SUBJECT: **MOLOKAI RESIDENCY AREA MEETING REGARDING THE
FISCAL YEAR 2026 BUDGET** (BFED-1)

On April 11, 2025, the Budget, Finance, and Economic Development Committee held a public meeting at the Mitchell Pau'ole Community Center, Kaunakakai, regarding the proposed FY 2026 Budget. Present for the meeting were: Committee Chair Yuki Lei K. Sugimura, and members Tom Cook, Gabe Johnson, Tamara Paltin, Keani N.W. Rawlins-Fernandez, Shane M. Sinenci, and Nohelani U'u-Hodgins. Committee members Alice L. Lee and Tasha Kama were excused. The meeting was called to order at 6:03 p.m. and adjourned at 8:26 p.m.

Your Committee received oral testimony from 25 individuals. Unless otherwise indicated, the following oral testimony was received in support of funding for the organization, program, or project noted:

1. Four individuals testified in support of continued funding for Maui Economic Development Board, Inc., including two who testified in support of the STEMworks AFTERSchool program.
2. James Rarick, President, and Greg O'Shea, Secretary, Molokai Community Health Center Board of Directors, testified in support of continued funding for the organization and other dental and health programs on Molokai.
3. Two individuals testified in support of continued funding for Maui Economic Opportunity, Inc., and its Head Start Afterschool Programs & Summer Programs and transportation services.
4. Three individuals testified to request additional funding for kūpuna support services on Molokai, including kūpuna advocacy, more nutritious senior meals, and programs such as Kaunoa Senior Services and Alu Like, Inc.

5. One individual testified in support of continued funding for the local film industry, especially for video production and local content creation in Maui County and on Molokai.
6. One individual requested funding for Pūlama Ka Heke and supported continued funding for all community nonprofit organizations and local youth canoe clubs.
7. 'Iolani Kū'oha, Board President, and Alice Ka'ahanui, Executive Director, Molokai Arts Center, testified in support of continued funding for the organization and other recreation programs.
8. Seven individuals testified to request funding for the relocation and renovation of the Molokai Police Station to address flood and natural disaster preparedness concerns, and the Maui Police Department Youth Cadet Leadership Program on Molokai.
9. Justin Luafalemana, President, 'Āinapa'a Wrestling Team, along with four wrestlers and one other individual, testified in support of continued funding for County grants that help the organization cover travel costs. He also requested funding for additional community recreation facilities on Molokai in the future.
10. Four individuals testified in support of continued funding for Sust'āinable Molokai and requested additional funding for the organization, including for staffing and practical support to the Maui Nui Resiliency Hub and for their mobile market:
 - a. Tehani Kaalekahi, Executive Director, Sust'āinable Molokai;
 - b. Robert Nerveza-Shizuma, Farm Business Specialist Sust'āinable Molokai;
 - c. Tanya Davis-Mendija, Office Administrative Assistant, Sust'āinable Molokai; and
 - d. MP Kamakana, Vice President, Molokai Livestock Homestead Association.
11. Robert Nerveza-Shizuma also testified to request additional funding for Molokai Clean Energy Hui and programs that support

initiatives like the Molokai Community Energy Resilience Action Plan.

12. MP Kamakana also testified to request additional funding for the Molokai beef industry.
13. One individual testified in support of continued funding for community events and organizations throughout Maui County, including the Made in Maui County Festival and Friends of Molokai High and Middle Schools Foundation.
14. Kawaipuna Kalipi, Land Back Manager, Molokai Heritage Trust, testified to request funding for the organization.
15. Ku‘ulei Arce, Program Manager, Molokai Rural Health Community Association, testified in support of continued funding for the organization.
16. One testifier testified in support of continued funding for Molokai community organizations and requested additional funding for a community-certified kitchen on Molokai.
17. One individual testified to request the Molokai Resiliency Hub be managed by the Maui Emergency Management Agency; and to request funding for houseless programs currently provided to Family Life Center instead be distributed to small organizations, such as churches and nonprofits, for the construction and maintenance of housing and safe-parking programs.

Your Committee also received the attached written testimony.

Aloha esteemed members of the Maui County Council and especially to our council member Keani Rawlins-Fernandez,

My name is Robert Nerveza-Shizuma and I am the Molokai Clean Energy Hui Coordinator in our Energy Sovereignty program at Sustainable Molokai.

First, mahalo nui to all of you on the council and the broader Maui County for your consistent support across Sustainable Molokai's initiatives. Although Energy Sovereignty and the Molokai Clean Energy Hui has not received direct funding from the County of Maui, the Molokai Clean Energy Hui will have a renewable energy implementation plan within 1-3 years and we will return with opportunities to support us in the future.

Second, we are grateful that this council continues to invest in hazard mitigation. Molokai has worked toward having its own Hazard Mitigation Plan in addition to Maui County's HazMit plan. We would like to ask your help in requesting TetraTech to use existing reports such as CERAP 1.0 and the council funded Climate Change Sea Level Adaptation and Resiliency plans that have comprehensive summaries of Community outreach and engagement. These results can be used to drive emergency planning as it relates to critical infrastructure.

TetraTech's intention to utilize an online-only one-time survey is not only duplicative, but it would be a fraction of the results that we collected in the past 4 years community outreach done in CERAP and CCLAR. TetraTech's proposed method of community engagement was open for a short time with an unknown amount of marketing for Molokai residents to participate. As outlined in the CERAP 1.0 report, online surveying is not a community-preferred method of engagement and outreach. It would be strategic for Molokai's HazMit plan to incorporate published community outreach and engagement results instead of going strictly off of the online surveys administered from TetraTech. The County of Maui's HazMit plan for Molokai is essential for unlocking FEMA funding for community co-designed renewable energy solutions for bolstering Molokai communities' disaster and energy resiliency.

Third, some of you may recall Leilani Chow's presentation last year on Molokai's CERAP (Community Energy Resilience Action Plan). One of the projects you have already learned about and will be coming to fruition soon is the Fast-Tracked Community Based Renewable Energy project at Kualapu'u Rec Center. Big mahalo for the council's support in this process and shout out to Ho'ahu Energy Cooperative for spearheading the planning and development of this project. We have been working with National Renewable Energy Laboratory and Pacific Northwest National Laboratory to advance the next projects in CERAP. The projects that we are pursuing are geared to provide energy sovereignty and

clean energy to the Molokai community in a way that provides economic relief to our residents in the long run. I hope you all share the pride and excitement we feel because as partners you have excelled in being staunch allies of CERAP.

Aloha and welcome County of Maui leaders!

April 11, 2025

Ka Hale Pomaika'i staff, alumni and haumana would like to have been present to meet and greet you tonight. However, if you are reading this, it means that we were not able to present our comments in person. Why is that, you might ask (since we always show up)? It is because in a nearby safe and secure, warm and welcoming home, known as the KHP Sober house, more than 20 of us are gathering to encourage, support and join in fellowship to celebrate our shared recovery journey. Each Friday KHP sponsors an ohana-welcoming sobriety support group and dinner. We have been in attendance at every County Budget session on Molokai since 2003, and while coming to share our mana'o with you tonight is extremely valuable and important, our ability to do so is contingent on the very thing we meet each week to support and honor. This being said, we are hoping that Council will understand and accept this written testimony in our absence.

The first and foremost comment we have tonight is that we have tremendous gratitude for our County's continued support of Ka Hale Pomaika'i (KHP)'s mission to continue its recovery oriented array of addiction reduction services on Moloka'i. We can assuredly say that this support has helped to improve the quality of life for persons on Moloka'i, in the County of Maui, who have succumbed to substance misuse while struggling with food insecurity and/or houselessness. The goal of reducing addiction and the effects that surround it are addressed with our services. These include food production and distribution, sober shelter, and the comprehensive continuum of recovery support. Our program embraces values that has instilled a sense of cultural pride and resilience for many. In meeting the potential haumana (client) where they are at, KHP uses a culturally respectful approach. By improving total wellness with a continuum of treatment service modalities and/or harm-reducing prevention strategies, persons avoid incarceration, seek emergency medical treatment less, and improve home life stability.

For over 25 years, KHP has been keeping the doors open of the **only** Sober Living Residence (Shelter) on Moloka'i. Up to 730 annual safe bed days and nights are available for homeless recovering adults seeking sober shelter. A very large part of this service has been the support of the County by continuing to ensure this as an option to chronic homelessness.

KHP's ongoing community service continues with our own productive Victory Farm. Each week, KHP supplies individuals, families and Kupuna with fresh organic produce grown and distributed by KHP's clients in recovery along with food boxes from the KHP Food Pantry. Because pilina is so very vital in our community, this outreach service has bridged the gap of fear, breaking barriers of shame, that have resulted in sustained recovery, alumni retention, and the welcoming of new haumana to the world of treatment and sobriety. It is this service that has attracted folks to stay in recovery as Recovery Ambassadors who in welcome new folks. It is this pilina that has made the Friday night recovery dinners so popular.

With the cost of rent for a room in a house on Molokai being \$1286/month, a newly sober person would have to earn \$25+/hr or \$52,000/yr. Drug use has been associated with over 90% of local confirmed child abuse cases and contributes to the violence and property crimes locally.

Providing housing, food security and treatment options (relative to usual care) improves major outcomes in these areas. Psychological distress and intimate partner violence also decline when services are utilized. KHP believes that clients who are supported along their journey into sobriety are better able to achieve and maintain a crime-free life, improved wellness and long-term recovery saving the County tens of thousands of dollars spent on crisis responsive measures and incarceration costs.

The staff at KHP have all been in long term recovery with lived experience as well as completing higher education certifications to assist persons with chronic substance use disorders to find sobriety. As a team, our desire is for haumana to become safer within the community by offering them Substance Use Assessments & Referrals, Motivational Outreach with Peer Mentorship, Monthly Recovery Dinners, evening 12-step meeting facilitation and Transportation.

Most recently our deepest appreciation is again going out to our County for the support and belief in our relocation efforts. Although we did not plan or want to relocate from the East End, our lease with DHHL will expire on 09/30/2025. This termination will assist the DHHL to move forward with a fire station and homestead lots, both worthy and needed projects.

In closing, as the Executive Director of KHP since 1996, I have heard the whispering of people who think our County has a history of forgetting about our community. I can say with the most sincerity that this is NOT the case. For us, our pilina with the County has been a life line in these times of Federal change. We live better, thrive more, and are examples to others because the County has never forgotten us. Our successful haumana routinely share their stories of gratitude, celebrations, and power over former struggles. Data backs this up, but facts and numbers don't change minds, feelings and emotions do. Self-perception and stigma can impair community relationships, but the pilina that empowers our recovering folks is changing this one soul at a time.

Mahalo once again for your time in reading this comment, for your faithfulness, and for honoring our support of next year's proposed Council's recommendation to the Mayor's budget.

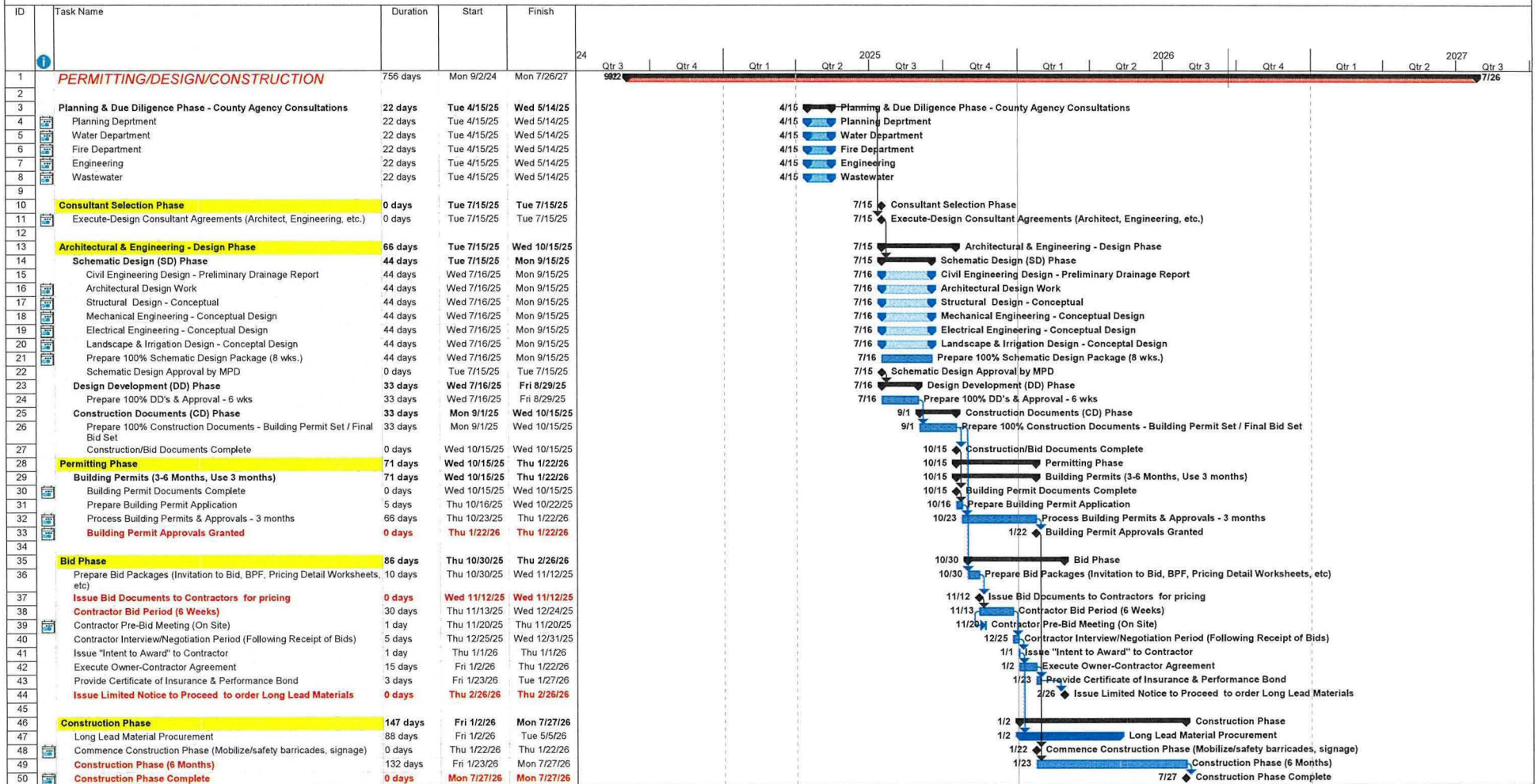
