Chair and Members:

Your Budget and Finance Committee, having met on January 23, 2018, makes reference to County Communication 17-487, from the Budget Director, transmitting the following:

1. A proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2018 BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI AS IT PERTAINS TO ESTIMATED REVENUES; DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS, ROAD, BRIDGE, AND DRAINAGE MAINTENANCE PROGRAM - HIGHWAY FUND; TOTAL OPERATING APPROPRIATIONS; AND TOTAL APPROPRIATIONS (OPERATING AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS)."

The purpose of the proposed bill is to amend the Fiscal Year ("FY") 2018 Budget by 1) increasing Carryover/Savings from the Highway Fund by \$200,000; 2) amending Section 3.B.15.f., Department of Public Works, Road, Bridge, and Drainage Maintenance Program – Highway Fund, by increasing Category B (Operations) and Total appropriations by \$200,000 for the removal of street trees on Lanai; and 3) adjusting the totals accordingly.

2. A Certification of Additional Revenues for FY 2018, dated December 8, 2017, for \$200,000 in Carryover/Savings from the Highway Fund.

The Director of Public Works said street trees that are in the County-owned right of way are under the care and control of the Department of Parks and Recreation, which maintains and removes the

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street trees as warranted. The Department of Public Works provides assistance when needed.

The Director of Parks and Recreation said the Highway Beautification Fund is used for all street tree contracts relating to maintenance and emergency situations. The Highway Beautification Fund was recently used for the emergency removal of street trees in a County-owned right of way on Lanai. The unanticipated expenditure resulted in insufficient funds for street-tree-trimming contracts.

The Budget Director said an emergency purchase order was executed, and \$146,865 was used from the Highway Beautification Fund for the removal of the trees on Lanai.

The Budget Director said higher fuel tax revenues collected in FY 2017 resulted in carryover savings from the Highway Fund.

He explained to your Committee that upon approval of the amendment, the Department of Finance will recertify the purchase order. The recertification will utilize the Highway Fund and allow the Department of Parks and Recreation to use the Highway Beautification Fund to maintain street trees throughout Maui County.

Your Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of the proposed bill on first reading and filing of the communication. Committee Chair Hokama, Vice-Chair White, and members Carroll, Crivello, Guzman, and Sugimura voted "aye." Committee members Atay, Cochran, and King were excused.

Your Committee is in receipt of a revised proposed bill, approved as to form and legality by the Department of the Corporation Counsel, incorporating nonsubstantive revisions that take into account prior amendments to the FY 2018 Budget.

Your Budget and Finance Committee RECOMMENDS the following:

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1.
