Subject: BILL 21 (2022), PROPOSED CD1, SEABIRD AND BIODIVERSITY PROTECTION (CARE-74)

Aloha e Chairwoman Takaya King,

As requested, providing comments on Bill 21 (2022), Proposed CD1. Per your letter dated February 24, 2022, the bill's "purpose is to protect native Hawaiian seabirds from becoming disoriented by artificial lights during their maiden flights out to sea, an occurrence often referred to as "fallout," which leave them vulnerable to predation, vehicle collisions, and starvation."

It is understood that the Bill, if enacted, may impact Kamehameha Schools Maui's stadium and outdoor lighting fixtures, which may also impact performance and safety for our staff, haumāna, and the community.

Please note that none of our campus lights shine over the ocean. Following is a list of our lighting structures and current status thereof:

Location / Description	Status
Stadium Lights	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• LED lighting are directional fixtures and as LED's, they are naturally shielded or should be considered partially shielded.• These directional fixtures would be considered Class III (others) light fixture
Wall Sconces	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Shielded, fixture, pointed downwards and not shining above horizontal. In the process of changing out to LED• Class III (others)• Wall paint is matted and does not reflect lighting

Pool	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• In pool safety lights only, no decorative lights. None LED.
