SUBJECT: COUNCIL PUBLIC HEARING ON THE FISCAL YEAR 2026 BUDGET (BFED-1)

On April 17, 2025, the Council held a public hearing in the Council Chamber and on Teams regarding the proposed FY 2026 Budget, which also served as the Kahului and Wailuku-Waihe'e-Waikapū residency areas' evening meeting. The public hearing was called to order at 6:04 p.m. and adjourned at 9:29 p.m.
