

SUBJECT: NSIP AWARD FOR FFY 2020

The Executive Office on Aging received its first allotment for FFY 2020 Nutrition Services Incentive Program (NSIP) grant award in the amount of \$69,423 which was received on October 23, 2019. The distribution of these funds is based on the number of meals provided in the state FY 2019.

This award represents the FFY 2020 funding under the current Continuing Resolution (PL 109-365) that is effective through September 30, 2020. In accordance with Section 311 of the Older Americans Act, as amended, the purpose of this award is to provide incentives to encourage and reward effective performance by State and Tribal organizations in the efficient delivery of nutritious meals to older adults. The FFY 2020 NSIP grant award is based on Hawaii's percentage of the total of FY 2019 meals in relationship to the national total number of meals served by all States and Tribal organizations.

As a reminder NSIP provides additional funding to State, Territories, and eligible Tribal organizations that is used exclusively to purchase food, not meal preparation and may not be used to pay for other nutrition related services such as nutrition counseling or education of for State or local administrative costs.

The distribution table on the following page reflects the number of NSIP eligible congregate and home delivered meals per county from FY 2019. The total meals served statewide are used to calculate your percentage. The fund award allocated per county are based on that percentage.
