMATES, CAMMY FROM MOLOKA'I AND JEANETTE FROM MAUI.\r\n\r\nTHE OTHER ONES, MY TEAM IS ACTUALLY MADE UP OF SIX WOMEN, BUT TWO ARE NOT FROM MAUI COUNTY. AS WE'RE CALLED ISLAND MASTERS. I JUST WANT TO SAY THANK YOU FOR RECOGNIZING -- I HAVE BEEN DOING THIS FOR ALMOST 45 YEARS. AND I HAVE BEEN DOING THE WORLD SPRINTS SINCE THE EARLY 80S. AND IT'S BEEN DONE TWICE IN HILO, AND I WANT TO ACKNOWLEDGE NOHE AND KALEIOHI FOR YOUR INCREDIBLE JOB. I DON'T KNOW HOW IT WOULD GO BASED ON THE FIRST TIME THERE, BUT THEY WERE EXCEPTIONAL AND REPRESENTED HAWAI'I. I WAS SO PROUD, AND I WAS SO PROUD OF HAWAI'I. WE'RE LIKE ONE THE LARGEST CONTINGENCIES THAT PARTICIPATE, AND WE BRING MAJOR POINTS. IT'S A WONDERFUL FEELING TO COMPETE AT THAT LEVEL AND I'M SO PROUD EVERY TWO YEARS TO COMPETE AND I REPRESENT MY OWN TEAM, OF COURSE, BUT MAUI AND HAWAI'I. WE'RE OUR SEPARATE AREA, BECAUSE WE'RE SO LARGE. THANK YOU AGAIN. >> THANK YOU.\r\n\r\nWE HAVE A QUESTION FOR YOU FROM MEMBER RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> MY QUESTION, >> YES. >> HI. >> HI. >> THANK YOU FOR SHARING TWO OF YOUR GIRLS. >> THANK YOU, MAHALO FOR BRINGING ONE OF THEM WITH US TODAY TO SPEAK TO HOW HAWAII IS REPRESENTED. THIS IS INTERNATIONAL VA'A FEDERATION.\r\n\r\nSO HAWAI'I IS KIND OF RECOGNIZED AS A NATION IN BEING REPRESENTED SEPARATELY FROM -- >> YES. IF I HAD TO SPEAK TO THE U.S. AS A COUNTRY, THERE'S ACTUALLY FOUR AREAS THAT ARE RECOGNIZED, BUT WE'RE THE LARGEST, HAWAI'I. AND RIGHTFULLY SO. WE BRING SUCH -- I'M NOT REALLY SURE, SAYING ALMOST 400 FROM OUR AREA. THAT IS PROBABLY FAIR TO THE OTHER COUNTRIES. BUT THERE ARE -- I REMEMBER WHEN THERE WERE ONLY, I THINK, 12 COUNTRIES AND NOW THERE'S WAY, WAY OVER 30, WHICH I'M SURPRISED IT'S NOT AN OLYMPIC SPORT, BECAUSE I KNOW THAT IS ONE OF THE THINGS THAT HELPS PUT THAT IN. I DON'T KNOW HOW SKATEBOARDING GOT IN AHEAD OF US? BUT ANYHOW, I'M JUST HAPPY THEY KEEP CREATING DIVISIONS FOR US, 75 IS NOW AND WE HAVE 80S AND EVEN THOUGH WE HAD ONLY TWO 80 CREWS THERE, WE HAVE THEM IN THE STATE COMPETITION.\r\nTHERE'S STILL DIVISIONS FOR US. BEGINNING WITH JORDAN HAWKER TESTIFYING ON COMMITTEE REPORT 24-117, FOLLOWED BY LESLEY GARO. >> GOOD MORNING. >> GOOD MORNING, CHAIR LEE, GOOD MORNING COUNCIL MEMBERS.\r\n\r\nMY NAME IS JORDAN HAWKER, I'M HAPPY TO BE HERE. I WOULD LIKE TO TAKE A MOMENT TO THANK COUNCIL MEMBER SUGIMURA FOR ACKNOWLEDGING THE BROWN FAMILY. IN 2019 WHEN SHE PASSED AWAY I WAS HER SUPERVISOR. SO IT WAS A VERY DIFFICULT DAY ON THE NEXT DAY OF WORK. SO I AGREE, DRUNK-DRIVING IS ABSOLUTELY PREVENTABLE. AND THANK YOU FOR TAKING GREATER ACTION FOR THAT. MY

NAME IS JORDAN HAWKER HERE TESTIFYING TODAY ON COMMITTEE -- CR24-114. IN REGARDS TO THE COUNTY -- THE BUDGET APPROPRIATION FOR THE COUNTY ACQUISITION OF THE 273-ACRE VON TEMPSKY PARCEL./r/n/r/nI'M TESTIFYING ON BEHALF OF THE KULA COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION AND WE'RE FULLY BEHIND THIS BUDGET APPROPRIATION. THIS PARCEL STANDS AS AN OPPORTUNITY FOR UP COUNTRY TO SERVE THE MISSION OF THE KULA COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION, WHICH IS TO PRESERVE OPEN SPACE. AND PROMOTE AGRICULTURE. AS WELL AS A STRONG COMMUNITY. FURTHER, WE SUPPORT THIS PARCEL BEING STEWARDED BY AN ENTITY THAT IS SELECTED THROUGH A PUBLIC TRANSPARENT PROCESS. WE WOULD LIKE TO HAVE OUR INPUT --WE'D LIKE TO ALSO HEAR FROM ENTITIES THAT EXPERIENCE AND THE RESOURCES TO MANAGE A 273-ACRE PARCEL AND VERY INTERESTED IN PICKING THE RIGHT ENTITY FOR THIS. YOU KNOW, WE SEE THIS PARCEL AS AN OPPORTUNITY TO GIVE OUR YOUNG PEOPLE A PLACE TO GATHER SKILLS AND PROFESSIONS, LIKE, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY, RANCHING AND AGRICULTURE. YOU MAY OR MAY NOT HAWAI'I HAS THE OLDEST CONCENTRATION OF FARMERS IN THE ENTIRE NATION. TWICE AS MANY FARMERS OVER THE AGE 75 AS WE DO UNDER 35. WHICH IS A BIG DEAL, BECAUSE KULA. REFERRED TO AS THE BREAD BASKET OF OUR ISLAND. AND SO YOU KNOW, WE SEE THIS AS AN OPPORTUNITY TO GIVE OUR YOUTH THE ABILITY TO INVEST IN SOMETHING.\r\n\r\nWE KNOW THAT YOUTH WITHOUT PURPOSE GET IN TROUBLE, BUT YOUTH WITH PURPOSE, AND DIRECTION, BECOME AN INVALUABLE ASSET AND RESOURCE AND WE WANT TO INVEST IN THEM. TO CLOSE [INAUDIBLE] FOR REALLY HEARING THE COMMUNITY ONCE AGAIN ON OUR INVESTMENT INTO THINGS GOING FORWARD./r/n/r/nTHANK YOU SO MUCH >> THANK YOU, MS. HAWKER, PRO TEM KAMA. >> THANK YOU,, CHAIR. THANK YOU FOR BEING HERE AND GIVING TESTIMONY, MS. HAWKER. IN YOUR WANTING TO CONTINUE THE DIALOGUE WITH OUR MANAGING DIRECTOR, AND LOOKING FOR SOMEONE TO ACTUALLY STEWARD THE ENTIRE PROPERTY, AND YOUR INVOLVEMENT AND PARTICIPATION WITH KC A HAVE YOU REACHED OUT TO THE OTHER GROUPS IN UP COUNTRY. >> LIKE THE HOMESTEADERS.\r\n\r\n>> AND KEKUA. >> AND KICK HIKI NUI. WE HAVEN'T AT THIS POINT IN TIME, WE WOULD LOVE TO HAVE A PUBLIC HEARING UPCOUNTRY AND ACTUALLY DO THAT LEG WORK TO MAKE SURE EVERYONE IS INVOLVED. THAT IS SOMETHING WE WOULD BE DEDICATED TO. >> THANK YOU VERY MUCH. >> ANY MORE QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU, MS./r/n/r/nHAWKER. >> THANK YOU SO MUCH. >> NEXT TESTIFIER. PLEASE. >> NEXT TESTIFIER IS LESLEY GARO, TESTIFYING ON CR24-119, FOLLOWED BY KRISTEN MILLS. >> ALOHA CHAIR, VICE-CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL. MY NAME IS LESLEY GARO AND I REPRESENT HAWAI'I PUBLIC HEALTH INSTITUTE AS THEIR MAUI COUNTY TOBACCO-FREE COORDINATOR. WE STAND ON OUR CURRENT TESTIMONY IN STRONG SUPPORT OF BILL 156. WE APPRECIATE THE OPPORTUNITY TO TESTIFY ON THIS IMPORTANT MEASURE, AS THERE'S WIDESPREAD COMMUNITY SUPPORT FOR BILL 156. A SURVEY FROM DECEMBER 2023 FOUND THAT 73% OF REGISTERED VOTERS IN MAUI COUNTY WERE IN SUPPORT OF A LAW PROHIBITING ALL FLAVORS INCLUDING MENTHOL AND SAY THAT THEY VAPING OUR USING E-CIGARETTES IS A MAJOR PROBLEM AND 73% BELIEVE THAT THE USE OF CIGARETTES ARE HARMFUL TO TEENS AND FAMILIES.\r\n\r\nMAUI COUNTY HAS THE HIGHEST RATE OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS WHO USE E-CIGARETTES IN THE STATE AT 15%, WHICH IS ABOVE THE STATE AVERAGE OF 13%. OF EVEN GREATER CONCERN MAUI COUNTY HAS THE SECOND HIGHEST RATE OF TEENS USING E-CIGARETTES AT 10% AND BECOMING A PROBLEM FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS. MAUI HAS THE HIGHEST RATE OF HIGH SCHOOL AND MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS THAT SMOKE MENTHOL CIGARETTES. 19.9% OF MAUI HIGH SCHOOLS SMOKE MENTHOL CIGARETTES AND THAT RATE HAS DOUBLED SINCE 2021. BUT THERE'S A HUGE PROBLEM, AND THE LIVES OF OUR YOUTH ARE AT-RISK. SPECIFICALLY THE YOUTH OF MAUI HAVE ENDURED NUMEROUS CHALLENGES, HARDSHIP AND TRAGEDIES IN PAST FEW YEARS. THEY HAVE

POTENTIAL FOR OUR FUTURE LEADERSHIPS, BUT WITH FLAVORED FOCUS BEING SO ACCESSIBLE FOR THE YOUTH, THEY WON'T BE ABLE TO LIVE UP TO THEIR FULL POTENTIAL AND HELP SHAPE THE FUTURE OF MAUI. THANK YOU FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO SUBMIT TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT OF BILL 156. BY PASSING THIS LEGISLATION, THE COUNTY SENDS A CLEAR STRONG MESSAGE TOT PUBLIC THAT MAUI COUNTY IS COMMITTED TO UPLIFTING THE HEALTH AND WELL-BEING OF ITS RESIDENTS AND SHOWING THAT COMMUNITY HEALTH IS MORE IMPORTANT THAN TOBACCO PROFITS. THANK YOU.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR YOUR TESTIMONY. ANY QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU AGAIN. >> CHAIR, NEXT TESTIFIER IS CRISTEN MILLS TESTIFYING ON CR24-119, FOLLOWED BY TIARI HORNER. >> ALOHA, CHAIR LEE, AND ALL HONORABLE -- SORRY -- I NEED THESE TO SEE THIS. I NEED THEM TO SEE YOU. MAYBE I DON'T NEED THEM?\r\n\r\nALL HONORABLE COUNCIL MEMBERS, MY NAME IS CRISTEN MILLS I'M A RESIDENT OF PUKALANI AND A PARENT AND HEALTH EDUCATOR SPEAKING AS A PRIVATE SUPPORT IN STRONG SUPPORT OF THE BILL. IT'S REALLY CHALLENGING TO EDUCATE AT THE INDIVIDUAL AND EVEN GROUP-LEVEL. SO EDUCATION REALLY ISN'T ENOUGH. HISTORICALLY STRONG PUBLIC HEALTH POLICIES HAVE BEEN AT THE FOREFRONT TO PROTECT PEOPLE FROM HARMS. FOR EXAMPLE. BEFORE SETTING LAWS AGAINST SMOKING IN PUBLIC PLACES, INCLUDING BUSINESS PLACES, WE HAD TO RELY ON EDUCATION TO TEACH PEOPLE WHY THEY SHOULDN'T SPEAK CIGARETTES AND THAT BECAME LAW, AND OUR SMOKING OF TRADITIONAL CIGARETTES, THIS IS BEFORE VAPES WERE A THING, DROPPED DRAMATICALLY. SO POLICIES, AS YOU ALL KNOW, REALLY DO WORK. SO WE NEED MAUI COUNTY TO ONCE AGAIN SUPPORT OUR YOUTH AT THE LOCAL-LEVEL BY SUPPORTING BILL 156. OUR YOUTH LOVE SWEETS.\r\n\r\nWHO DOESN'T? EVERYONE LOVES SWEETS; RIGHT? AND BY AGE, THEY ARE INTENDED AND DOING THEIR NATURAL THING BY EXPLORING NEW ACTIVITIES, AND TRYING NEW THINGS. THIS NATURAL TENDENCY TO EXPLORE AND FIGURE OUT WHO THEY ARE AS UP-AND-COMING ADULTS SHOULDN'T INCLUDE GETTING ADDICTED AND POTENTIALLY HAVING A LIFE-LONG ADDICTION PROBLEM, BECAUSE THESE PRODUCTS ARE BEING MARKETED TO THEM. SORRY, SEE WHERE I'M AT? NICOTINE DOES LEAD TO ADDICTION, AND DOES AFFECT THE DEVELOPING BRAIN. AND THE TOBACCO INDUSTRY IS TARGETING OUR YOUTH WITH OVER 15,000 FLAVORS INCLUDING HAWAIIAN POG AND THEY GO AFTER OUR HAWAI'I KIDS WITH HAWAI'I-SPECIFICS SUCH AS HAWAIIAN POG, OHNO ORANGE CREAM, LAVA GUAVA, WHO DO YOU THINK THESE FLAVORS ARE MEANT TO ATTRACT? REGARDLESS OF THE RETAILER'S INTENTION NOT TO SELL TO MINORS THESE PRODUCTS GET INTO THEIR HANDS AND INTO THEIR BODIES.\r\n\r\nNEARLY HALF, 48% OF ALL HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS. SO I COULDN'T HELP, BUT WATCHING THOSE YOUNG PEOPLE COME IN, ONE, TWO, ONE, TWO, ONE, TWO, I CERTAINLY HOPE NOT. AND THERE'S A HUGE DISPARITY, BUT ON AVERAGE, NEARLY HALF OF ALL HAWAII'S STUDENTS -- >> TIME. >> THANK YOU. >> COULD YOU CONCLUDE? >> YES, ABSOLUTELY. SORRY./r/n/r/nAND MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS HAVE TRIED THESE PRODUCTS SO THEY ARE GETTING INTO THEIR HANDS. PLEASE SUPPORT THIS BILL AND HELP PROTECT OUR YOUTH. THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU. ANY QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? WE HAVE ONE QUESTION FROM PRO TEM KAMA. >> THANK YOU. CHAIR.\r\n\r\n>> THANKS FOR BEING HERE CRISTEN. YOUNG PEOPLE'S ABILITY TO EXPLORE, BECAUSE THAT IS ASK IS WHAT THEY ARE SUPPOSED TO DO; RIGHT? AND THAT IS THE AGE AND WHO WE DISCOVER WHO WE ARE AND WANT TO BE AS WE GET OLDER. SO THAT ABILITY TO DO THAT IS WHAT IS GOING TO SEND THEM INTO THIS AREA OF EXPLORATION. BUT HOW DO WE ENSURE THAT THEY CAN STILL EXPLORE, BUT EXPLORE SAFELY? WHAT ARE THINGS OUT THERE THAT WE CAN HELP THEM TO EXPLORE? LIKE ON THE DISCOVERY CHANNEL YOU CAN EXPLORE SO MUCH STUFF, BUT YOU DON'T HAVE TO GO THERE, BUT HAVE TO WATCH THERE./r/n/r/nIS THERE SOMETHING DEVELOPED THAT ALLOWS YOUNG PEOPLE TO EXPLORE, SO THEY CAN ACTUALLY SEE WHAT COULD HAPPEN, IF AND WHEN THEY DO THIS SPECIFIC TO TOBACCO PRODUCTS. >> YES. >> THROUGH EDUCATION. WITH RECENT HARMS AND HOW IT AFFECTS THEIR ABILITY TO LEARN AND AFFECTS THEIR FOCUS -- ALL IN NEGATIVE WAYS. NEGATIVELY AFFECTS THEIR RELATIONSHIPS, NEGATIVELY AFFECTS THEIR MENTAL HEALTH. WE DO THAT, AS WELL AS FUTURE HARMS, BUT YOU KNOW, KIDS ARE NOT WORRYING ABOUT WHAT WILL HAPPEN IN 30 YEARS. THEY NEED TO KNOW WHAT IS GOING TO HAPPEN NOW. AGAIN, THROUGH EDUCATION, I'M ONE PERSON AND SCHOOL MAYBE HAS ONE HEALTH EDUCATOR.\r\n\r\nWE COULD EDUCATE 24 HOURS A DAY, OUR ENTIRE LIVES, AND NOT BE ABLE TO

REACH EVERYONE. AGAIN, POLICIES HELP. SO WE TRY TO EDUCATE THEM ABOUT THE HARMS, BUT THE POLICIES REALLY SPEAK LEAPS AND BOUNDS. 360 OTHER LOCAL MUNICIPALITIES IN THE U.S. HAVE ALREADY PASSED FLAVOR BANS. GOOD MORNING, CHAIR >> GOOD MORNING COUNCIL MEMBERS.\r\n\r\n>> GOOD MORNING. >> MY NAME IS TIARI HORNER, I'M UNDER THE OFFICE OF THE MAYOR'S BUDGET TEAM AND I'M HERE REPRESENTING BUDGET DIRECTOR MILNER TESTING FOR BILL 186. AND WE'RE KINDLY REQUESTING FLOOR ACTION TODAY AT TODAY'S MEETING. SO GRANT FUNDS FOR THIS ORGANIZATION HAVE BEEN AWARDED. HOWEVER, WE'RE NOT ABLE TO EXECUTE THE CONTRACT UNTIL THE NAME CHANGE OF THE ORGANIZATION IS ACCURATELY REFLECTED. SO THANK YOU FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION. CHAIR AND COUNCIL MEMBERS. >> THANK YOU. ANY QUESTIONS?\r\n\r\nIF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. >> CHAIR, THE NEXT TESTIFIER IS ASHLEY OLSEN, TESTIFYING ON CR24-119, FOLLOWED BY KATY FOLIO. >> ONLINE? >> YES. >> ASHLEY OLSEN, THIS IS OUR OPPORTUNITY TO TESTIFY. >> ALOHA, AND GOOD MORNING CHAIR LEE, VICE-CHAIR SUGIMURA AND ESTEEMED MEMBERS OF THE MAUI COUNTY COUNCIL. I HOPE YOU ARE ABLE TO HEAR ME.\r\n\r\nI'M JOINING YOU FROM PU'UNENE SCHOOL BECAUSE I SHOULD BE AT A TRAINING RIGHT NOW. I'M PROVIDING SUPPORT -- TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT OF BILL 156. AND I REALLY HOPE THAT YOU WILL SEE FIT TO PASS IT. MOST OF OUR KIDS HAVE A SWEET TOOTH. I MEAN, MOST OF US HAVE A SWEET TOOTH; WHICH IS WHY MARKETING OF FLAVORED-TOBACCO PRODUCTS IS SO INSIDIOUS. THE FLAVORS MASK THE UNPLEASANT TASTE WHILE DELIVERING AN ADDICTIVE COMPOUND. AND THE IDEA BEHIND VAPING TO HELP NICOTINE ADDICTED SMOKERS DECREASE AND ELIMINATE THEIR DEPENDENCE. IT'S A GREAT IDEA. THE PROBLEM IS WITH THOSE WHO CHOSEN TO EXPAND THEIR SALES FROM THAT PREMISE./r/n/r/nSMOKERS DON'T NEED FLAVORS NICOTINE PRODUCTS, BUT THE SELLERS OF THIS THESE PRODUCTS NEED TO GENERATE A NEW CLIENT BASE AND KIDS ARE AN EASY TARGET. A WEEK AGO A SHARED THAT THE MARKETING HAS ENTICED THIRD GRADERS INTO VAPING AND EVEN YOUNGER KIDS. ONCE THOSE CHILDREN ARE HOOKED THE PURVEYORS MAY AS WELL HAVE A CLIENT FOR LIFE. IF THIS IS THEIR BUSINESS MODEL, I MAKE NO APOLOGIES FOR DISRUPTING IT. NONE OF US SHOULD. MAUI COUNTY MAYBE CAN'T REGULATE THE SALE AND MANUFACTURE OF THESE PRODUCTS THERE'S NO REASON THAT WE HAVE TO ACCEPT MARKETING THAT IS DIRECTLY AIMED AT CHILDREN. AND PLEASE DON'T TRY AND ARGUE THAT THESE PRODUCTS ARE MARKETED TO ADULT.\r\n\r\nI UNDERSTAND ENFORCEMENT IS DIFFICULT. AGAIN I'M A TEACHER AND I KNOW DARN WELL IT'S NEXT TO IMPOSSIBLE TO CATCH THE MANY STUDENTS THAT CHOOSE TO VAPE ON CAMPUS. WE CANNOT BE EVERYWHERE AT ONCE. WE CANNOT AND SHOULD NOT PUT CAMERAS IN BATHROOMS, AND THE KIDS QUITE HONESTLY HAVE LOOKOUTS. IT DOESN'T MEAN THAT WE DON'T TRY TO ELIMINATE VAPING ON OUR CAMPUSES. IT DOESN'T MEAN WE SHOULDN'T TRY TO ELIMINATE MARKETING FLAVORED-TOBACCO PRODUCTS TO CHILDREN. IT'S NOT IMPOSSIBLE TO FIND THOSE WHO CONTINUE TO MARKET STOCK AND SELL PRODUCTS FOR KEIKI AND I WANT TO BE VERY CLEAR I'M NOT ADVOCATING PUNISHMENT FOR UNDERAGED USERS OF THESE PRODUCTS.\r\n\r\nAS FAR AS I'M CONCERNED THEY ARE VICTIMS OF EDUCATED MARKETING. OUR JOBS ARE IN OUR CLASS ROOMS TEACHING AND WE SIMPLY CANNOT LEAVE OUR STUDENTS UNATTENDED ON A WILD GOOSE CHASE TO FIND A VAPE WE MAY HAVE SMELLED. THIS IS A PROBLEM AGAIN OF SOPHISTICATED MARKETING OF POISON TO A VULNERABLE AND UNSOPHISTICATED POPULATION. TEACHERS AND ADMINISTRATORS WILL CONTINUE TO DO OUR BEST TO ERADICATE VAPING ON SCHOOL CAMPUSES, BUT WE NEED YOUR HELP. MARKETING CREATES DEMAND AND THE INDUSTRY HAS CHOSEN NOT TO REGULATE THEMSELVES TO THE DETRIMENT OF ALL OF US. >> COULD YOU CONCLUDE PLEASE? >> LESLIE GARO IS A GRADUATE OF LAHAINALUNA HIGH SCHOOL AND AMAZING WHEN SHE WAS THERE./r/n/r/n>> THANK YOU. ANY QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. >> CHAIR LEE? MAY I ASK IF THERE ARE OTHER QUESTIONS AND WHAT IF THAT COME UP AS I UNDERSTOOD CAME UP IN THE LAST MEETING, I WOULD ASK THAT MS. GARO CONTACT ME OR OTHER TEACHERS TO MAYBE PROVIDE ADDITIONAL CONTEXT. I JUST -- THIS BILL IS CRITICAL./r/n/r/n>> SURE. >> THANK YOU SO MUCH. >> THANK YOU.

PLEASE REMEMBER IT PASSED UNANIMOUSLY. UNANIMOUS SUPPORT FOR THIS. THANK YOU. ALL RIGHT.\r\nNEXT TESTIFIER. >> CHAIR, IT'S KATY FOLIO, TESTIFYING ON CR24-119 AND SHE WILL BE FOLLOWED BY RICK COLLINS. >> ALOHA HONORABLE CHAIR AND MEMBERS OF THE MAUI COUNTY COUNCIL. MY NAME IS KATY FOLIO, MOTHER OF TWO GIRLS, AND FORMER TEETH SMOKERS AS A RESULT OF STRONG ADVOCATE FOR ANTI-TOBACCO LEGISLATION, TO PROTECT YOUTH. SO I STRONGLY SUPPORT BILL 156. WHILE I DIDN'T REALIZE AT TIME TWO PRIMARY CONTRIBUTING FACTORS TO MY PICKING UP SPOKE SMOKING AS A TEENAGER, MEDIA AND FLAVORS PARTICULARLY MENTHOL AND I WAS EDUCATED ON THE HARMS OF SMOKING AND KNEW IT WASN'T GOOD FOR MYSELF. EVENTUALLY WITHOUT MY REALLY BEING AWARE OF THE ADVERTISING WORKED. THE FIRST CIGARETTES I TRIED WERE FLAVORED AND MENTHOL AND NOT APPEALING TO ME AS A TEENAGER AND HARSH TO SMOKE WHEN I DID EVENTUALLY SMOKE THEM, BUT FLAVORED CIGARETTES INCLUDING STRAWBERRY AND VANILLA WERE APPEALING TO US AS TEENAGERS GIRLS AND I BLAME MENTHOL FOR MY NICOTINE ADDICTION.\r\n\r\nSURPASSING THE HAWAI'I STATE AVERAGE. I BECAME AN ADVOCATE FOR TOBACCO CONTROL AS AN ADULT BECAUSE OF MY EXPERIENCE AS A TEENAGER, AND DON'T WANT TO SEE OTHER KIDS IN THE SAME SITUATION OR WORSE AND DON'T WANT TO SEE ANY GIRLS DIE FROM CANCER TOO EARLY. I WAS ONE OF THE LUCKY ONES AND ABLE TO EVENTUALLY QUIT. NO EVERYONE CAN AND THAT IS WHAT BIG TOBACCO AND THE VAPING INDUSTRY RELY ON. HOW THEY ARE SO POWERFUL AND MAKE RIDICULOUS AMOUNTS OF MONEY. OWE PROGRESS IS BEING UNDONE BY POPULARITY OF VAPING BY YOUTH. WE CAN'T ALLOW FLAVORED-TOBACCO PRODUCTS TO BE IN THE MARKET IN ANY FORM.\r\n\r\nVAPING PRODUCTS CONTAIN HIGH-LEVELS OF NICOTINE AND MAKES IT HARSH TO INHALE, DISPOSAL PRODUCTS POPULAR WITH YOUTH CONTAIN 50 -- [SPEAKER NOT UNDERSTOOD] THESE ARE DESIGNED TO MAKE IT EASIER TO GET ADDICTED TO NICOTINE. THE INDUSTRY STRATEGY IS TO PLACE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF YOUTH -- THEIR DEADLY PRODUCT BACK ON THE YOUTH, THEIR PARENTS AND EDUCATORS RATHER THAN TAKING RESPONSIBILITY THEMSELVES. THESE ARE THE WRONG PEOPLE TO HOLD RESPONSIBLE. THESE ARE THE PEOPLE REELING FROM THE SUCCESSFUL MARKETING STRATEGIES. THE GOO IS TO CREATE A SAFE AND HEALTHY ENVIRONMENT THAT YOUTH ARE NOT DRAWN TO THE PRODUCTS TO BEGIN WITH HEALTHY CHOICE IS THE EASY CHOICE TO MAKE. >> TIME. >> IT'S AN IMPORTANT STEP THIS DIRECTION./r/n/r/nTHANK YOU FOR LISTENING TO OUR HEALTH EXPERTS AND ORGANIZATIONS AND TO OUR YOUTH WHO HAVE BEEN ASKING FOR PROTECTION FOR YEARS. MAHALO. >> THANK YOU. WE HAVE A QUESTION FROM MEMBER RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> ALOHA, MAHALO. FIRST, IT REALLY CAUGHT ME OFF-GUARD WHEN YOU SAID YOU WERE FROM THE ERA OF JOE CAMEL, BECAUSE YOU LOOK MUCH YOUNGER THAN THAT THANK YOU. >> IT WASN'T UNTIL RIGHT NOW THAT I THINK ABOUT IT IN THIS WAY.\r\n\r\nHAVE YOU FOLKS ENGAGED THE STORES? BECAUSE YOU SAY YOU SAW POSTERS OF JOE CAMEL AND HOW HE LOOKED COOL, AND THE MARKETING OF THAT. BUT LIKE. THOSE THAT SELL CIGARETTES ARE LIKE THE DRUG-DEALERS: RIGHT? SO IF THEY DIDN'T SELL CIGARETTES OR VAPES, THERE WOULD BE LESS PLACES TO BUY AND THEY ARE THE ONES THAT PUT UP THE POSTERS, AND THE MARKETING THINGS, I KNOW THERE'S NATIONAL RADIO AND TV, AND YOUTUBE, SOCIAL MEDIA ADS, BUT THE PHYSICAL POSTERS ARE HERE. >> PART OF THE LEGISLATION THAT HAPPENED IN THE '90S AND EARLY 2000S THEY HAVE REGULATED. SO JOE CAMEL CARTOON, POSTERS AROUND TOBACCO IS NO LONGER ALLOWED.\r\n\r\nWHICH WE WOULD LIKE TO SEE FOR OTHER INDUSTRIES AS WELL. VAPING HAS SORT OF THE LOOPHOLE AND WE WOULD LIKE TO MAKE SURE THAT VAPING IS TREATED THE SAME AS CIGARETTES AND WE WANT TO SEE ALL THOSE POLICIES PASSED THAT KEEP IT AWAY FROM KIDS. >> TOTALLY AGREE. MAHALO. MAHALO, CHAIR. >> ANYBODY ELSE? IF NOT, THANK YOU.\r\n\r\NEXT TESTIFIER. >> NEXT TESTIFIER IS RICK COLLINS TESTIFYING ON CR24-119, FOLLOWED BY MIKE LANDES. >> HOW MANY MORE AFTER THAT? >> CHAIR. WE'LL HAVE TWO MORE AFTER MR. LANDES. >> OKAY. >> GOOD MORNING, CHAIR LEE.\r\n\r\nVICE-CHAIR SUGIMURA. AND MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL. MY NAME IS RICK COLLINS, A RESIDENT OF PUKALANI AND I'M HERE IN FULL SUPPORT OF BILL 156 TO BAN FLAVORED E-CIGARETTE PRODUCTS. I AM A FATHER OF TWO, AS WELL, AND I ALREADY SEE THIS INFLUENCE OF FLAVORED-TOBACCO PRODUCTS, PARTICULARLY IN THE MARKETING THAT REALLY TARGETS MY CHILDREN. WE HAVE WALKED BY A NUMBER OF ATTRACTIVE KIOSKS AND STOREFRONTS WHERE IT'S GRABBED THEIR ATTENTION

AND SAID TO ME, EVEN MY 5-YEAR-OLD, DAD, WHAT IS THAT? IT IS ATTRACTIVE TO THEM, BECAUSE IT'S COLORS. IT IS THE TYPE OF PRODUCTS, SNACKS, BEVERAGES, THAT THEY HAVE BRAND RECOGNITION WITH, THAT ATTRACT THEM AT VERY YOUNG AGE./r/n/r/nNOT ONLY DO I FIND THIS STRATEGY UNCONSCIONABLE, BUT IT'S GOING TO LEAD TO HARMFUL AND DOES LEAD TO HARMFUL OUTCOMES. MY KIDS, MY OLDEST KID WILL SOON BE IN MIDDLE SCHOOL AND HE WILL BE FACING FOR OF THAT AS IT BECOMES MORE AND MORE AVAILABLE. I REMEMBER AS A YOUNG PERSON TRYING TO SMOKE, AND GRABBING ONE OF MY GRANDFATHER'S CIGARETTES, AND TRYING TO TAKE A DRAW OFF OF A HALF-SMOKED CIGARETTE THINKING THIS IS COMPLETELY DISGUSTING. BUT NO LONGER IS IT THAT WAY FOR OUR YOUNG PEOPLE. FLAVORS THAT YOU HEARD LIKE BUBBLE GUM CANDY AND FRUIT THAT ARE DESIGNED TO INTRODUCE YOUNG PEOPLE EARLY AND ADDICT THEM FOR LIFE. THESE FLAVORS MASK THE THE HARSHNESS OF NICOTINE. I THINK IT'S TIME FOR US TO TAKE ACTION, AND BANNING THE SALE OF FLAVORS --ALCOHOL. LISTEN TO ME. E-CIGARETTE PRODUCTS -- THAT TOO. BUT TO BE CONTINUED ON THAT IS SOMETHING THAT WE SHOULD DO HERE.\r\n\r\nI WILL SAY THIS A LAST REMARK AND PERHAPS MOST IMPORTANTLY THIS IS ALL NULL AND VOID IF WE DON'T REPEAL PREEMPTION AT STATE LEVEL. I WOULD ASK AND ENCOURAGE YOU AS PEOPLE OF INFLUENCE AND PEOPLE WITH CONNECTIONS IN STATE LEGISLATURE TO PLEASE HELP US WHERE YOU CAN IN MAKING THOSE CHANGES. SOME OF THE MOST POWERFUL DETRACTORS OF PREEMPTION OF LAWMAKERS THAT LIVE ON OUR ISLAND AND WE NEED YOUR HELP WITH THAT. MAHALO FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO PROVIDE TESTIMONY. >> THANK YOU. MEMBER PALTIN. >> I WOULD LIKE TO ASK IF YOU COULD NAME THE LAW-MAKERS THAT LIVE ON OUR ISLAND?\r\n\r>> SURE. SO I BELIEVE, AND I SIT HERE KIND OF AS A RESIDENT, UNCLEAR OF ALL THE LEGISLATIVE DETAILS, I'M SURE SOMEONE ELSE CAN TALK ABOUT THIS. I KNOW THAT FINANCE COMMITTEE AND HOUSE HAS KILLED THIS BILL A NUMBER OF TIMES WHICH IS CHAIRED BY YAMASHITA -- AM I CORRECT IN THAT? ANYBODY ELSE KNOW? I THINK SO, THAT IS THE ONE I WAS PARTICULARLY THINKING ABOUT. >> WOW. OKAY.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU FOR THAT INFORMATION. I DON'T KNOW IF HE HAS KIDS. TCH ANY OTHER QUESTIONS? IF PHOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. MAY WE HAVE THE NEXT TESTIFIER. >> CHAIR, THE NEXT TESTIFIER IS MIKE LANDES ONLINE. MR.\r\n\r\nLANDES, IF YOU COULD LET US KNOW WHAT ITEM YOU ARE TESTIFYING ON, TO BE FOLLOWED BY MELISSA MCCONOGLE. >> CAN YOU HEAR ME? >> YES. >> I'M TESTIFYING ON CR24-119 AND HAPPY TO FOLLOW MY FRIEND, RICK. MY NAME IS MIKE LANDES, KIHEI RESIDENT, TEACHER AT LAHAINALUNA AT HIGH SCHOOL AND MAUI CHAPTER PRESIDENT OF THE HAWAI'I STATE TEACHERS ASSOCIATION. SPEAKING ON BEHALF OF THE HAWAI'I STATE TEACHERS ASSOCIATION AND ALSO MYSELF AS A PRIVATE CITIZEN. HSTA STRONGLY SUPPORTS BILL 156. THIS LEGISLATION ALIGNS WITH OUR VALUES TO PROTECT THE HEALTH AND WELL-BEING OF OUR KEIKI BY PROHIBITING THE SALE AND MARKING OF FLAVORED-TOBACCO PRODUCTS./r/n/r/nTHIS IS SOMETHING THAT EDUCATORS ACROSS THE STATE AND CERTAINLY ACROSS MAUI ARE CONCERNED WITH. ON A PERSONAL LEVEL, AS A HIGH SCHOOL TEACHER, I AM CONSTANTLY DEALING WITH THE IMPACTS OF FLAVORED NICOTINE PRODUCTS AND VAPES, WHETHER IT'S WALKING PAST THE STUDENT BATHROOMS IN MY BUILDING, AND INSTEAD OF IT SMELLING LIKE A HIGH SCHOOL RESTROOM NORMALLY SMELLS LIKE IT SMELLS LIKE STRAWBERRY OR COTTON CANDY OR HAWAIIAN POG AND SEE THE KIDS COMING OUT ALL CLUSTERING TOGETHER AND COUGHING AND GETTING THE JITTERS AND CAN'T DO WHATEVER AND ALL OF A SUDDEN THEY MAGICALLY NEED TO GO TO THE BATHROOM. THEY COME BACK AND IT SMELLS LIKE THEY DOUSED THEMSELVES IN PRODUCTS FROM BATH AND BODY WORKS. THESE ARE THE FLAVORED PRODUCTS WE ALL KNOW, EVERYBODY IS AWARE OF IT AND EVERYBODY KNOWS IT'S MARKETED TO KIDS. I MYSELF AM A FORMER SMOKER. I STARTED SMOKING AS A TEENAGER SMOKING MENTHOL CIGARETTES AND I KNOW THIS PERSONALLY TO BE A THING AND KNOW THE IMPACTS. I HAVE TWO CHILDREN. HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT AND MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENT AS RICK WAS JUST SAYING, MY OWN TWO CHILDREN, WHEN THEY WERE YOUNGER, WOULD BE ENTICED BY THE KIOSKS IN THE MALLS.\r\n\r\nSEEING THE LIGHT UP COLORS, SEEING THE NEON, THE SMELLS, THE NAMES, ALL OF THAT. AND MY WIFE AND I HAD TO DO QUITE A LOT OF TALKING TO THEM TO THAT THEY DO NOT FALL VICTIM TO THIS SORT OF THING. AND LASTLY, AS I MENTIONED IN MY WRITTEN TESTIMONY, MY UNCLE WAS A LIFETIME SMOKER, DEALING WITH THE HEALTH EFFECTS OF THIS. HE HAS TRIED TO KICK SMOKING

NUMEROUS TIMES. E-CIGARETTES WERE SOMETHING THAT WE THOUGHT WERE GOING TO FOR HIM, BUT AS HE SAID MULTIPLE TIMES I DON'T WANT TO SUCK ON KIWI STRAWBERRY, BUT WHAT MARLBORO RED. >> TIME. >> WE KNOW THEY ARE TARGETING OUR CHILDREN.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU. >> THANK YOU. MEMBER PALTIN. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. THANK YOU, MR. LANDES. I JUST WANTED TO CLARIFY DID YOU SAY THAT YOU WERE SPEAKING ON BEHALF HSTA ON BEHALF AND THEIR CONSENT.\r\n\r\n>> YES. I'M THE CHAPTER PRESIDENT FOR HSTA. >> THANK YOU. DO YOU KNOW IF HSTA HAS ENDORSED ANY CANDIDATES FROM MAUI THAT DO NOT SUPPORT PREEMPTION? >> I AM NOT AWARE OF THE PREEMPTION THING THAT RICK WAS JUST TALKING ABOUT. I DON'T KNOW THE FULL HISTORY BEHIND THAT, OR THE FULL STORY BEHIND THAT, BUT I DO BELIEVE THAT WE HAVE SUPPORTED THE CANDIDATE THAT WAS NAMED. >> OKAY. I JUST HOPE YOUR UNION WOULD BE IN ALIGNMENT THAT IF A CANDIDATE DOESN'T -- IF A CANDIDATE SUPPORTS -- DOESN'T SUPPORT WHAT YOU WANT, THAT YOU DON'T ENDORSE THEM.\r\n\r>> THAT IS A STATEWIDE DISCUSSION, WITHIN OUR ORGANIZATION. THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU. >> WE HAVE THE NEXT TESTIFIER. >> CHAIR, THE NEXT TESTIFIER IS MELISSA MCCONOGLE, FOLLOWED BY JOSIAH NISHITA, CURRENTLY OUR LAST TESTIFIER. >> GOOD MORNING.\r\n\r\n>> GOOD MORNING, CHAIR, VICE-CHAIR AND MEMBERS. I'M SPEAKING IN STRONG SUPPORT OF BILL 156. AS A MOM, WITH KIDS IN PUBLIC SCHOOL, I CAN TELL YOU THIS IS VERY PERSONAL FOR ME. IF YOU GO TO ANY OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS IT HAS INFILTRATED OUR PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM IN MIDDLE SCHOOL AND ELEMENTARY AND ALL OVER HIGH SCHOOL. AT LAST MEETING SOME OF THE STUDENTS TESTIFIED THAT IT'S IN THE BATHROOMS, IT'S EVERYWHERE IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS. IT IS JUST THAT IS WHAT IT IS. WITH THAT, PARENTS ARE WORKING FULL-TIME JOBS, SOMETIMES TWO JOBS JUST TO SURVIVE. SO I DON'T BLAME THE PARENTS.\r\n\r\nI DON'T BLAME OUR TEACHERS, BECAUSE THEY ARE WORKING AS HARD AS THEY CAN, ALSO, TO EDUCATE OUR CHILDREN. I DON'T BLAME THE POLICE. BECAUSE THEY ARE SHORT STAFFED AND DOING THE BEST THAT THEY CAN WITH WHAT THEY HAVE. I DON'T BLAME THE KIDS FOR MAKING THESE DECISIONS BECAUSE IT'S BEING PUT IN FRONT OF THEIR FACE. THERE'S PEER-PRESSURE, HORMONES, THINGS, SO I DON'T BLAME THE KIDS EITHER. I THINK THE SOLUTION IS CHANGING THE ENVIRONMENT. AND CHANGING THE ENVIRONMENT IS THROUGH POLICY CHANGE. AND SO THAT IS NOT AS AVAILABLE TO OUR CHILDREN./r/n/r/nYEARS AGO, I THINK MOST OF US CAN REMEMBER THAT THERE WAS SMOKING ON PLANES. THAT PEOPLE WERE ALLOWED TO SMOKE IN THEIR OFFICES AND NOW WHEN WE LOOK AT IT, WE CAN'T IMAGINE SMOKING ON PLANES, HOW WAS THAT EVER ALLOWED? I FEEL HOPEFULLY WITH THE PASSAGE OF THIS BILL WITH IT GOING FORWARD, I'M HOPING IN YEARS TO COME THAT WE CAN LOOK BACK AND WONDER HOW THE FLAVORED CIGARETTES, VAPES, ALLOWED TO BE SOLD AND MARKETED TO OUR CHILDREN? THAT IT WOULD BE UNFATHOMABLE IN YEARS TO COME FOR US TO LOOK BACK AND SAY HOW DID WE LET THAT HAPPEN TO OUR CHILDREN? I FEEL IT'S A GATEWAY DRUG FROM CIGARETTES TO VAPES AND LACED WITH THC AND FENTANYL IS HUGE IN OUR COMMUNITY AND I ALSO DID WANT TO ADDRESS -- -- I DID WATCH THE LAST MEETING AND ONE ISSUE WAS THE STAFFING OF ENFORCEMENT OF THE FLAVOR BAN. ONE OF THE AREAS THAT WAS BROUGHT UP IS THAT THEY ARE ALREADY DOING UNDERAGED ENFORCEMENT. MEANING THAT THE POLICE ARE GOING TO VAPE SHOPS AND ALREADY ENFORCING UNDERAGED SALES.\r\n\r\nMAYBE WHILE THEY ARE STILL DOING THE UNDERAGE ENFORCEMENT TO DO THE ENFORCEMENT FOR THE FLAVOR BAN AT THE SAME TIME? JUST AN OPTION. THAT WAY IT DOESN'T AFFECT THE STAFFING. THE OTHER ONE WAS DISCUSSION OF FINANCING. I KNOW WITH THE POLICE DEPARTMENT, THEY HAVE THE FALSE ALARM SYSTEM THAT THEY USE AN OUTSIDE VENDOR TO CRY WOLF. THEY USE AN VENDOR THAT DEALS WITH THE FINANCING, WITH THE APPEALS, SO I'M NOT SAYING THAT IS THE WAY, BUT SAYING IT'S A WAY AND ANOTHER OPTION. THANK YOU FOR YOUR TIME.\r\n\r\nTHAT IS ALL I HAVE. THANKS. >> THANK YOU. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. NEXT TESTIFIER. >> CHAIR. IT'S ACTUALLY J.C. LAU TESTIFYING ON CR24-119 AND FOLLOWED BY THE MANAGING DIRECTOR. >> ALOHA KAKAHIAKA ALOHA KAKOU, AKAKU.\r\n\r\nTHAT WAS REAL FAST J.C. LAU FROM KULU. I SPENT MOST OF MY LIVE IN VIRGINIA, WHERE PROBABLY HALF OF THE TOBACCO PRODUCTS IN THE WORLD COME FROM. A LITTLE HISTORY LESSON, SOME OF THE FIRST SETTLERS CAME FROM ENGLAND, STARTED GROWING TOBACCO INSTEAD OF BREADFRUIT AND CROPS TO EAT, BECAUSE THEY COULD MAKE MORE MONEY ON IT. THE FIRST YEAR THE INDIANS HELPED THEM AND

THANKSGIVING IS A TIME TO TELL THE STORY, CALLED "THE FIVE CROWNS." IT'S NOT A GOOD STORY, BUT GOOD HISTORY LESSON. AND THE INDIANS TOLD THEM, WE'RE GOING TO HELP YOU GUYS OUT THIS TIME, BUT NEXT TIME, TRY TO LOOK OUT FOR YOURSELF, NEXT WINTER TIME. NEXT WINTER CAME, THEY DIDN'T LISTEN AND THEY WERE ALL OUT PARTYING, AND RUNNING AROUND AND HAVING FUN. AND GOT COLD AND THEY WERE HUNGRY AGAIN.\r\n\r\nTHEY SAID, HEY, INDIANS, THE TERM THAT I'M USING -- YES, YOU KNOW ABOUT THAT, THAT IS LIKE SAYING HAWAIIAN, IT'S REALLY NOT THE RIGHT WORD. THE INDIANS SAID WE CAN'T HELP YOU OUT BECAUSE IF WE GIVE YOU HALF OUR FOOD, HALF OUR PEOPLE WITH DIE. SO THE WHITE SETTLERS TOOK THEIR GUNS AND SAID YOU WILL GIVE IT TO US. THAT IS THE STORY ON THAT. SO YOU GUYS BE CAREFUL ON THIS ONE. I'M THINKING OF THE -- SO IF WE SPEED UP A LITTLE BIT, THE TIME MACHINE, THE BOSTON TEA PARTY WAS ABOUT ENGLAND PUTTING TAXES ON THE STUFF COMING IN AND OUT OF THE SHIPS. AND THE COLONIALISTS DIDN'T LIKE THAT.\r\n\r\nSO THEY HAD A BOSTON TEA PART AND I THINK THEY ACTUALLY DRESSED UP LIKE INDIANS AND WENT ON THE SHIPS AND THROW IT INTO THE WATER. -- THAT IS PROBABLY NOT EXACTLY HOW IT HAPPENED, BUT WHAT U.S. HISTORY BOOKS SAY. THINKING ABOUT MR. JOHNSON, THE THING CALLED THE JONES ACT. NOBODY MENTIONED IT BEFORE, BUT YOU BETTER WATCH OUT, BECAUSE MAKING A LOT OF MONEY OFF THE TAXES OFF THE CIGARETTES. THANK YOU FOR YOUR TIME THAT IS MY TWO CENTS. THE THEME SONG FOR THIS ONE IS SMOKING IN THE BOYS' ROOM THANK YOU.\r\n\r\nNEXT TESTIFIER, PLEASE. >> CHAIR, THE NEXT TESTIFIER IS THE MANAGING DIRECTOR, JOSIAH NISHITA, TESTIFYING ON CR24-114, FOLLOWED BY LOLA IRVIN. >> ALOHA, CHAIR, ALOHA MEMBERS. THANK YOU FOR ALLOWING ME HERE TODAY, JOSIAH NISHITA, MANAGING DIRECTOR FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI, TESTIFYING ON CR24-114. I WANT TO THANK THE KULA COMMUNITY, VON TEMPSKY AND THE COMMUNITY FOR THEIR SUPPORT OF IT. AS I MENTIONED, THE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION, AS WELL AS THE COUNCIL HERE TODAY, AND THE COMMITTEE PREVIOUSLY, THE MAIN ISSUE AT PLAY, THAT WE'RE ASKING FOR SUPPORT OF THE LAND FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES. AND PUBLIC OWNERSHIP. I DID MENTION IN COMMITTEE THERE WAS SOME QUESTIONS AND CONCERNS RAISED DURING THE KULA COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION TO WORK WITH YOU FOLKS TO ADDRESS AND WON'T BE EXECUTING ANY GRANTS OR ANYTHING LIKE THAT, UNTIL WE HAVE FURTHER DISCUSSION WITH THE COUNCIL AND COMMUNITIES.\r\n\r\nI KNOW IT'S PART OF THE -- UNFORTUNATELY FOR YOU FOLKS, YOU KNOW, YOU CAN'T AT THIS TIME. BUT YOU DO HAVE OUR COMMITMENT IF WE CAN JUST MOVE FORWARD TO GET THE PROPERTY ACQUISITION IN PLACE AND WE'LL HAVE FURTHER DISCUSSIONS ABOUT WHAT WE SHOULD DO WITH THE PROPERTY? BUT JUST SO APPRECIATIVE TO HALE'AKALA WALDORF, BECAUSE WE DIDN'T WANT TO COME FORWARD TO THE COMMUNITY OR COUNCIL WITH AT LEAST SOME SEMBLANCE OF AN ENTITY FOR PLAN IN PLACE TO CARE FOR THE PROPERTY. SO I APPRECIATE THEIR WILLINGNESS TO STEP UP, AS WELL AS THEIR WILLINGNESS TO STEP BACK, IF THAT IS WHAT THE COMMUNITY WANTS. WE'LL WORK WITH EVERYONE TO MAKE SURE WE COME UP WITH WITH A GOOD SOLUTION. I APPRECIATE YOUR SUPPORT AND WHEN THE ITEM COMES UP, PLEASE CALL ON ME IF YOU HAVE ANYTHING. I KNOW HE HAS BEEN WORKING HARD ON THE DETAILS AND THE VON TEMPSKYS REALLY TRUST HIM A LOT. >> THANK YOU. NEXT TESTIFIER. >> THE LAST TESTIFIER SIGNED UP IS LOLA IRVIN.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU, AND I WILL RECOGNIZE MR. COOK. >> TESTIFYING ON CR24-119 AND SHE IS ONLINE. >> GOOD MORNING, MEMBER COOK. >> GOOD MORNING, CHAIR, GOOD MORNING MEMBERS. MY APOLOGIES FOR MY DELAY. I GOT TO BE INVOLVED IN THE BLESSING THAT IS COMING ALONG BEAUTIFULLY, AND IT'S GOING TO BE A WONDERFUL AFFORDABLE PROJECT IN PERPETUITY FOR OUR COUNCIL SUPPORTING.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU TO YOUR PATIENCE WITH MY DELAY. >> THANK YOU. OKAY. NOW THE TESTIFIER. >> MS. IRVIN. IT'S YOUR OPPORTUNITY TO TESTIFY. >> THANK YOU SO VERY MUCH. LOLA IRVIN WITH THE HAWAI'I STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH./r/n/r/n>> CAN YOU SPEAK LOUDER, PLEASE? >> OKAY, THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO TESTIFY. I'M LOLA IRVIN, WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SPEAKING ON BEHALF OF DIRECTOR FINK, AND I APPRECIATE COUNCIL AND THE UNANIMOUS VOTE YOU GAVE TO BILL 156, AND I SPEAK ON COMMITTEE REPORT 119 IN SUPPORT. I AGREE WITH THE COUNTY COUNCIL, AND THOSE WHO HAVE SPOKEN THAT WE DO ALL SPEAK ON BEHALF OF

WANTING TO HAVE OUR KEIKI TO HAVE SAFE, AND HEALTH PROMOTING COMMUNITIES. SO A BILL SUCH AS THIS ONE PROVIDES THE OPPORTUNITY FOR SAFE ENVIRONMENTS WHERE OUR CHILDREN CAN BE FREE FROM THE MARKETING OF THESE PRODUCTS THAT ARE MEANT TO ENTICE THEM AND MEANT TO HOOK THEM ON NICOTINE. NICOTINE HAS A NEGATIVE IMPACT ON THE BRAIN DEVELOPMENT OF OUR CHILDREN./r/nALSO, WE HAVE LEARNED FROM OUR CLASS ROOM TEACHERS, AND FROM OUR SCIENTISTS IN TERMS OF JUST THE DISRUPTION IN MEMORY. AND INFORMATION RETENTION THAT HAPPENS WITH THE BRAIN DEVELOPMENT FOR OUR YOUNG CHILDREN WHEN THEY ARE EXPOSED TO HIGH-LEVELS OF NICOTINE THAT ARE PROVIDED THROUGH THESE -- AND SO WE KNOW THAT EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT AND SCHOOL COMPLETION IS REALLY IMPORTANT, AND THAT WE DO CARE ABOUT THE HEALTH OF OUR CHILDREN. WE DON'T WANT THEIR SLEEP TO BE DISRUPTED. WE KNOW THAT OUR CHILDREN GO THROUGH A LOT OF MOOD SWINGS ALREADY, AND THAT NICOTINE ALSO CREATES MOOD DISORDERS, AND THAT THE BRAIN IS DEVELOPING UNTIL THEY ARE 25 YEARS OLD. AND SO THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR THIS BILL THAT YOU ARE INTRODUCING, AND SUPPORTING. AND SO I'M AVAILABLE IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS. THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO TESTIFY. >> THANK YOU.\r\n/r\nMEMBER PALTIN. >> THANK YOU, MS. IRVIN. DISCUSSION, MEMBER KAMA,\r\n\r\n>> MEMBERS, THE HOUSING PROVIDERS HAVE INDICATED THAT TO MEET THE REQUIREMENT OF THE COUNTY GRANT THAT THEIR PROJECT NEEDS TO BE GRANTED CERTAIN EXEMPTS TO MAUI COUNTY CODE 3.35.070 AND TO REMIND ABOUT THIS PROJECT, CENTRALLY LOCATED NEAR WAIKAPU GARDENS AND IS TO PROVIDE 80-FOR SALE HOMES WITH AREA MEDIAN INCOME FROM 70-140%. WE AGREED TO PROVIDE A GRANT FROM THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING FUND OF \$10.65 MILLION SO THAT THIS HOUSING PROVIDER CAN SELL THE HOUSES AT THE PRICING CONTAINED IN BILL 107. THE HOMES WILL BE SOLD WITH A 30-YEAR DEED RESTRICTION. REOUIRING OWNER OCCUPANCY. RESOLUTION 24-188 PROVIDES EXEMPTIONS TO THIS CONDITION THE OF MAUI COUNTY 3.35.070, THAT THE HOUSING PROVIDER HAS REQUESTED SECTION OF THE MAUI COUNTY CODE THAT STATES TITLE TO ANY REAL PROPERTY MUST BE HELD IN PERPETUITY BY THE GRANTEE, OR BORROWER UNTIL CONVEYED TO THE COUNTY OR A QUALIFIED NONPROFIT OR COMMUNITY LAND TRUST. IN ORDER TO SELL THE HOUSES TO SELECTED HOMEOWNERS, THE HOUSING PROVIDER NEEDS AN EXTENSION TO THIS SECTION OF THE CODE. 3.35.082 MAUI COUNTY CODE, IMPLEMENTATION LONG-TERM MANAGEMENT OF THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECT. THERE'S NO NEED FOR LONG-TERM MANAGEMENT PLAN, BECAUSE THE HOUSING PROVIDER WILL BE SELLING THE HOUSES, AND THERE WILL BE NO PROPERTY TO MANAGE AFTER THE SALES ARE COMPLETED. THE REQUIREMENT FOR DEED RESTRICTIONS FOR OWNER OCCUPANCY WILL REMAIN IN PLACE FOR THE 30-YEAR PERIOD. SECTION 3.35.070.A.3 MAUI COUNTY CODE, THE PROJECT MUST NOT BE SOLD. EXCHANGED, DIVESTED OR CONVERTED TO OTHER USES THAT ARE INCONSISTENT WITH THE PURPOSES SET FORTH IN THIS CHAPTER, WITHOUT THE PRIOR APPROVAL OF THE COUNCIL BY RESOLUTION.\r\nIN ORDER TO SELL THE HOUSES TO THE HOMEOWNERS, AN EXEMPTION TO THIS SECTION OF CODE IS NECESSARY. AND THEN TO SECTION 3.35.070.A.4 MAUI COUNTY CODE, THAT THE GRANTEE OR BORROWER DISSOLVES OR ADJUDICATED BANKRUPT -- MUST BE CONVEYED TO THE COUNTY OR TO A QUALIFIED NONPROFIT COMMUNITY LAND TRUST, AS APPROVED BY THE COUNCIL. CONSTRUCTION LENDERS WILL REOUIRE THE ABILITY TO TAKE TITLES TO PROPERTY TO THE HOUSING - IF THE HOUSING PROVIDER FAILED TO COMPLETE THE PROJECT AND THE COUNTY WILL HAVE A POSITION IF THERE'S A FAILURE TO COMPLETE, BUT NOT FIRST POSITION. I GUESS I HAVE A QUICK QUESTION, SINCE MR.\r\n\r\nGOMES IS HERE. I WAS LOOKING AT MAUI NOW ARTICLE FROM JUNE 1ST, 2024, AND IT SAID AT THE LOW-END HOUSING SALES PRICES ARE EXPECTED TO RANGE FROM \$274,565, TO \$313,000 FOR TWO-BEDROOM FOR FAMILIES EARNING BETWEEN 70-80% AMI, AND THEN AT THE HIGH-END OF 120-140% AMI WOULD BE ABOUT \$742,000. BILL 156 WILL TAKE AFFECT 42 DAZE AFTER THE DAY THAT H.R.S. SECTION 3.8J11.5B OR ANY OTHER STATE STATUTE PREEMPTING COUNTY ORDINANCES ON THE SALE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS IS REPEALED. THE COUNTY OF HAWAI'I AND CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU HAVE ALREADY INTRODUCED SIMILAR LEGISLATION MANY RESPONSE TO THE YOUTH DEVELOPING AN EPIDEMIC. I'M SORRY, THAT IS RIGHT THE AUDITOR'S IS 183. 184 IS THE NAME THING . >> MADAM CLERK, DID YOU GET THAT? \r\n\r\n>> YES. >> EXPEDITIOUS. >> VERY. >> WE'RE TRYING. >> OKAY. ALL RIGHT. SO NOW WE'RE ON 184 THEN, I BELIEVE./r/n/r/n>> YES. CHAIR BEFORE YOU IS BILL 184 (2024) A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3.36 MAUI COUNTY CODE RELATING TO GRANTS. >> YES, PRO TEM KAMA. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. I MOVE TO WAIVE THE REQUIREMENT OF COMMITTEE REFERRAL UNDER RULE 7G OF THE RULES OF THE COUNCIL FOR FIRST READING TODAY. >> SECOND >> MOVED BY PRO TEM KAMA AND SECONDED BY VICE-CHAIR SUGIMURA. DISCUSSION, PRO TEM KAMA.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU, THIS AMENDMENT WILL ADDRESS THE ISSUE THAT HAS EMERGED WITH PROGRAM THE DIRECTOR MITCH YELL REQUESTED FIRST READING TODAY RATHER THAN REFERRING TO THE CHAIR OF THE INCOMING COUNCIL. SINCE THIS MATTER DEALS WITH THE PROVISION OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING, AND WE'RE IN AN EMERGENCY WITH RESPECT TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING, I ASK FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION BY WAIVING THE REQUIREMENTS FOR THIS MATTER TO GO TO COMMITTEE. >> OKAY. SO THAT TAKES CARE OF THE WAIVER. AND ALL THOSE -- DID I JUST DO THAT? DO THE WAIVER? >> THIS IS THE WAIVER./r/n/YES. >> I DID THE WAIVER. BUT YOU CONTINUED ON ABOUT THE BILL; RIGHT? >> I DID EVERYTHING. >> WHEN YOU DO THAT, YOU THROW ME OFF. OKAY. JUST ON THE WAIVER.\r\n\r\nALL THOSE IN FAVOR, RAISE YOUR HAND, SAY AYE. >> AYE. >> SEVEN AYES, TWO EXCUSED, JOHNSON AND SINENCI, MOTION CARRIES. DISCUSSION, MEMBER KAMA. MEMBER PALTIN.\r\n\r\n>> I HAVE NO PROBLEM PASSING THIS ON THE FLOOR TODAY, BECAUSE PEOPLE CALL ME ALL THE TIME, ASKING WHERE IS THE MONEY? BUT IS THERE PLANS TO, LIKE, DO A PRESENTATION, OR REPORT, OR YOU

KNOW, LIKE WHAT'S GOING ON? PLENTY OF WEST SIDE PEOPLE WERE KIND OF DISGRUNTLED BECAUSE THEY THOUGHT THEY COULD QUALIFY FOR THIS, AND WE'RE TOLD NOT TO. AND I'M A LITTLE WONDERING WHAT HAPPENED TO LOKAHI PACIFIC AND NOW WE'RE GIVING IT TO INDIVIDUALS IS LOKAHI -- I MEAN, I DON'T NEED THE ANSWERS RIGHT NOW. I'M OKAY WITH MOVING FORWARD TODAY. YES, ANYWAY, TIME TO VOTE. WE'RE IN THE PROCESS OF VOTING FOR THIS ON FIRST READING. OKAY. I MOVE TO WAIVE THE REQUIREMENT OF COMMITTEE REFERRAL AND REPORT UNDER RULE 7G OF THE RULES OF THE COUNCIL AS IT RELATES TO BILL 185 (2024). >> SECOND. >> DO YOU HAVE ALL OF THESE CHANGES TO MAKE? >> FORM AND LEGALITY. >> OKAY. MOVED BY MEMBER PALTIN AND SECONDED BY WHO? MEMBER UU-HODGINS.\r\n\r\nTO PASS BILL 185. ON FIRST READING. >> THE WAIVER. >> JUST THE WAIVER. OKAY. TO WAIVE RULE 7G. DISCUSSION, MEMBER PALTIN. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. YOU KNOW, MY PREFERENCE IS NOT TO HURRY AND RUSH THINGS THROUGH, BUT IF WE DON'T PASS THIS BEFORE THE END OF THE YEAR. IS OUR DEADLINE TO ADOPT THE FIRE CODE THAT HAS BEEN HANDED DOWN FROM THE NATIONAL TO THE STATE TO THE STATE TO THE COUNTY.\r\n\r\nAND SO IF IT'S NOT PASSED BY THE END OF THE YEAR, THEN WE WILL HAVE TO ADOPT THE STATE'S VERSION, WHICH INCLUDES CHAPTER 17, WHICH THE FIRE DEPARTMENT HAS SAID THEY ARE NOT PREPARED TO -- THEY DON'T HAVE THE CAPACITY TO ENFORCE AGAINST, AND WE DID HAVE A SMALL PRESENTATION ON WEDNESDAY, WITH THE FIRE DEPARTMENT FOR ABOUT THREE HOURS, IF PEOPLE RECALL? SO THAT IS WHY I'M ASKING RIGHT NOW TO PASS IT ON FIRST READING. >>

OKAY. SO IT'S A 7G. ANYBODY WANTS TO DISCUSS THIS FURTHER ON THE 7G? IF NOT, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR OF THE WAIVER, PLEASE RAISE YOUR HAND, SAY AYE. SEVEN AYES, TWO EXCUSED. MEMBERS JOHNSON AND SINENCI. MOTION CARRIES./r/n/r/nMEMBER PALTIN. >> I MOVE TO PASS BILL 185 (2024) ON FIRST READING. >> MOVED BY MEMBER PALTIN AND SECONDED BY MEMBER COOK TO PASS BILL 185 ON FIRST READING. >> I WILL RESERVE MY DISCUSSION ON THE MAIN MOTION AS AMENDED UNTIL AFTER WE -- OR SUBSTITUTE BECAUSE AT THIS TIME I MOVE TO SUBSTITUTE BILL 185 (2024) WITH THE FD 1 VERSION AS PROPOSED IN MY AMENDMENT SUMMARY FORM THAT HAS BEEN DISTRIBUTED BY THE COUNTY CLERK. >> SECOND? >> SECOND. >> OKAY.\r\n/r\nMR. COOK ALREADY SHOWED ME HIS TWO. SO MEMBER PALTIN MOVED AND MEMBER COOK SECONDED TO SUBSTITUTE THE BILL WITH THE ATTACHED PROPOSED FD 1 VERSION. DISCUSSION, MEMBER PALTIN. >> THE SUBSTITUTED VERSION SIMPLY MAKES AMENDMENTS TO INCORPORATE NON-SUBSTANTIVE REVISIONS FOR CLARITY, CONSISTENCY AND STYLE. THE PURPOSE -- THE PROPOSED REVISIONS ENSURE CONSISTENCY WITH THE DRAFTING GUIDE FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI LEGISLATION AND IMPROVES THE BILL'S CLARITY. >> THAT'S IT?\r\n\r\nANY MORE DISCUSSION? >> I RESPECTFULLY ASK FOR THE MEMBERS' SUPPORT OF MY MOTION. >> ALL THOSE IN FAVOR OF THE MOTION, RAISE YOUR HAND, SAY AYE. OKAY. THAT IS SEVEN AYES, TWO EXCUSED. MEMBERS JOHNSON AND SINENCI. MOTION CARRIES.\r\n\r\nNOW THE MAIN MOTION AS AMENDED. ANYBODY ELSE? MEMBER PALTIN. >> I DO HAVE SOME DISCUSSION, AND IT WOULD BE THAT I THINK IN THE FUTURE WE SHOULD WORK TO COMMUNICATE BETTER AMONGST OURSELVES, AS THE COUNTY, THE CORPORATION COUNSEL, THE FIRE DEPARTMENT, THE ADMINISTRATION, AND MOST OF ALL THE COMMUNITY. YOU KNOW, WE HAD HEARD OVER THE COURSE OF TIME THAT THE FIRE DEPARTMENT WAS WORKING ON A BIG OVERHAUL TO THE FIRE CODE, AND THAT THEY HAD BEEN WORKING WITH CORPORATION COUNSEL FOR THE LAST SIX MONTHS. THE PART THAT REALLY OUT TO ME AFTER I RECEIVED THE LEGISLATION, AND JUST STARTED DRIVING AROUND NEIGHBORHOOD, DRIVING TO THE COUNTY BUILDING, DRIVING THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY AS A WHOLE, IS THE TREE PORTION. I DON'T KNOW IF OTHER MEMBERS ARE AWARE AT HOW PASSIONATE OUR COMMUNITY IS ABOUT TREES.\r\n\r\nIT COMES UP OFTEN IN OUR WEDNESDAY NIGHT COMMUNITY MEETINGS ABOUT TREES BEING CUT. AND THINGS LIKE THAT. PEOPLE WANTING TO SAVE THEIR MANGO TREES. I'M NOT SURE IF HAS ANYTHING TO DO WITH THAT MAY BE ALL THEY HAVE LEFT. BUT PEOPLE REALLY CARE ABOUT TREES. AS THEY SHOULD, BECAUSE WE ALL BREATHE OXYGEN. BUT IN CONVERSATION WITH OCS DIRECTOR, THEY ADVISED NOT TO DELAY THE ENFORCEMENT IN WRITING IN THE BILL, RATHER TO WRITE A LETTER TO THE FIRE DEPARTMENT TO FOCUS EDUCATION. BECAUSE TREE-TRIMMING IS NOT CHEAP, FIRST OF ALL, AND WE ALL KNOW A LOT OF PEOPLE HAVE STRUGGLE TO JUST PUT FOOD ON THE TABLE, STRUGGLE TO MAKE RENT, STRUGGLE TO PROVIDE THEIR FAMILY WITH CHRISTMAS CELEBRATIONS./r/n/r/nAND THIS UPS THE FINES TO UP TO \$2500, THOUSAND DOLLARS A DAY FIRST OFFENSE, \$2500 A DAY SECOND OFFENSE, I JUST CHALLENGE THE MEMBERS AND CORP. COUNSEL AND THE ADMINISTRATION TO LOOK AT HOW CLOSE TREE CANOPIES ARE TO ROOFS AS THEY DRIVE AROUND? BECAUSE WHAT THIS BILL IS REOUESTING IS 5' OF CLEARANCE. JUST IN MY DRIVE -- JUST WALKING OUT MY DOOR, I HAVE TWO NEIGHBORS WHO WILIWILI TREES ARE TOUCHING MY GUTTERS. YOU GIVE BY THE PARK, YOU HAVE TREES OVER THE LIFEGUARD TOWERS, TREES OVER THE PAVILIONS, POST OFFICE HAS TREES OVER 5'. THIS IS A SIGNIFICANT CHANGE, WHETHER WE FOCUS MY PREFERENCE IS THAT WE FOCUS ON OUTREACH IN THE BEGINNING, BUT YOU KNOW, AS SOON AS CORPORATION COUNSEL, AS SOON AS THE FIRE DEPARTMENT KNEW ABOUT THIS, I'M NOT SURE WHY WE WERE NOT CONSULTING WITH THE PARKS TODAY AND THE STATE PROPERTY AND THE POST OFFICE IS A FEDERAL PROPERTY, AND WE NEED TO FOCUS ON THE REASON WHY WE'RE PASSING THIS IS NOT ONLY BECAUSE WE DON'T WANT TO BE FORCED TO ADOPT THE STATE FIRE CODE. WE COULD LEAVE ALL OF THIS STUFF OUT. BUT WE'RE ADOPTING IT FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR RESIDENTS.\r\n\r\nWE DON'T WANT ANOTHER LAHAINA TO HAPPEN. AND SO WE, AS THE GOVERNMENT, FROM THE COUNTY, THE STATE, AND THE FEDERAL-LEVEL SHOULD BE THE EXAMPLE. WHETHER OR NOT YOU HAVE TO CUT TREES IF IT'S THE SAFE THING TO DO, WE SHOULD BE OUT IN FRONT OF THIS. IF THIS IS GOING TO TAKE EFFECT JANUARY 1ST, ALL OF OUR PROPERTIES SHOULD BE IN COMPLIANCE. IT FEELS AS THOSE PEOPLE ARE WORKING IN SILOS, YOU KNOW? I'M NOT TAKING THIS -- PUTTING IT DOWN, GOING

HOME AND DRIVING WITH BLINDERS ON. I'M APPLYING WHAT IS THE IMPLEMENTATION GOING TO LOOK LIKE?\r\n\r\nYOU KNOW? ON MY DRIVE HOME AS I PONDER WHAT THIS MEANS AND DRIVE IN, DRIVE OUT AND DRIVE MY KIDS TO KALAMA FOR VOLLEYBALL MATCH, EVERYWHERE YOU WOULD, MR. ELLISON SAID I'M AWARE OF THE CHANGES TO THE FIRE CODE AND THE COUNTY HAS A LOT OF WORK TO DO. AND THERE IS GOING TO BE A SIGNIFICANT COST TO THE COUNTY AS WELL WHICH IS A COST TO THE TAXPAYERS. I'M AWARE THAT THE FIRE DEPARTMENT HAS A PIO. AND YOU KNOW, IT WAS SAID THAT WELL WE DON'T WANT TO GO OFF AND START TELLING ME WHEN WE DON'T EVEN KNOW IF THIS IS GOING TO PASS. WE'VE GIVEN THE FIRE DEPARTMENT THEIR ENTIRE BUDGET. WE DON'T WANT TO GO AGAINST THEM WHAT THEY ARE RECOMMENDING.\r\n\r\nAND IF THIS IS BEST PRACTICES, DO WE NEED LEGISLATION TO START PRACTICING IT INTERNALLY? AND SO I HAVE SERIOUS CONCERNS. I AM GOING TO VOTE IN FAVOR OF IT, BUT I JUST WANT TO SAY IN THE FUTURE, THINGS LIKE THIS COULD BE DONE A LOT MORE COMPREHENSIVELY, AND COLLABORATIVELY, AND IF WE DON'T LEARN FROM THIS, PO HO. >> WELL-SAID. ANYBODY ELSE HAVE ANY COMMENTS?\r\n\r\nNO? THAT'S IT. DID WE VOTE ON THIS ALREADY? READY FOR THE AMENDED MOTION, MOTION AS AMENDED. ALL THOSE IN FAVOR OF THE MOTION, RAISE YOUR HAND, SAY AYE. SEVEN AYES, TWO EXCUSED. MEMBERS JOHNSON AND SINENCI.\r\n\r\nMOTION CARRIES. MS. CLERK. WHERE ARE WE? >> CHAIR, WE'RE NOW ON ORDINANCES FOR SECOND AND FINAL READING. HOWEVER, DUE TO THE MAUI NEWS PUBLICATION SCHEDULE WE WERE UNABLE TO PUBLISH THE DIGEST OF THE BILLS UNTIL THIS WEEK AND THE CHARTER REQUIRES IT NO LESS THAN THREE DAYS PRIOR TO FINAL ACTION AND REQUEST THAT COUNCIL DEFER THESE ITEMS TO THE DECEMBER 13TH COUNCIL MEETING. >> ANY OBJECTIONS, MEMBERS?\r\n\r\n>> NO OBJECTIONS. >> MEMBER RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> NO OBJECTIONS, MAHALO, CHAIR. THIS REQUIREMENT, THREE DAYS BEFORE, YOU SAID CHARTER OR CODE? >> CHARTER. >> OKAY. WE HAVE BEEN HAVING PROBLEMS WITH POSTING, YOU KNOW?\r\n\r>> WE DON'T HAVE A DAILY NEWSPAPER ANY MORE. >> THAT'S WHY. >> I THINK WE NEED TO -- >> WE HAVE TRIED. IT SHOULD BE HELD OFF UNTIL NEXT TERM.\r/n/r/n>> OUR RECOLLECTION WHEN WE HAD THE MEETING THE OTHER NIGHT, ALMOST AFTER 9:00, MOST OF THE AMENDMENTS CAME FROM YOU, AND FROM MEMBER PALTIN. IT'S NOT LIKE WE ALL RUSHED AND GAVE ALL OF THESE LAST-MINUTE CHANGES. I DON'T RECALL THAT. >> AND THEN I VOTED AGAINST IT. >> RIGHT. >> BECAUSE I DON'T SUPPORT THIS PROJECT. I DON'T SUPPORT RUSHING AND THAT IS FINE.\r\n\r\nIT'S FINE IF YOU FOLLOW THE PROCESS, IF YOU FOLLOW THE CORRECT PROCESS. THEN IT WOULDN'T BE SUCH AN ISSUE. IT'S LIKE THE FIRE CODE, 700 PAGES WE HAD LIKE TWO DAYS TO READ THAT. >> 34 PAGES. >> THAT FIRE CODE IS PRETTY BIG. OF US. YOU JUST HEARD IT.\r\n\r\nAND NOW WE'RE AT THE POINT WE'RE GOING TO GET CORP. COUNSEL'S OPINION ON IT. >> THERE IS NO SENSE OF URGENCY FOR BILLS THAT AFFECT LAHAINA. THERE'S NO DIRECT REFERRAL FOR THE BILLS THAT AFFECT LAHAINA LIKE THERE IS FOR WAILEA 670 THAT HASN'T SUBMITTED A ENGINEERING REPORT TO THE DOH AND NOT SHOVEL-READY AND YET, YOU ARE HOLDING US HERE DURING THE HOLIDAYS FOR NO GOOD REASON. THERE'S NO REASON TO RUSH THIS. IT'S ALL THE SAME COUNCIL COMING BACK NEXT TERM. I WILL GIVE YOU THE LAST SENTENCE. >> WE'RE HAVING A SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING TWO DAYS BEFORE CHRISTMAS, EXPEDITED PROCESS, WHEN WE COULD WAIT UNTIL NEXT MONTH./r/n/LL BECAUSE OF WAILEA 670 AT THE EXPENSE OF LAHAINA -- THE BILLS THAT WOULD HELP LAHAINA AND THAT IS NOT RIGHT. CHAIR. JUST BECAUSE PUBLIC HEARINGS WERE DONE CONCURRENTLY AT 9:00 IN THE DISTRICT WERE NOT RIGHT AND I SERIOUSLY HOPE YOU CONSIDER NOT PERPETUATING THAT KIND OF WRONG.
