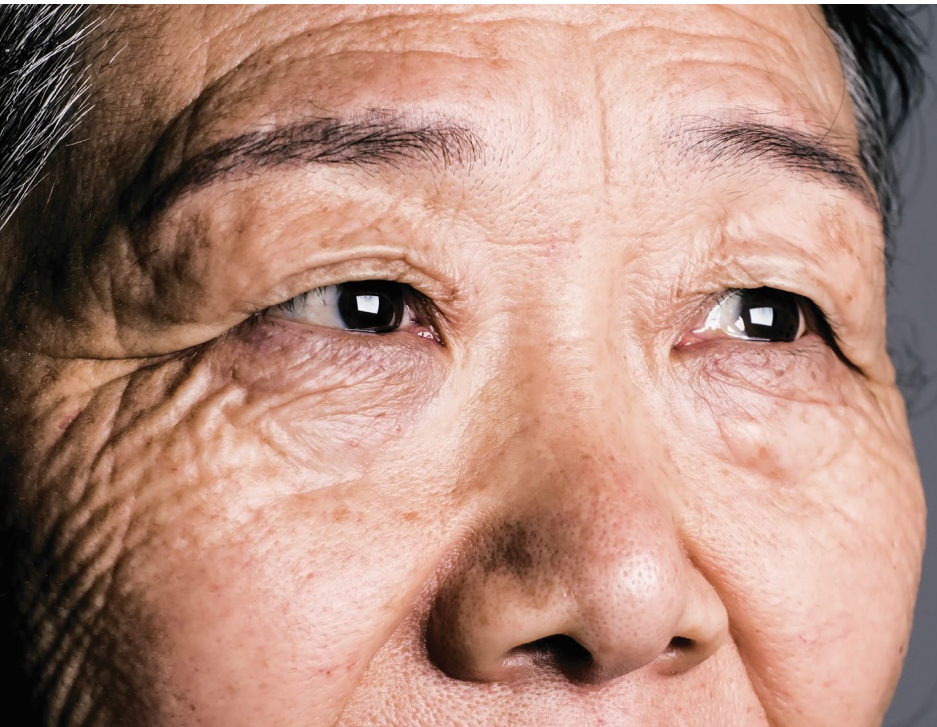

Governing Laws

- Older Americans Act, 1965 as amended
 - Created the infrastructure of the Administration on Community Living and the State Units on Aging
 - Defined the services and supports to be provided in the community
 - Required that States have a plan on aging to address the needs of older adults
- Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) 349 established EOA and the functions of the office



Aging Population in Hawaii

Overall Population in Hawaii =
1,455,271

24.9% (362,362) are 60 years of age
and older

- Highest life expectancy in the nation = 80.7 years of age
- 27.8% live with a disability
- 29,000 live with Alzheimer's Disease or related dementias
- 51,047 (14%) live alone
