A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING
THE FISCAL YEAR 2020 BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI
AS IT PERTAINS TO THE OFFICE OF THE MAYOR,
ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (EAST MAUI ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
AND CULTURAL PROGRAMS)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 4988, Bill No. 36 (2019), Draft 1, as amended, "Fiscal Year 2020 Budget", is hereby amended as it pertains to Section 3.B.9.c.(2)(iv), Office of the Mayor, Economic Development Program, Grants and Disbursements for business development and technology, East Maui Economic Development and Cultural Programs by deleting "(10) Provided, that \$8,000 shall be for the Na Moku Aupuni o Koolau Hui – Loi Restoration" and "(11) Provided, that \$8,000 shall be for the Na Moku Aupuni o Koolau Hui – Hoolaulea", to read as follows:
