Sir, this To/From is being submitted in response to the Budget and Finance Committee meeting held on Tuesday, September 19, 2017 regarding a Memorandum of Agreement with the State of Hawaii, Department of Health, to enforce state laws prohibiting the sale of tobacco and electronic smoking devices to persons under the age of twenty-one.

On Monday, September 25, 2017, I had received a letter from the County Council dated September 21, 2017 to respond to the following as indicated below in bold.


