The attached legislative proposal pertains to Item 47 on the Committee's agenda.



Legislation: Revised proposed bill relating to soil erosion and sediment control.

Proposer: Councilmember Don S. Guzman.



Description: Amends the revised proposed bill to require applicants to provide information sufficient to show the proposed work will also conform with requirements of the Department of Land and Natural Resources' State Historic Preservation Division, based on the archaeological documents identified.

Motion: Move to amend Section 4 of the revised proposed bill, which amends Section 20.08.080, Maui County Code, by inserting at the end of the new second sentence the following phrase, "and requirements of the department of land and natural resources' state historic preservation division based on applicable archaeological assessments, archaeological surveys, and archaeological and burial plans of the permitted area."

Effect: In Ramseyer format, the changes are as follows (with the language for insertion highlighted):

20.08.080 Grading and grubbing permit review. Drainage, engineering slope hazard report, and erosion control plans shall be submitted to the applicable soil and water conservation district(s) and to the department of land and natural resources' state historic preservation division for review and comment. Applicants shall provide information sufficient to show that the proposed work will be in conformance with the most current standards on file with the department of public works, as set forth by the soil and water conservation district(s) and requirements of the department of land and natural resources' state historic preservation division based on applicable archaeological assessments,

archaeological surveys, and archaeological and burial plans of the permitted area.

Final approval or disapproval by the County shall be made within ten days after receiving their comments.

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
