Amendment Summary Form

Legislation: Bill 92 (2022), relating to a residency requirement for board, commission, and committee members.

Proposer: Councilmember Tamara Paltin *Tamara D. M. Paltin*

Description: My amendment would delete “established by ordinance” from Bill 92 (2022) to clarify that the residency requirement applies to all boards, commissions, and committees whether established by Charter or by ordinance.

Motion: Move to amend SECTION 1 by deleting “established by ordinance” from proposed Maui County Code Section 2.60.040.

Effect: If my motion is approved, SECTION 1 of Bill 92 (2022), CD1 will read as shown below. The deleted text is shown in strikethrough in this Amendment Summary Form but will not appear in the bill.

SECTION 1. Chapter 2.60, Maui County Code, is amended
by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read
as follows:

“2.60.040 Residency requirements for board, commission, and committee members. Only County residents are eligible for appointment to a board, commission, or committee established by ordinance, unless the council waives the residency requirement by a resolution adopted by a two-thirds vote. If a member of a board, commission, or committee ceases to be a resident of the County, the member must notify the mayor and council chair within ten days of their residency change. Residency outside of the County or failure to report a residency change outside of the County as required by this section is cause for removal.”

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Reasons: The County Code includes various membership requirements for Charter-established boards, commissions, and committees. The proposed CD1 version of Bill 92 (2022), establishing a residency requirement, follows that practice.

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
