Thank you for your correspondence of March 21, 2024. The information requested in your letter is listed below in bold and is followed by the Department's responses.

 - Explain any budget changes made because of the August 2023 wildfires.

The Department of Human Concerns' proposed FY25 budget did not undergo significant changes due to the August wildfire. We will continue to assess our needs and our responses to the community's needs in this first year post-fire.

The most significant change to the budget for FY25 is the bifurcation of the Department of Housing and Human Concerns into a new Department of Housing and a new Department of Human Concerns. The proposed FY25 budgets for both Departments reflect the bifurcation of respective responsibilities. The Administration's budget proposals were crafted to maintain current staffing and services, while providing flexibility in developing strategies and mechanisms to improve our operations and ability to serve the community. And while the Senior Services Division's operations will remain the same (unchanged), potential savings from the operating expenses of the West Maui Senior Center lost in the fire, may be offset by the cost of providing services at alternate West Maui locations.

How many vacant positions currently exist within DHHC and will be budgeted for DHC in the FY 2025 Budget?

There are currently 30 vacant positions in DHHC that will be transferred to the Department of Human Concerns. Twenty-seven of the thirty positions are budgeted in FY 2025 as indicated below:

There are various Hawaii Revised Statues related to animal management and animal control that are implemented by the County. There are no State funds provided to DHHC for animal management or animal control programs. In FY25, \$3,399,000 is allocated for animal management. This includes \$1,061,000 in general funds and \$60,000 from the animal management revolving fund for the purposes of humane animal enforcement. Without grant funding to the Maui Humane Society for animal enforcement, responsibility for mandated services will fall to the Maui Police Department.
