FEMA Grants Funding for an Evacuation Route

Generally, FEMA does not provide Public Assistance funding for the construction and designation of evacuation routes. However, FEMA does provide reimbursement for transportation costs for the purpose of evacuations. Eligible evacuation costs include costs incurred in advance of an incident necessary to prepare for evacuations in threatened areas and mobilization of ambulances and other transport equipment.

Individual Assistance Program

The attached power point presentation details many of the Individual Assistance programs and resources available to survivors.

Child Care Assistance

FEMA provides financial assistance under the ONA provision of the IHP to eligible individuals and households who have a disaster-caused increased financial burden for childcare. FEMA will award payment for Child Care Assistance for the household's increased financial burden for up to eight cumulative weeks of childcare, plus any eligible expenses, or the maximum amount of assistance for Child Care Assistance identified by the STT government, whichever is less.

FEMA may provide financial assistance to address increased disaster-caused childcare expenses for eligible households with:

- Children aged 13 and under; and/or
- Children with a disability, as defined by Federal law, up to age 21, who need assistance with activities of daily living.

Job Postings

For everyone's awareness, the positions listed in the attached document, USAJobs postings DR4724, have all closed as of Wednesday (10/4). They are no longer listed on usajobs.gov. However, when/if program areas decide to readvertise the positions, which happens often, they will be listed online again. <u>USAJOBS.gov</u> is still the best place to go to apply for FEMA jobs.

Individuals and Households Program (IHP)

Housing Assistance may include (FY 2023 max grant award - \$41,000):

- Lodging Expense Reimbursement
- Rental Assistance
- Repair Assistance
- Replacement Assistance
- Direct Housing Program
- 100% federally funded

Other Needs Assistance may include (FY 2023 max grant award - \$41,000):

- Personal Property, Transportation, Medical/Dental, Childcare, Funeral, Miscellaneous, Moving and Storage, Critical Needs Assistance, Clean and Sanitize Assistance
- Cost share: 75% federal, 25% non-federal



Critical Needs Assistance (CNA)

- The CNA program can provide eligible survivors with a one-time \$700 payment per household.
- This money can be used for life-saving and life-sustaining items.

Transitional Sheltering Assistance (TSA)

- The TSA program allows survivors to shelter in pre-identified hotels or motels for a limited amount of time as they develop their housing plan.
- FEMA pays for these hotel rooms so there is no out of pocket expense for survivors.



Crisis Counseling Assistance and Training Program

- Provides supplemental funding to eligible state and local government and non-governmental organizations through community-based outreach and psycho-educational services to assist individuals recovering from disasters.
- The goal is to aid survivors in recovering from the adverse reactions to disasters and to begin rebuilding their lives.

Disaster Case Management

 Time-limited process that promotes partnership between a case manager and a disaster survivor in order to assess and address a survivor's verified disaster-caused unmet needs through a disaster recovery plan.



Community Services Programs

Disaster Unemployment Assistance


 Provides unemployment benefits and re-employment assistance services to survivors who are not eligible for regular state unemployment insurance.

Disaster Legal Services

- Provides legal aid to low-income survivors.
- Including help with insurance claims, recovery or reproduction of legal documents lost in the disaster, help with home repairs and disputes with contractors and/or landlords, the preparation of powers of attorney and guardianship materials, and FEMA appeals.



Sequence of Delivery




Individual Assistance Roadmap


