Pursuant to your correspondence dated April 4, 2024, below are the responses to the following:

1. There is currently \$11,078,251 appropriated as a supplemental transfer to the Solid Waste Fund. Please explain why this 25% increase is warranted for FY 2025. Does the Department intend to expend all of these funds? How would the Department be impacted if this transfer was reduced by \$2,000,000?

Response: These funds are necessary to cover the anticipated operating and capital expenses for the Department of Environmental Management, Solid Waste Division. The Department intends to expend all of the operational funds in FY 2025 and to have the capital improvement funds encumbered by December 31, 2025. If this transfer was reduced by \$2,000,000, a cut of the same amount would be needed to the Solid Waste Division's expenses. As the Department stated during the Budget, Finance, and Economic Development Committee meeting on April 2, 2024, they have included in the proposed budget only those costs that they feel are necessary, so cutting \$2,000,000 would be significant and the majority of the cuts would be to capital expenses.

2. In FY 2023, how much has the County invested in staff training and development relating to grant management, including writing, monitoring, compliance, and reporting? Further, how many grants did the County apply for in total? Of those grants applied for, please also provide the number of grants the County received and did not receive.

Response: There is not currently a central location for the requested information. The Budget Office reached out to the departments to request these details, and the data below is what was received from this request. The Countywide Grant Coordinator is currently working on compiling this information in a report, which will be provided to the Council when finalized. The report is currently estimated to be complete by June 30, 2024.
