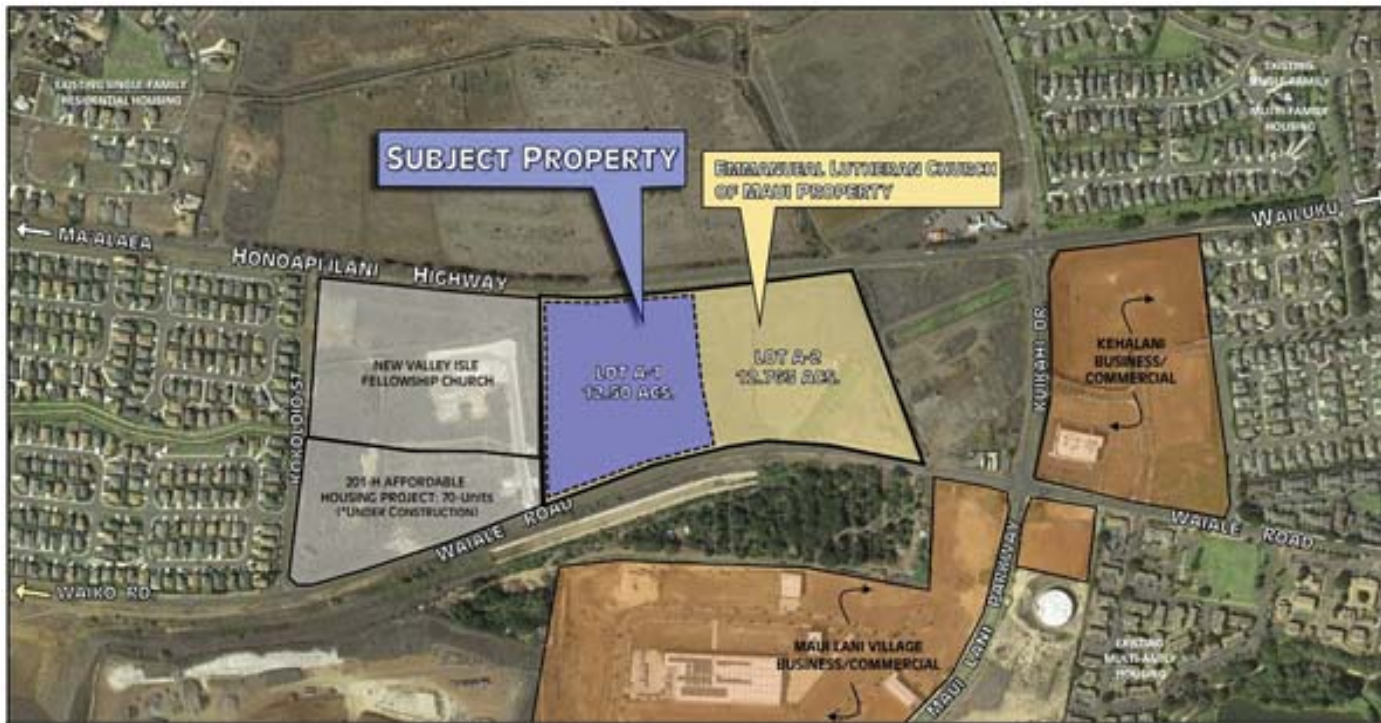

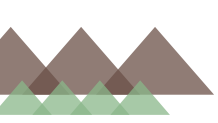

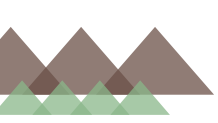


Typical Street Types

Type: Collectors | Class: Major Collector

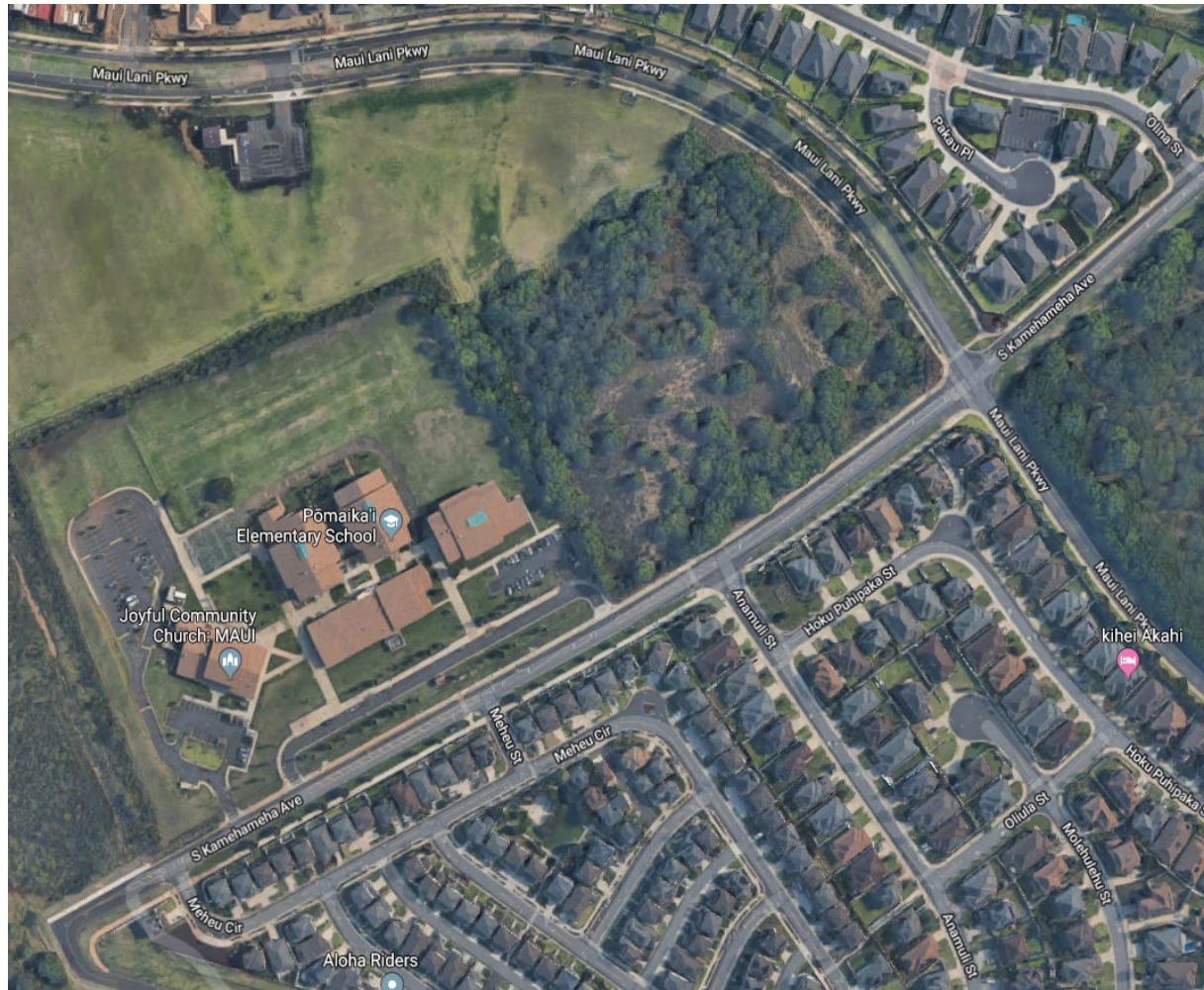


Next step: Zoning Code Update



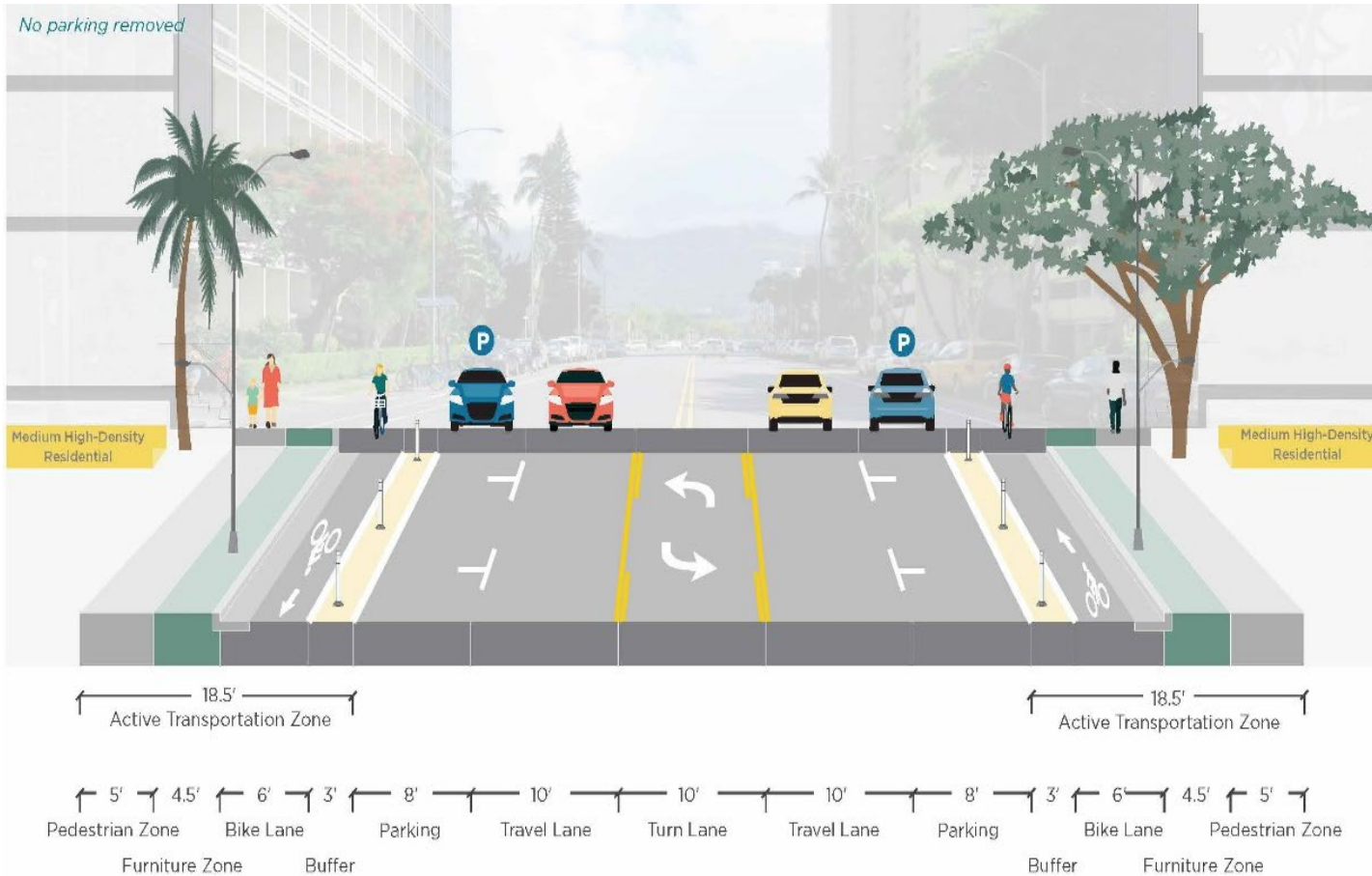
- Zoning Code defines land uses
- Planning Department to lead update
- Audit recommendations
 - Multimodal mobility standards
 - Prioritize pedestrian movement
 - Require connectivity of street network
 - Reevaluate parking standards
 - Low impact design for stormwater

Next step: Subdivision Code Update



- Subdivision code defines improvements required of new development
- Department of Public Works to lead update
- Key changes needed
 - Connectivity requirements
 - Reduce block lengths
 - More design flexibility
 - Update sidewalk standards

Next step: Complete Streets Ordinance



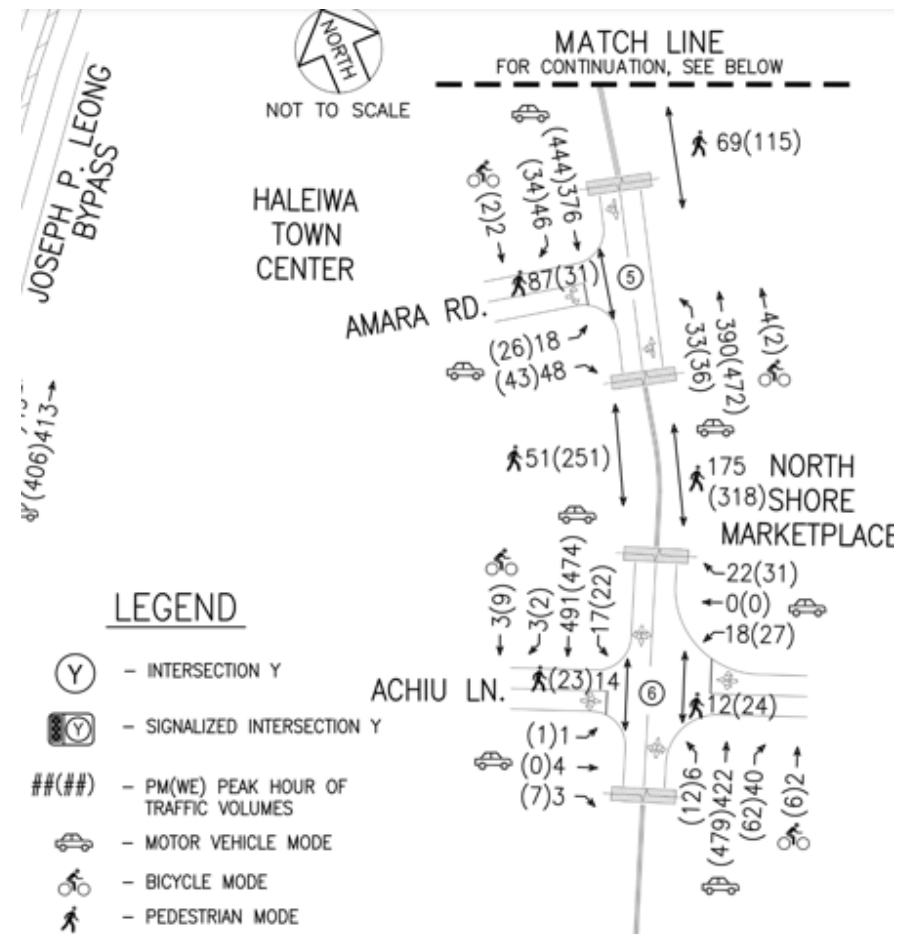
- 2012 Complete Streets Resolution
- 2018 Street Design Manual moves toward implementation
- Next step: Complete Streets Ordinance would provide additional strength to support multimodal improvements

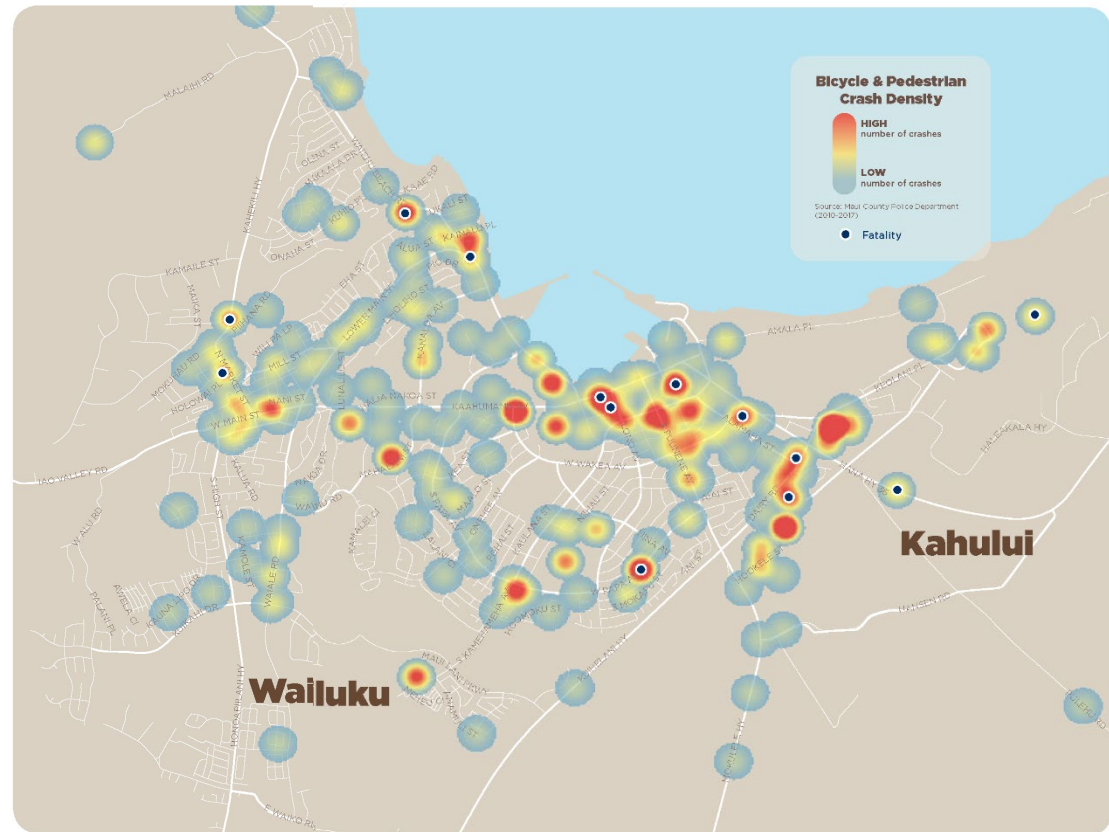
Next step: Traffic Impact Analysis Reports

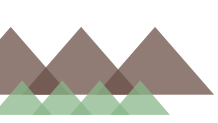
- Require multimodal improvements

- Initiate updates to County Subdivision Code and Zoning Code
- Engage diverse community voices through Vision Zero
- Develop scope of TOD Corridor Study (TOD)
- Establish framework to collaborate
