We, the Hawai'i Public Health Institute (HIPHI), a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, in conjunction with the Healthy Eating +Active Living (HEAL) coalition, a program of HIPHI, would like to donate a portable Eco-Counter Mobile MULTI counting device (hereafter referred to as Mobile MULTI), valued at \$8000, to the County of Maui Public Works Department.
