May I request you respond to the following:

- 1. In your attached response to BD-3, dated March 24, 2017, you provided a breakdown of the estimated change in revenues in excess of \$1.4 million and a footnote that reads, "All other proposed changes were minor and were not included in estimated revenues." Provide an itemized list of all proposed changes in estimated revenues, by department, by fee, even if deemed "minor" by your Office.
- 2. The Director of Public Works informed the Committee of an anticipated reduction to Highway Fund revenues and the burden the reduction will place on County road and infrastructure projects. Public transportation, such as the Maui Bus, is heavily subsidized by the Highway Fund. The short-range transit plan is complete.
  - Please explain the rationale for not including an increase to bus fares for FY 2018 while proposing increases to hours of operation and an expanded route for Waihee.
- 3. Provide the estimated revenues recognized in the FY 2018 Budget as it relates to all fees for the Department of Environmental Management, General Fund.

May I further request you transmit your response **no later than** *April 17, 2017*, to enable the Committee to comprehensively review the FY 2018 Budget. To ensure efficient processing, please duplicate the coding in the subject line above for easy reference.
