On behalf of the Maui Conservation Alliance (MCA), we would like to voice our support for strong policies to eliminate feral cat and feral chicken populations on public lands. As organizations that work to protect native Hawaiian species and restore healthy forests and watersheds, MCA has concerns for the severe negative effects on native resources (birds, plants, and ecosystems) by free ranging cats, chickens, axis deer, and other non-native animals.

The MCA is a cooperative partnership of more than thirteen government, private and non-profit organizations who are the key leaders in the management of Maui's native ecosystems. MCA is committed to accelerating conservation management on Maui's highest priority conservation needs.
