3. Explain any cost increases to each fringe benefit category and identify whether the increase is based on collective bargaining agreements, including the request for FY 2023.

Response: Cost increases to each fringe benefit category are primarily due to several factors such as the following, but not limited to historical and current expenditures, Actuarial Reports from the State of Hawaii, changes in the Employee Fringe Benefit rates, and adjustments relating to the changes in budgeted salaries (i.e. expansion positions, reallocation of positions, or terminal vacation pay). Below is a table showing the comparison between the current and ensuing fiscal years by category:
