




## **Loss of Businesses**



The wildfires reduced Maui's population by ~1,000 residents: 160-200 moved within State, 430-510 left the State


Out-of-State Outmigration Rate by Area


# **Outmigration: Labor Force**








#### **Job Change by Industry, 2023**




Jobs in tourism-related industries have improved in 2025


## **Decline in Tourism: Visitor Arrivals**









# Unemployment


Employment in Maui County, especially in West Maui, is highly vulnerable to tourism shocks

## **Decline in Tourism: Visitor Arrivals**


Visitor arrivals to Maui Island saw major declines, slow to recover; cascading effects



## **Job Losses**


Job losses correlate with the reduction in labor force and employment
