I do think the possibility of having safe-parking lots for homeless, (as described) in areas that are NOT in neighborhoods, or near public parks, would be good. I suggest a County SAFE parking lot with toilets & showers be made available in Kahului & East side, the West side and the South side of Maui. I believe it is important to situate these lots outside of neighborhoods & public park areas, where families seek safety and security from the known issues associated with encampments in past: drugs & alcohol; trash & fights, and the fear associated with past homeless encampments. Our neighborhood has experienced these problems in the past!

I have attended meetings in the past trying to deal with homeless issues, and am always available to participate in the future. Thank you for hearing my concerns!

Holomua rd. presents a serious wildfire risk and is close to popular beaches which presents sanitary risks during runoff. All the toxic elements exposed during frequent vehicle fires along with human waste are running into the waters surfers and swimmers use on a daily basis.
