The following information relating to the renovation of the Molokai police cottage is in response to your letter of June 3, 2016.

In May 2016, Captain Clyde Holokai and CIP Coordinator Baron Sumida traveled to Molokai in order to do a preliminary assessment of the Molokai cottages in question. Their assessment found that the renovation was not as extensive as first thought.

In June 2016, Ron Fuchs of Construction Services of Maui also traveled to Molokai to conduct a detailed assessment in order to properly prepare for the renovations necessary. As of this writing, we are estimating the budget for the renovations will be at least \$75,000.00.

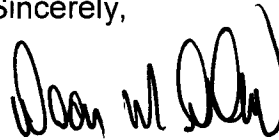
