#### Responses from Kilia Purdy-Avelino

- 1. The INB is comprised of nine community members, with one from each council residency area, how long have you resided in your district? I am 4th generation Hoolehua homesteader; at least 42 years of my life since going away for college.
- 2. Given your understanding of the role and responsibilities as a member of the INB, why do you believe that you are qualified for the position?
  - I have lived on Molokai all my life and since returning from college in 2005, I have been actively involved in this community in various capacities. I have been an educator on Molokai for 20 years from Pre-school through to college as a lecturer at UH Maui College, Molokai Education Center. I co-founded and voluntarily ran a homeschool program for students seeking alternative cultural education. I volunteered for food bank and helped to organize Ho'oku'ikahi Aloha Molokai during the COVID pandemic working with different organizations. I currently mentor a homestead agriculture youth group to get more youth interested in farming/producing food for our community. I believe I am qualified because I know, work with, and actively am involved with many people on our island who care about the future of our island.
- 3. How will your expertise and knowledge aid in your decision-making ability as a member of the INB?
  - I know Molokai and most people who are from this island, especially if they are servant leaders in our community. I've worked and volunteered with many. I have an open mind and heart to listen and work collaboratively. My actions are usually based first on the care of our aina because I know that without it, we cannot survive. Much of what I do is with our youth because they are the ones who will have to live through the decisions we make and actions we take. So, it is important to include youth voice and ideas.
- 4. What factors do you think the INB should consider when determining nominees?
  - I believe that people who serve in capacities for Molokai should be from Molokai, know and understand our community by previously and actively serving in various capacities, and strive to preserve and protect our islands uniqueness and resources, whether in this position or in other county board positions. They should also have cultural perspective and ways of thinking and doing.
- 5. What would you hope to accomplish if selected during your term of service?
  - Assure that our native Hawaiian community and generational 'ohana will be represented by the people who are being selected in these positions.
