SUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR 2025 BUDGET (BFED-1)

In light of the recent decisions by the State Legislature regarding funding for the County of Maui for response to the August 2023 Wildfires, please see the attached markup up portions of Bill 60 (2024) for the Budget, Finance, and Economic Development Committee's consideration.

This proposal includes the following:

- An increase to the Maui Emergency Management Agency Operating and Equipment category of \$14,000,000 for security related costs.
- A decrease to Department of Management, Office of Recovery Program Operating and Equipment category. This decrease reflects the following: removal of the bridge loan funding of \$54,550,000, removal of \$500,000 in costs that were transferred to the Office of the Mayor, removal of \$700,000 in costs that were transferred to Office of the Mayor, Community Development Block Grant Program, and removal of \$7,000,000 in costs to free up general fund.

- The addition of a line item under Office of the Mayor for Community Development Block Grant Program. These funds will be used for preparation for the Community Development Block Grant Program Disaster Relief funding that is anticipated from the Federal Government.
- Deletion of the Maui Wildfire Disaster Recovery CIP under the Department of Management.
- Addition of the following Bond Fund CIPs under the Department of Management:
 - o Pump Station Temporary Repairs, \$4,000,000
 - Road and Sidewalk repairs related to the August 2023 Wildfires, \$5,000,000
 - o Roadway Connectivity for evacuations, \$5,000,000
 - o Roadway Connectivity for evacuations land acquisition, \$8,000,000
 - o Storm Drainage, Flood Control, and Water Quality Improvements, \$8,000,000
 - o Fire flow improvements to water system, \$8,000,000
- Removal of all wildfire related State funds from Appendix A, Part I
- Addition of anticipated revenues for the General Excise Tax (GET) funds in Appendix A, Part II.
- Deletion of the conditional language under the GET fund for Waste Water Pump Stations 5 and 6.
- Addition of the following conditional language under the GET fund:
 - o \$33,400,000 for construction, permitting, operations, and maintenance of the wildfire permanent disposal site.
 - o \$2,000,000 for wildfire debris removal.
 - o \$16,668,000 for water infrastructure repairs and replacement and wastewater repairs related to the August 2023 Wildfires.
 - o \$2,000,000 for the Kahului Wastewater Treatment Plant 4th Aeration Basin.
- Deletion of the project and project description for "Maui Wildfire Disaster Recovery" and insertion new projects and project descriptions for the CIPs listed above.

The Department of Management has also spoke to Ikaika Ohana about the Kaiāulu o Kupuohi project in West Maui. The developer has stated that they would be willing to have the County purchase the land with an agreement to lease it back to them for the duration of the affordability period of 65 years. A markup of the proposed language for the Affordable Housing Fund is also attached.
