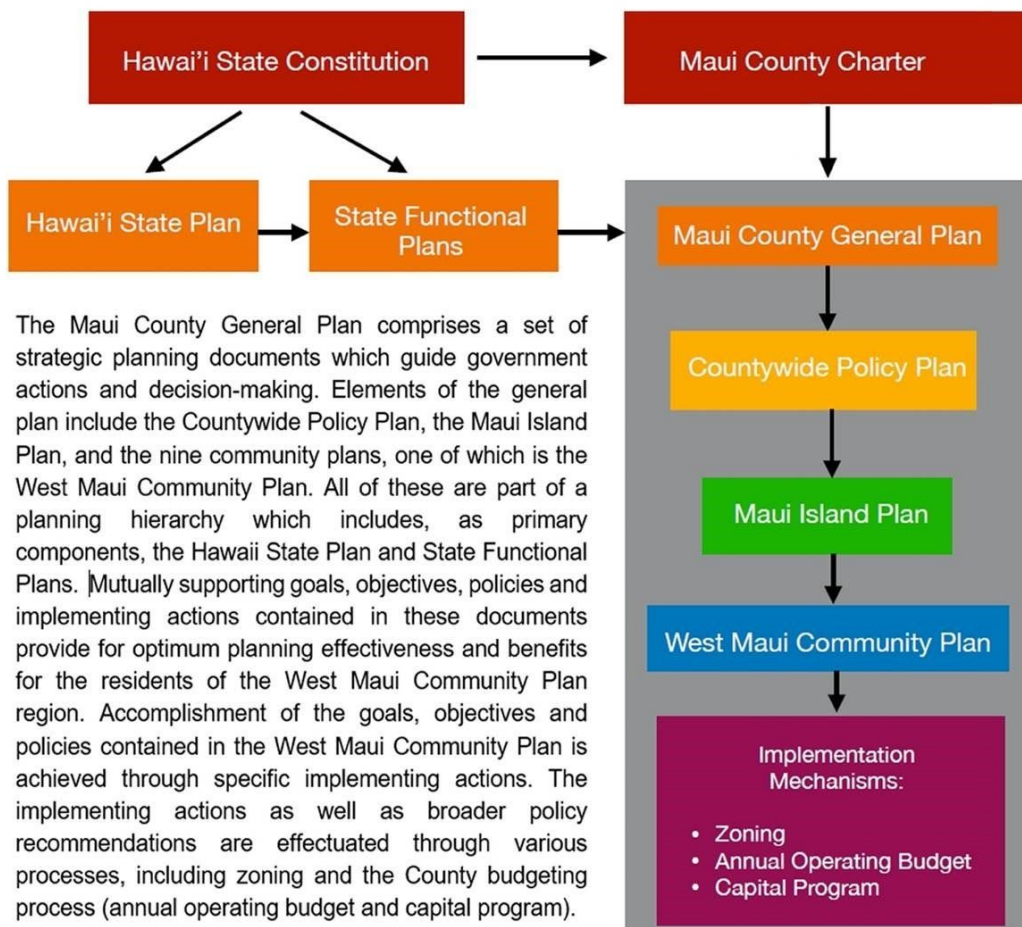


Section 1 CM KRF Amendments 2.4.21

- 1) Strike the word “guide(s)” and replace it with the word “direct(s)”
 - Page 10- Bottom of page (2 times in the last paragraph)
 - Page 11- Top of page (1 time on in the first paragraph)
- 2) Amend “West Maui Mountains” to Mauna Kahalawai and Pu’u Kukui on page 10. Add translation of Lāhainā.
- 3) Replace Figure 1.1: Maui County General Plan Structure with the Figure below
 - Page 11- middle of the page



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- 4) Replace the photo on page 13, or replace the name “TourMaui.com” with the name of the individual that provided the photo
 - Page 13- middle of the page
- 5) Amend “western” contact to “European” contact on page 13
- 6) Explain who Pi’ilani was on page 13
- 7) Kahakō over the last ā in Haleakalā on page 13
- 8) Amend to Kanahā on page 14
- 9) Amend “western” contact to “European” contact on page 14
- 10) Loko i’a (fishponds) on page 14
- 11) Nearshore is one word on page 14
- 12) Water that flowed into the lo’i kalo were diverted back into the stream before entering the ocean below on page 14
- 13) Following the passage of the Resident Alien Act of July 10, 1850, plantations could purchase land, on page 17.
- 14) Also adding the language: “The idea of owning the ‘āina (land) was nearly impossible for Hawaiians to accept as practicable. In Hawaiian society, individuals did not own land. The land belonged to the akua (gods), controlled by the mō‘ī (monarch) and ali‘i nui (high chiefs), and managed by the konohiki (lesser chiefs). The maka‘āinana worked on the land to produce abundance of food which was shared.”

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- 15) Comma after “with it,” on page 17
- 16) Amend “western” businesses to “non-Hawaiian” on page 17
- 17) Amend “acquire” land to “stole” the land of Hawaiian residents on page 17
- 18) Replace the photo on page 18, and/or amend the description with the name of the individual that provided the photo only, removing “Flicker.com Creative Commons”
 - Page 18- bottom of the page
- 19) Below-ground should have a hyphen on page 18
- 20) Add “Ka Mō‘ī, Kauikeauoli, Kamehameha III on page 18
- 21) Amend “western” to American or European on page 18
- 22) Capitalize town in Lāhainā Town on page 18
- 23) Delete the word “site”, unless the term “site” in “Heiau site” refers to the extended complex, on page 18
- 24) Amend “pre-contact” sand dune to kānaka or wā kahiko on page 18.

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- 25) By mid-1900s, “the government” shifted the economy to one based on tourism right before the sharp decline of sugarcane and pineapple on page 19.
- 26) Tourism became the main economic driver, most influential industry, on page 19. There is no acknowledgment of the real estate industry’s role. Tourism became the feeder industry to the true lead economy, real estate.
- 27) After representing to residents that tourism would remain in two confined areas, tourism sprawl was then permitted extensively throughout West Maui on page 19.
- 28) Tourism “has had an impact on West Maui,”. Replace with “substantially altered West Maui in every way” on page 19.
- 29) In the “West Maui Yesterday” section, people who were here for two centuries (Hawaiians) are referenced on only two pages, while the new arrivals (Missionaries) are referenced with 80% representation throughout the section. This section requires a major overhaul.
- 30) Second largest employment center [on Maui, in the State]. Need to complete that sentence. Page 19. Says “in Maui” on page 21
- 31) On page 21, this sentence needs to be strengthened: “ This Plan attempts to address the following issues with the policies and actions included in this Plan:”
- 32) I thought South Maui had the fastest growing population? Page 21. Check for accuracy.
- 33) Housing inventory did not keep pace with demand.....for residents? Should expound honestly as to the reason why. Page 21

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- 34) Remove the word “local” before “residents”
- Page 22, paragraph 4, first sentence under “HOW WILL WEST MAUI MANAGE TRAFFIC
- 35) The shortage of AH, the failure of requiring the resorts to build the housing they were required to build, AND low paying jobs on page 22
- 36) Traffic also has an impact on the environment, not just the economy. Page 22
- 37) Strike the word “guide” and replace it with the word “direct”
- Page 24- middle of page (1 time, under WEST MAUI TOMORROW section)
- 38) Amend the description with the name of the individual that provided the photo only, removing “Flicker.com Creative Commons”
- Page 26- bottom of the page
- 39) Page 33. And gathering limu
