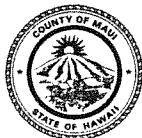

SUBJECT: **FISCAL YEAR ("FY") 2020 BUDGET** (PD-4) (EDB-1)

May I please request you respond to the following:

1. Relating to CBS-5535, Wailuku Station Improvements (Program Budget, page 778), no.1:
  - a. Wailuku Police Station parking lot repaving was referenced previously in the Countywide Police Facilities project (CBS-1010) for FY 2017, totaling \$940,000. Also included in CBS-1010 were renovations to the Wailuku Police Dispatch Center and the purchase and installation of a medical waste incinerator for the proper disposal of narcotics. How much of those CBS-1010 funds were expended on repaving the parking lot and what exactly was done under that particular portion of the project?
  - b. How will parking for the station be accommodated while the project is ongoing?
  - c. How will the Monkey Pod trees and roots be impacted by the proposed resurfacing?
2. Relating to CBS-5535, Wailuku Station Improvements, no.2:
  - a. Which other police stations currently operate automated car wash systems?
  - b. Approximately how many times is the automated car wash used per day at the Wailuku Station?

- c. Is the automated car wash restricted to official police vehicles only? If other uses are allowed, for whom and under what circumstances?
3. Relating to CBS-5536, Molokai Police Station (Program Budget, page 780):
- a. Are there currently any proposed viable sites for the relocation and what is their location, lot size, and ownership status?
  - b. Please provide a comprehensive list of criteria for the selection of a new site, including required lot size, access to roads, impact on response times to main service areas and remote service areas.
  - c. What are the proposed plans for the structure(s) on the current site once the station has been relocated?
  - d. In conjunction with CBS-4617, Pukoo Fire Station Relocation, what are the feasibility and main advantages and disadvantages of a joint facility or service compound for both the Department of Police and the Department of Fire and Public Safety?
  - e. Please identify any other police stations or Department auxiliary buildings that are currently located in flood or tsunami zones.
  - f. In addition to the \$1,420,000 for land acquisition requested for this project in FY 2020, there are additional funding requests for acquisition of \$2,250,000 in FY 2021 and \$12,750,000 in FY 2022 (Program Budget, page 780). Please explain the breakdown of these estimated costs.

May I further request you transmit the information by **April 10, 2019**, to enable the Committee to discuss your responses while deliberating the FY 2020 Budget.
