#### **TESTIMONY PROCEDURES**

Oral testimony on any agenda item will be accepted at the beginning of the meeting and prior to Council's deliberation on each section of the agenda. Testimony must pertain to items on the agenda. Each testifier shall be allowed to speak for up to three minutes on each item. The time limits for testimony may be modified, if the modification is initiated by the presiding officer and approved by a majority of the Council; provided that a modification would apply equally to all testifiers and all items. No further oral testimony by the testifier on the item shall be permitted. An individual's request to testify may be deemed withdrawn if the individual does not answer when called to testify. If the connection between any testifier and the video conference is lost, the meeting will still continue.

If a testifier wishes to testify anonymously, please indicate that request in the Bluejeans chat or with staff at the sign-up desk outside the Council Chamber. Anonymous testifiers will be assigned a number.

#### DECORUM

Any person who behaves in a manner that disrupts, disturbs, or impedes the orderly conduct of the Council meeting may, at the discretion of the presiding officer or a majority of present Councilmembers, be removed from the Council Chamber or, if participating remotely, muted or dropped from the meeting. Disruptive behavior includes, but is not limited to: heckling, shouting, use of profanity, and threatening remarks made to any member of the Council, staff, or general public.

## K. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

#### **Budget, Finance, and Economic Development Committee**

CR 23-101 Recommending FIRST READING of Bill 103, CD1 (2023) to 1) require the Director of Finance to seek the Department of Agriculture's assistance with verifying that lands dedicated to agricultural use comply with dedication requirements; and 2) allow for tax rate tiers for any real property classification.

#### CR 23-102 Recommending the following:

- 1. FIRST READING of Bill 95, CD1 (2023) to 1) exempt from real property taxation, including the minimum real property tax, properties completely destroyed by the August 2023 Maui wildfires through June 30, 2025; 2) exempt from real property taxation, including the minimum real property tax, properties classified as owner-occupied or long-term rental for the January 1, 2023 assessment located in a red or yellow reentry zone in Lahaina, as established by the County in its reentry map of impacted areas, or for which local access was only allowed from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., as of November 15, 2023, for the period July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024, and as determined by the Director of Finance as of January 1 for the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025; 3) conditionally allow all real property tax exemptions in effect for tax year 2024 on properties where improvements were destroyed, damaged, or made inaccessible by the wildfires to remain in effect through December 31, 2024; and 4) conditionally provide an exemption for real property occupied as a long-term rental and under signed contract to lease for six or more months and less than twelve consecutive months to the same tenant, who was displaced by the wildfires;
- 2. FILING of Bill 91 (2023) to amend Chapter 3.48, Maui County Code, to conditionally exempt properties destroyed or damaged by natural disasters on or after August 8, 2023, from real property taxation for one year beginning July 1, 2024; and
- **3. FILING** of Bill 102 (2023) to provide real property tax relief for individuals with property that was destroyed or damaged in the August 2023 Maui wildfires.

This bill proposes to amend the FY 2024 Budget to update the fiscal sponsor for Retree Hawai'i under both the Wailuku and West Maui Economic Development, Environmental, and Cultural Programs line items from "Lōkahi Pacific" to "Nā Koa Manu Conservation".

# Bill 97, CD1 (2023)

"A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2024 BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI, APPENDIX A, PART I, DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND HUMAN CONCERNS"

The purpose of this bill is to add a new grant under the Department of Housing and Human Concerns entitled "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 - Emergency Rental Assistance Program #2 (ERA #2)" in the amount of \$322,248.

# Bill 100, CD1 (2023)

"A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2024 BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI, APPENDIX A, PART I, DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT"

The purpose of this bill is to add a new grant under the Department of Management entitled "Office of Justice Programs Bureau of Justice Assistance - Byrne Discretionary Community Project Funding/Byrne Discretionary Grant Program" in the amount of \$180,000.

# Bill 101, CD1 (2023)

"A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2024 BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI, REVENUES AND DEPARTMENT OF POLICE, TECHNICAL AND SUPPORT SERVICES PROGRAM"

The purpose of this bill is to increase Carryover/Savings in the General Fund and Total Estimated Revenues by \$1,300,000 and by increasing the Department of Police, Technical and Support Services Program, and Total Appropriations (Operating and Capital Improvement Projects) by \$1,300,000.

# Bill 104, FD1 (2023)

"A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3.100.040, MAUI COUNTY CODE, ON USE OF THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX FUND"

The purpose of this bill is to require that private recipients allow the County to audit their financial records.

# Bill 111 (2023)

"A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3.100, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE AND USE TAX SURCHARGE"

The purpose of this bill is to allocate 80 percent of all funds received from the general excise tax and use surcharge to the general excise tax fund; 2) establish a new Section 3.100.021 entitled "General excise tax fund - Department of Hawaiian Home Lands" and allocating 20 percent of all funds received from the general excise tax and use surcharge; and 3) amend Section 3.100.040, Maui County Code to delete Subsection (C), and add the general excise tax fund - Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to the final section.

# Bill 115, FD1 (2023)

"A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3.38.020, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO HAWAIIAN CULTURAL RESTORATION REVOLVING FUND"

The purpose of this bill is to add Pākalā (including Kamehameha Iki Park) to the list of historic and cultural sites eligible for preservation and restoration under the Hawaiian Cultural Restoration Revolving Fund.

Bill 118, FD1 (2023)

"A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI TO ENTER INTO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT AND THE STATE OF HAWAII REGARDING THE AUTHORIZATION FOR MAUI WILDFIRE DEBRIS REMOVAL FOR COUNTY-OWNED PROPERTIES"
