Proposer: Tom Cook, Councilmember.

Description: Expands the proposed amendment relating to transient vacation rentals, which would create Code

Subsection 19.500.110(G), as follows:

• Insert two sentences, as shown in boldface below, to establish that nonconforming transient accommodations occupied by the owner may still qualify to resume the nonconforming use under Subsection E.

• Delete the extraneous second comma in Subsection G's first sentence.

Motion: Move to amend Bill 105 (2024) by inserting Subsection 19.500.110(G) to read as follows:

"G. Nonconforming transient vacation rental uses; exception. Notwithstanding subsection E, nonconforming transient vacation rental uses that were discontinued for 12 consecutive months or more because the transient vacation rental was within a structure that was damaged or destroyed in an emergency or disaster may not be resumed. This subsection does not apply to nonconforming transient accommodations occupied by the owner. For purposes of this subsection, "transient accommodations" has the same meaning as in section 237D-1, Hawai'i Revised Statutes."

Reasons:

This amendment is intended to address certain concerns raised at the February 5, 2025, Committee meeting, on the breadth of the proposed transient vacation rental amendment.

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
