COMPLAINT; SUMMONS.

Plaintiff, CHARLOTTE MARTIN, by and through her attorneys, hereby makes the following claims:

**PARTIES**

1. Plaintiff CHARLOTTE MARTIN is, and at all times relevant hereto was, a resident of the County of Maui.
2. Defendant COUNTY OF MAUI is a governmental entity of the State of Hawai'i and is subject to the jurisdiction of this Court.

3. The subject of this claim for relief occurred in the County of Maui, State of Hawai'i, and is subject to the jurisdiction of this Court.
4. Plaintiff is presently unable to ascertain the true names of Defendants John Does 1-20, Jane Does 1-20, Doe Corporations 1-20, Doe Partnerships 1-20, Doe Non-Profit Entities 1-20, and Doe Governmental Entities 1-20 (herein Doe Defendants), who are therefore sued herein under fictitious names. Doe Defendants are connected with the named Defendant; and/or are the agents, servants, employees, representatives, or independent contractors of the named Defendant; and/or were in some manner engaged in the activities alleged herein; and/or were in some manner responsible for the injuries and damages sustained by Plaintiff. Pursuant to Hawai'i Rules of Civil Procedure Rule 17(d), Plaintiff will seek leave of Court to identify and substitute the true names, capacities, and responsibilities of the Doe Defendants when they are ascertained.
5. Plaintiff alleges that conduct of other Defendants, presently unknown to Plaintiff, was or may have been a legal cause of the occurrence complained of as well as injuries sustained by Plaintiff, thereby rendering all Defendants, identified or unidentified, legally, jointly, and severally liable to Plaintiff for her sustained injuries.

#### **JURISDICTION AND VENUE**

6. The Circuit Court of the Second Circuit, State of Hawaii, has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Haw. Rev. Stat. § 603-21.5.
7. Venue is proper pursuant to Haw. Rev. Stat. § 603-36(5) because the claim for relief arose in the Second Circuit.

#### **FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS**

8. On or about February 5, 2023, Plaintiff Charlotte Martin was walking in the Kepaniwai State Park, within the County of Maui on a public roadway.
9. An employee of Defendant COUNTY OF MAUI, Maui Police Department Officer Mitchell Navarro, was operating his police motor vehicle in the same parking lot.
10. Officer Navarro failed to yield to Plaintiff and ran over Plaintiff's foot.
11. As a result of the incident, Plaintiff sustained serious injuries.

### **LIABILITY**

#### **COUNT I - NEGLIGENCE**

12. Plaintiff alleges and incorporates by reference the above paragraphs of the Complaint as if fully set forth herein.
13. At all times relevant hereto, Mitchell Navarro, as an employee/agent of Defendant COUNTY OF MAUI and who operated a motor vehicle on a public roadway in the course and scope of his employment, had a duty of care to Plaintiff, who was a pedestrian on a public roadway.
14. Defendant COUNTY OF MAUI through its agent Mitchell Navarro breached said duty by failing to operate his motor vehicle in a reasonable and prudent manner, failing to yield and failing to pay attention so as to avoid striking Plaintiff.
15. Defendant's breach of duty was a substantial factor in causing injuries to Plaintiff.

### **INJURIES AND DAMAGES**

16. As a direct and proximate result of Defendants' actions, Plaintiff has sustained injuries for which she is entitled to be compensated, including but not limited to the following:
  - a. Past, present and future pain and suffering;
  - b. Past, present and future mental distress and anguish;


- c. Lost wages; and
- d. Health care expenses for past and future treatment related to the above.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff respectfully requests the following:

- a. That Defendants be found jointly and severally liable for the injuries, damages and losses described above;
- b. That appropriate relief be granted, including awards of general, special, consequential, exemplary, and punitive damages in amounts to be proven at trial, along with reasonable attorney's fees and costs, and such other and further equitable relief as the Court deems just and proper.
