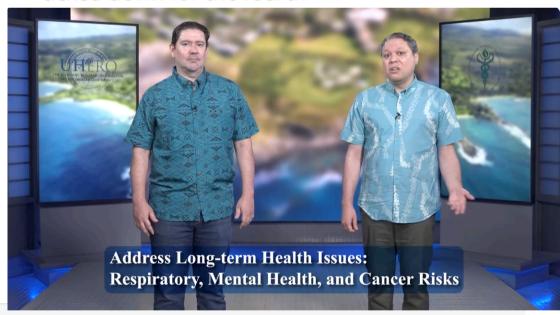

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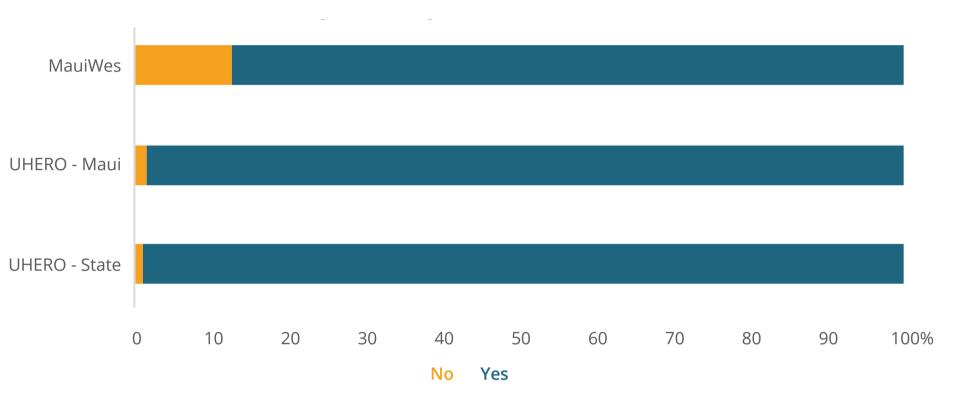

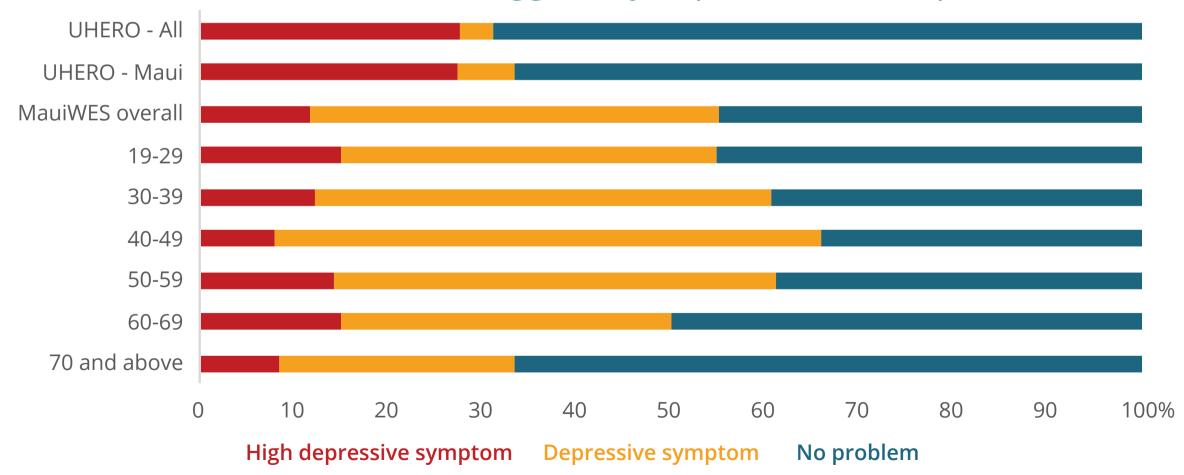

Initial results suggest a jump in rates of depression

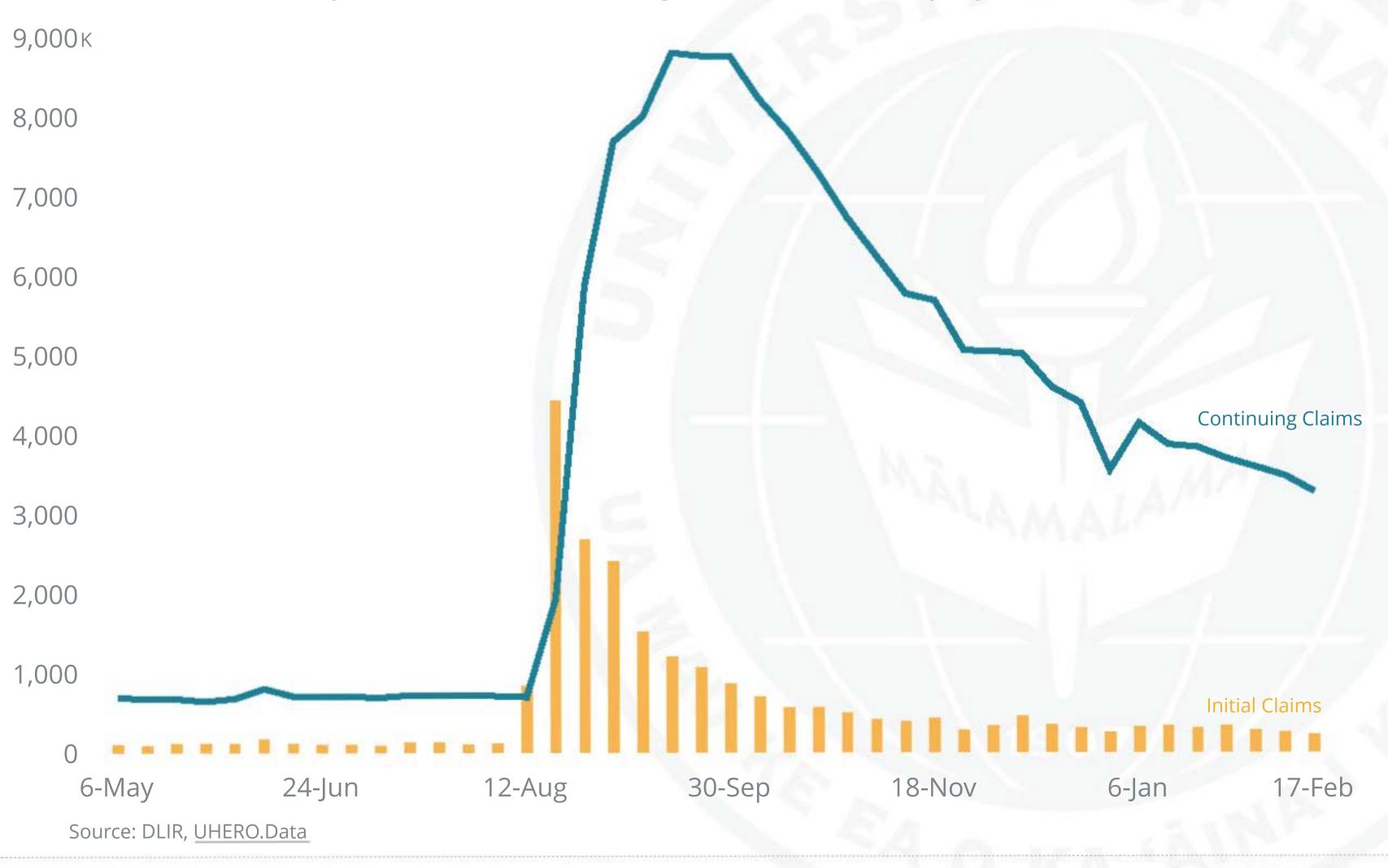

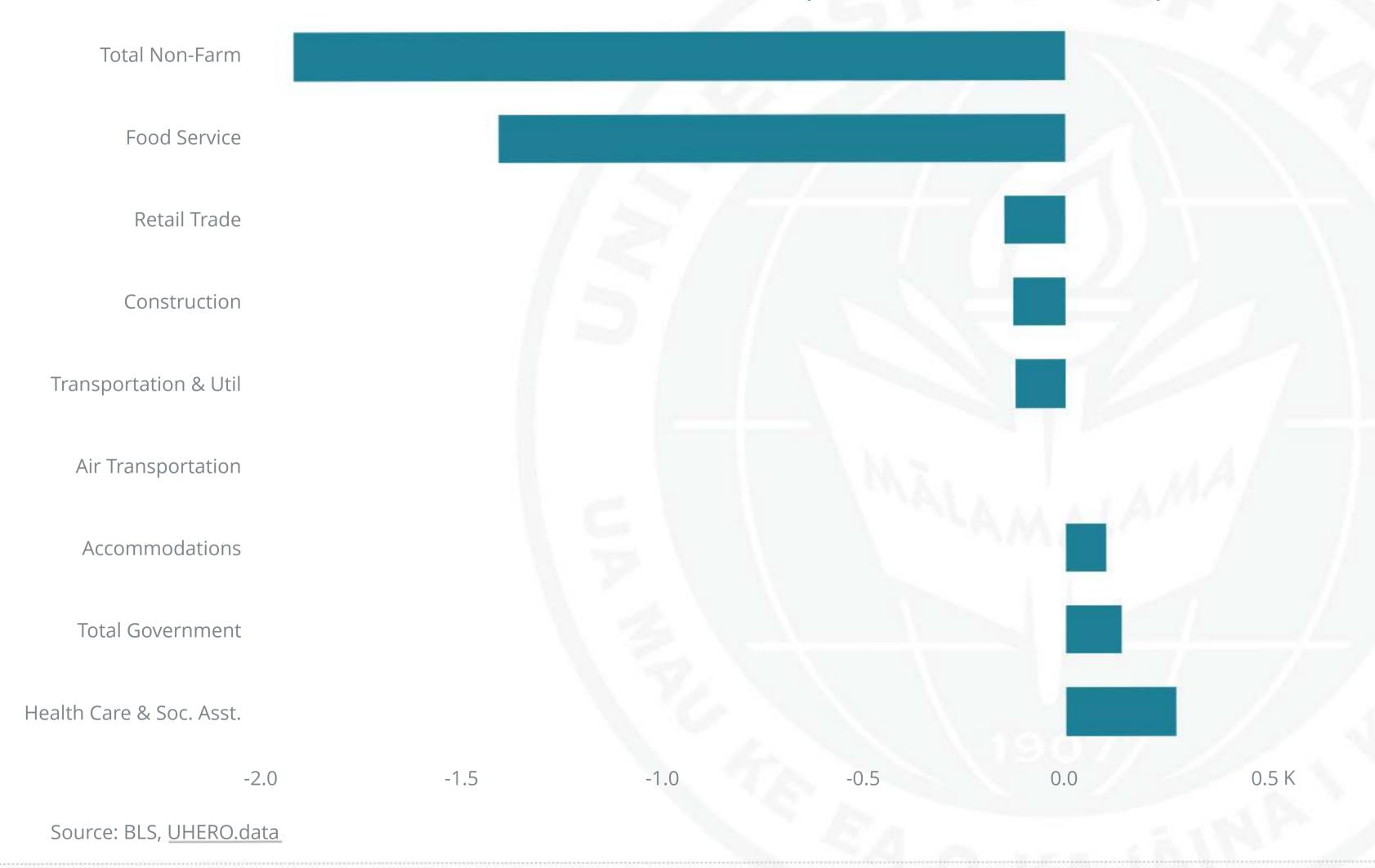

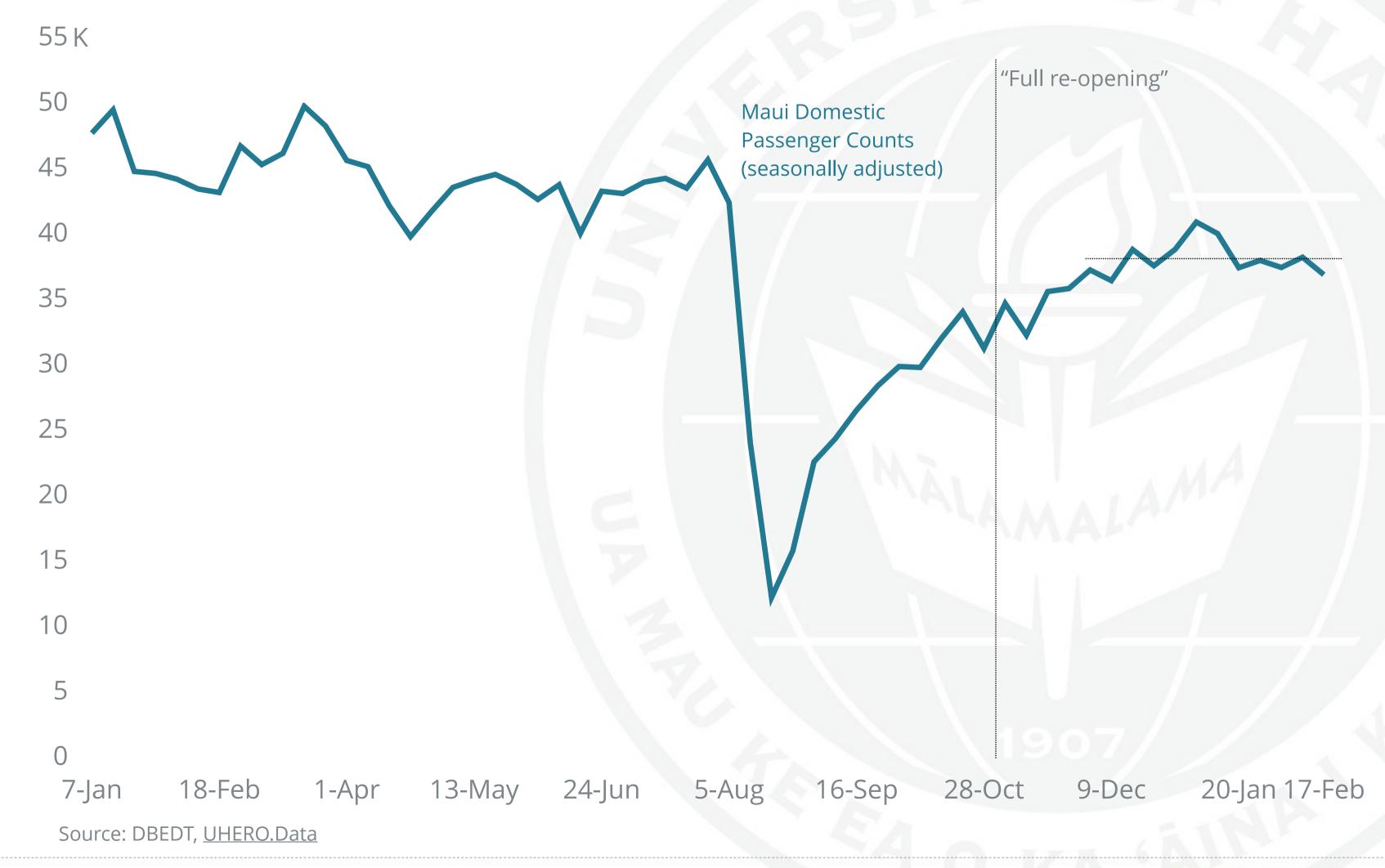

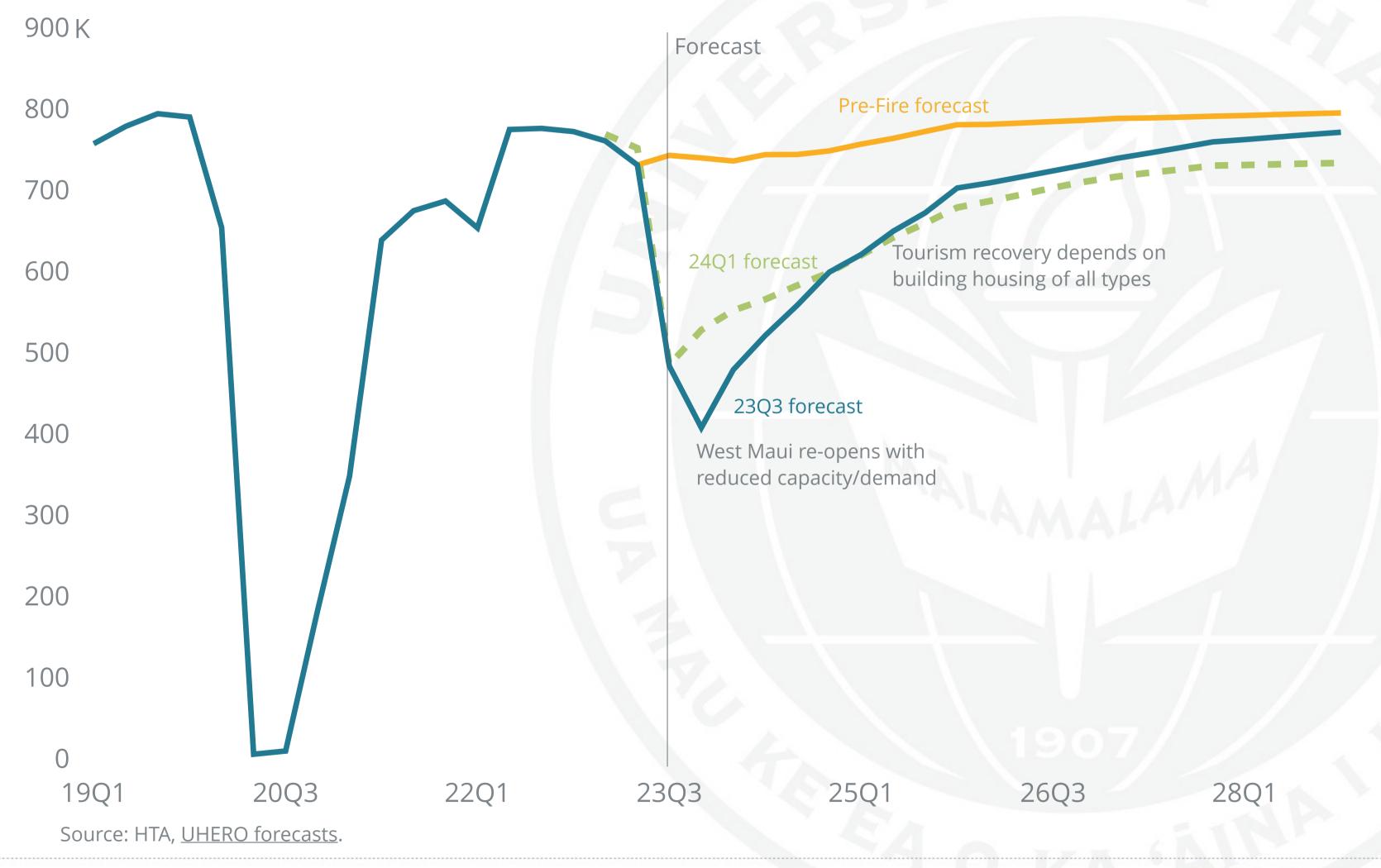

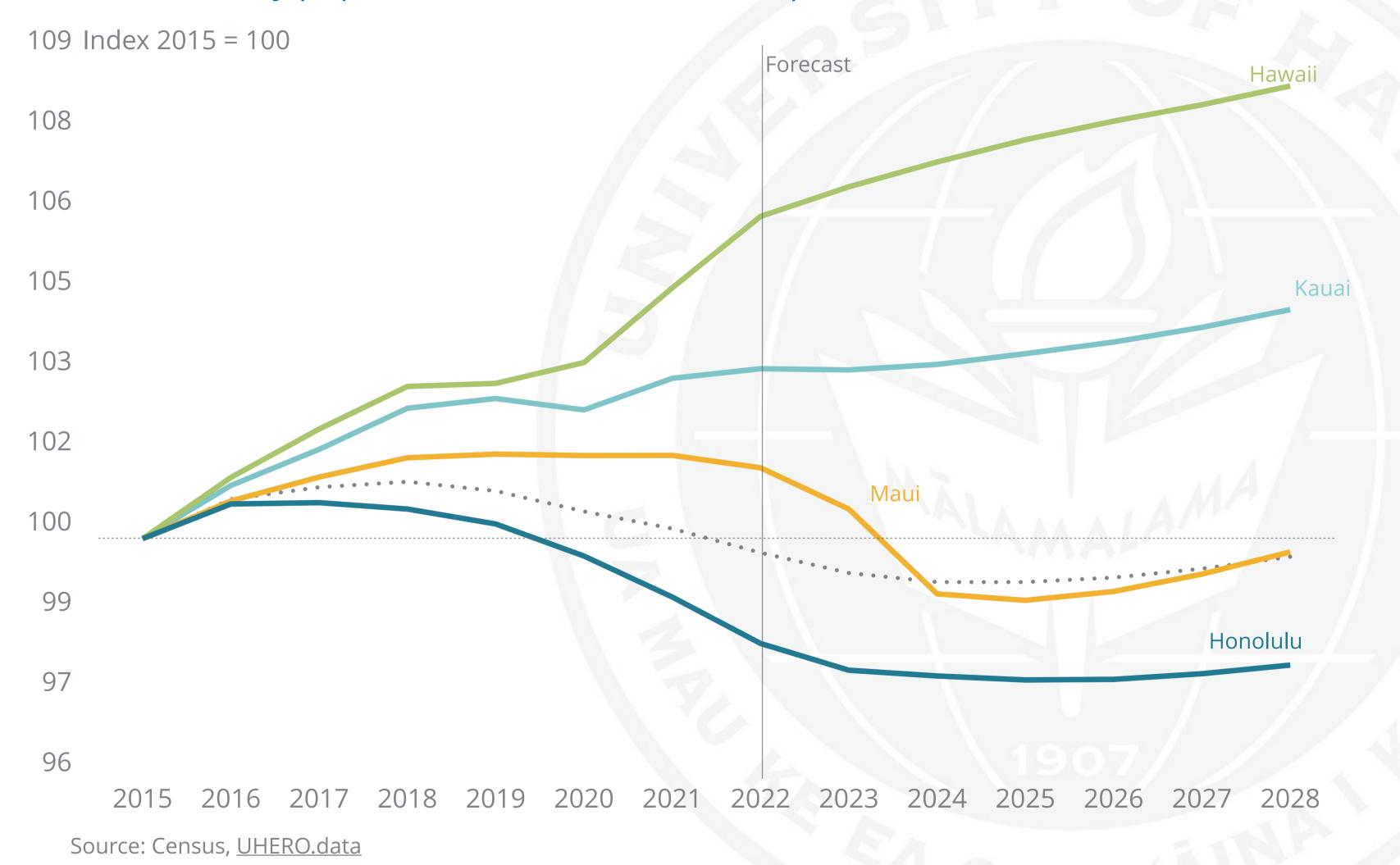

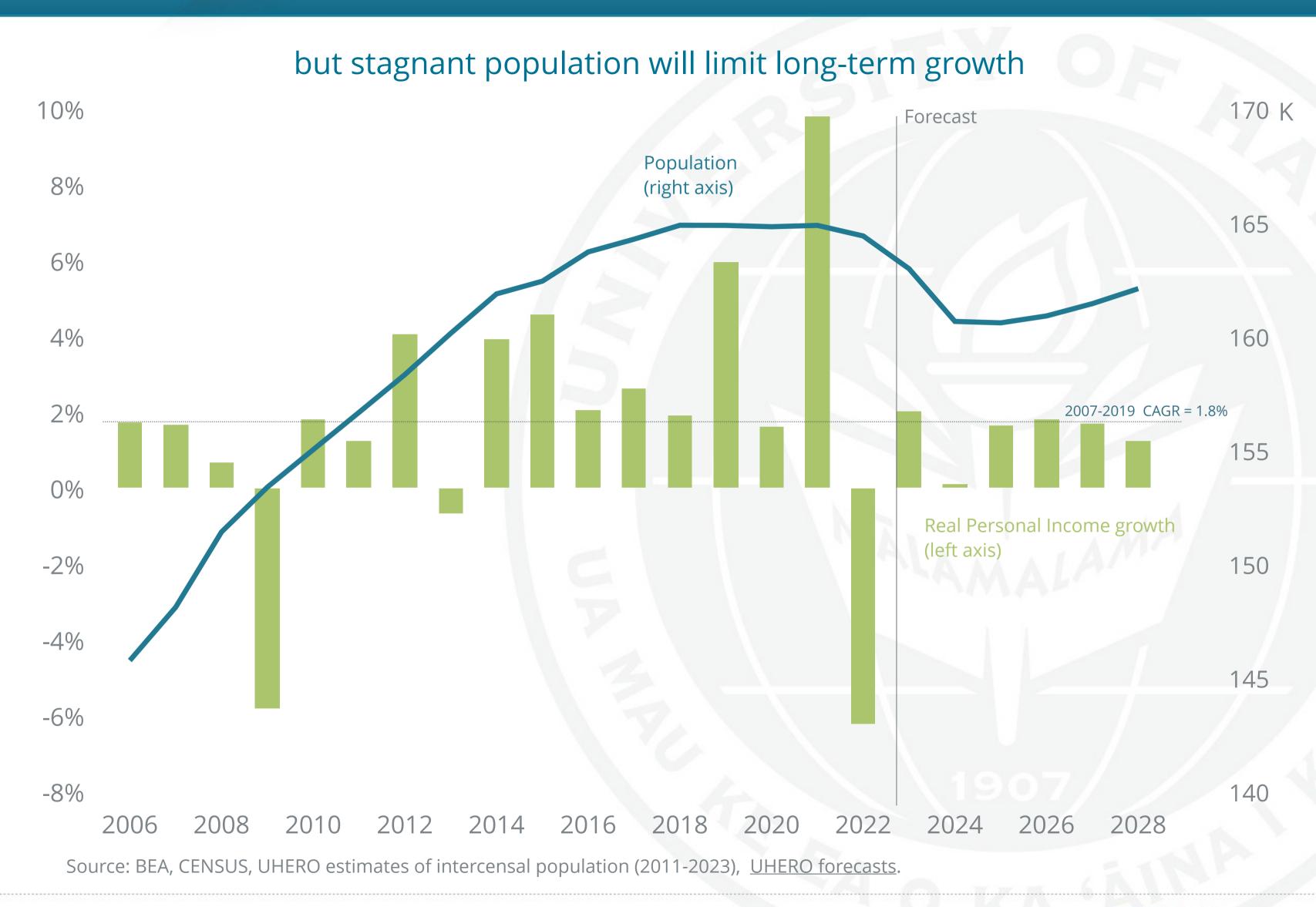


# Longer term, economic growth depends on housing

# Growth resumes with rebuilding, and then slows below trend

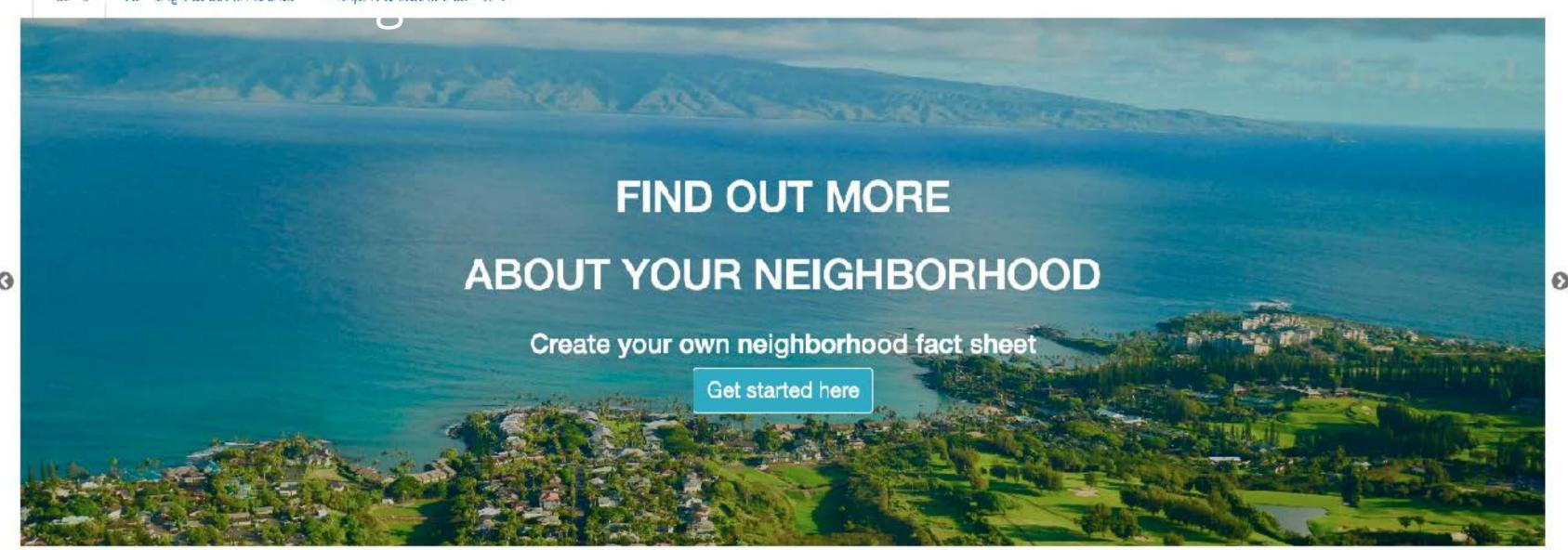




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Housing Facion is Builde

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Residents of Hawai'i face the highest housing costs in the nation. High housing costs lower the standard of living for residents and hinder the State's ability to attract workers. Some households are forced to live in crowded conditions, some leave the state to find housing elsewhere, and some are forced to survive without housing at all. To inform discussions on the way forward for housing in Hawai'i, UHERO released the first edition of an annual report on the state of housing. In this interactive dashboard, users can explore housing market data across Hawaii's neighborhoods.

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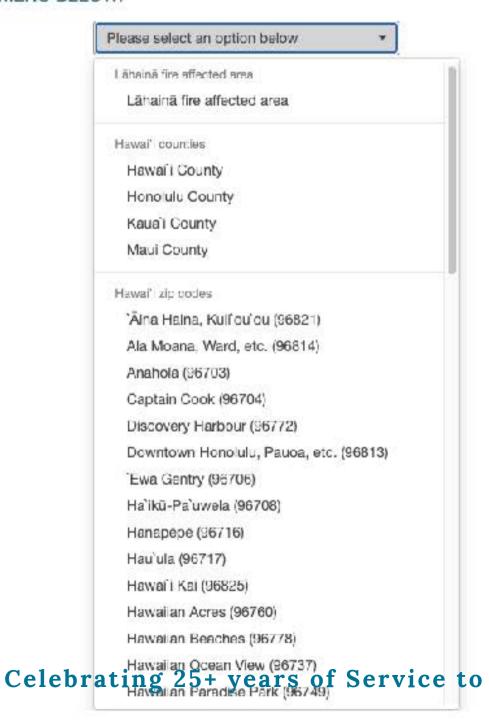

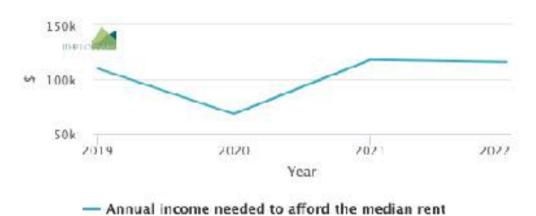

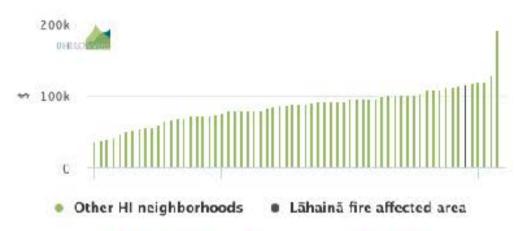

Percent of residential land zoned multi-family in 2021 in Lähainä fire affected area vs. other HI neighborhoods



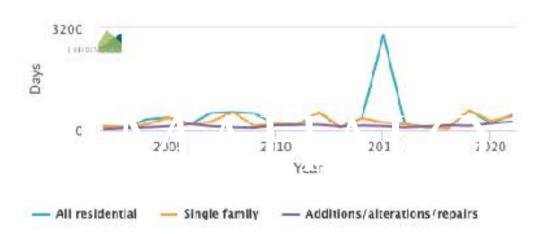

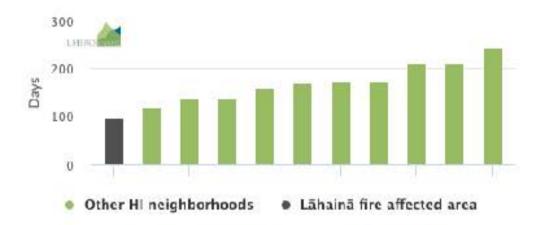
