- The purpose of the agricultural district is to:

1. Implement chapter 205, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, and the goals and policies of the Maui County general plan and community plans;

- Promote agricultural development;
- 3. Preserve and protect agricultural resources; and
- 4. Support the agricultural character and components of the County's economy and lifestyle.

(13) Agricultural tourism conducted on a working farm, or a farming operation as defined in section 165-2, for the enjoyment, education, or involvement of visitors; provided that the agricultural tourism activity is accessory and secondary to the principal agricultural use and does not interfere with surrounding farm operations; and provided further that this paragraph shall apply only to a county that has adopted ordinances regulating agricultural tourism under section 205-5;



In 1963, C. Pardee Erdman • purchased Ulupalakua Ranch from the Baldwin family and the Erdman family has operated it since that time. The ranch's peak size was about 40,000. Today, Ulupalakua Ranch operates approximately 18,000 acres, 16,000 acres of fee simple land and 2,000 acres leased from the State of Hawaii and private individuals.

In fact, <u>agricultural production items</u> increased in price by 15.6% from the end of 2021 to 2022 — more than double the rate of inflation — and this trend is not slowing down. At the same time, and perhaps as a result, <u>the number of farms in the US continues to decline</u>. The solution? Agritourism.

<u>Revenue generated by agritourism in the US more than tripled</u> from 2002-2017, generating an estimated \$949 million in sales in 2017.

This growth is not expected to stop any time soon and goes beyond the US. <u>In 2021, the global agritourism market was valued</u> at \$45.4 billion, and it is expected to reach an estimated value of \$141 billion by 2030.
