**RE: FISCAL YEAR ("FY") BUDGET (PD-1) (BF-1)**

Dear Chair Hokama:

Thank you for the opportunity to respond to your questions. In reference to your letter dated April 2, 2018, I am providing the following information in response to your questions:

1. The Department is requesting the replacement of 15 vehicles, including sedans, SUVs, and a van, for various programs.

a. Provide a prioritized list of these replacement vehicles, by program.

*The Department's vehicle prioritization is attached.*

b. Provide a copy of the Department's replacement vehicle policy and schedule.

*The Maui Police Department's vehicle replacement policy is attached.*

c. Explain what happens to the old vehicles when they are replaced? Are they sold, or does the Department receive a trade-in credit? On the average, what is the amount of trade-in credit received per vehicle? Does the cost per unit price reflect an approximate trade-in credit the Department could receive?

*Submitted by Police Chief*

*Vehicles are normally traded in to the dealer, and whatever price they give for each trade in vehicle is deducted from the total purchase of the new units. The Department averages around \$300.00 each trade-in vehicle.*

d. Explain what happens with the equipment from the old vehicles. Can it be installed on the new vehicles?

*For equipment, the two way radios are reused and the light bars, sirens, spot lights are kept for spare parts. The prisoner transport seats are thrown away as they are plastic and brittle. The prisoner partitions were also reused but when the Department transitioned from the Crown Vics to the Caprice they did not fit anymore.*

*The vehicles MDC/computer system laptop is redeployed into the new vehicle, the dock mounts are kept for spare parts, and the antennae is disposed of. The Department ensures that the equipment and parts that are able to be used can, while other parts are vehicle specific or are not in a sufficient condition to reuse.*

2. Provide copies of the latest Standard of Conduct Differential (SOC D) schedule, uniform allowance schedule, and firearms schedule, including any supplemental agreement for Chief and Deputy Chief.

*The Standard of Conduct Differential remains the same at \$694.00 per month. The uniform allowance also remains the same at \$300 per fiscal year. The firearms allowance increased with the new 2017-2021 SHOPO contract from \$500 per fiscal year to \$1,000 per fiscal year.*

3. As it relates to page 15-56 of the Budget Details, the Department is requesting an expansion of 6.0 Police Officer II positions (SR-7L1):

a. Provide a justification for these positions. How is the work currently being performed?

*The six positions being requested would increase the amount of officers per shift from 11 to 12 officers. This extra beat would be used Upcountry to equalize manpower distribution throughout the sectors.*

b. Why are the expansion positions requested at Police Officer II, SR-7L1 and not at an entry level step?

*The positions listed should be at a PO-07A entry level, this annual base salary range at the PO-07A range is \$65,592, plus \$7,908 for SOC D, for a total of \$73,500.*

c. What is the anticipated timeframe to fill these positions?

*The anticipated timeframe to fill these positions will be November 2018.*

d. Are the salaries noted in the Budget for a full year?

*The salary budgeted should be for 8 months based on the estimated timeframe to fill the position. With the position as a PO-07A, the budgeted amount should be \$49,000.*

e. Has the Department already worked with the Department of Personnel Services and the respective unions, as necessary, to establish these positions?

*The Administration has been in communication with the Maui SHOPO union representative regarding the budget and the expansion positions. If approved, official communication will be routed and vetted through the respective unions and DPS.*

f. Provide a list of current vacancies in the Department, by position title, program, and salary. Include the following information: date the position became vacant, recruitment efforts by the Department to fill the position, and the anticipated date of hire.

*The Maui Police Department's vacancy list is attached.*

4. Explain the increase in funding needed for training and conferences for certifications and licenses (index code 910018B, pages 15-9 and 15-10 of the Budget Details).

a. Is the increase in funding attributed to a greater number of training and conferences, an increased number of staff attending, or the higher costs of attending them?

*The increase in funding is based on FY19 projections requested by sections for personnel to attend to maintain required licensing and certifications required for their respective field, and in addition, consistent with past actual costs. There are multiple trainings that are reimbursed by grants for specific specialties and that are in line with the grant specifications.*

b. How many training and conference sessions are being planned for the fiscal year? What will they cover, where are they being held, and how often?

*There are multiple training and conferences held throughout the year with the locations varying depending on where the training is being offered or the conference hosted. The Department makes every attempt to attend training and*

*conferences offered as locally as possible, but must also be able to comply with maintaining certifications and licensing that also provide credibility when testifying in court. Some of the training will cover Cell Phone Technology and Forensic Data Recovery Certification, Sexual Assault Investigation Training, National Association of School Resource Officers, Advanced Crisis Negotiations, and K9 Tracking, just to name a few.*

c. How many personnel are expected to attend these training and conference sessions? Are the training and conference costs for expansion positions included?

*The Department tries to send the minimum amount of personnel needed and follows a train-the-trainer concept in that those attending training are aware that their acquired knowledge through training will be used to train other Department personnel. Training costs were not included for the expansion positions, however, officers and personnel in specialized positions are required to attend job-specific training in order to gain the expertise and certifications for their position. Some of these areas include Vice, Traffic, Forensics, Cyber, K9, Juvenile, Domestic Violence.*

5. Provide an itemized breakdown relating to a \$49,050 increase in Professional Services for increased hazardous waste disposal and forensic licensing (index code 910059B, page 15-29 of the Budget Details).

*With the Crime Lab in the Criminal Investigation Division and with the Criminalist completing her certifications for independent analysis, these increased costs are for equipment maintenance and certifications for Calibration of Certified Weights \$2,000; GC/MS Service Contract \$9,500; FTIR Service contract \$4,500; Analytical Balance Servicing \$800; Fume Hood Testing \$250; and Hazardous waste disposal for crime lab chemicals and specimen \$8,000; and \$10,000 for license renewals for Cellebrite, XRY, and BCERT within the forensics program. These costs total \$35,000. I humbly request that the expansion amount of \$49,050 therefore be adjusted to reflect this reduced amount, and apologize for the discrepancy.*

6. Provide an itemized breakdown relating to the \$600,000 for Professional Services (index code 910422B, page 15-32 of the Budget Details).

*Since the beginning of FY18, the costs for this area include approximately \$4,500 in Investigative costs for dental identification, bank records, and cell phone records; \$25,000 for Sex Assault Exams and Sex Assault Kit Testing; \$10,000 for Hawaii Bio-Waste, Medical Waster Trash Bin; \$17,000 for Pan Pacific Pathologist for death determinations, \$58,000 for transportation of bodies; and \$400,000 for autopsies.*

7. Explain the funding request for \$11,750 for medical & safety supplies (index code 910 166B, page 15-96 of the Budget Details).

a. Is this a one-time use spray? If not, how long should this supply last, if funded? Are there special storage needs anticipated?

*The nasal NARCAN spray is a one-time spray with a 2-year shelf life and with no special storage needs required.*

b. Will staff receive training on how to properly use this equipment? Are training costs included in the Budget?

*Training will be provided by the Community Health Outreach Work (CHOW) project. The Department will have at least one officer from each District attend the training and then for that officer to train the other personnel within their district.*

8. Explain the funding request for R&M – Services/Contracts totaling \$186,000 (index code 91066B, page 15-96 of the Budget Details).

a. Is the additional \$160,000 needed for data storage for the 125 body cameras the Department already has, or additional storage for the 40 body cameras being requested?

*The \$160,000 for the data storage is for body cameras the Department already has. The additional \$60,000 requested for the additional 40 cameras includes the data storage and maintenance of those cameras in its cost.*

b. How often will the data be uploaded and stored? Who will be responsible for uploading, storing, and maintaining the data?

*The data is downloaded daily by the patrol officers at the end of their shifts. We have requested a position expansion for a Police Evidence Equipment Technician to upload, store, and maintain the data. This position would include the downloading of the camera footage, training members on the proper use, evaluating and reporting on its effectiveness, researching and maintaining audio and video recordings, keeping inventory and maintenance/replacement records, training law enforcement on proper use and legal compliance. However, currently, the Plans and Training Lieutenant and Sergeant are responsible for these functions.*

9. Explain the equipment requests for the Radio Shop (index code 910182C, page 15-102 of the Budget Details).

a. Provide information on the upgrade of the Public Safety Radio System Key Management Facility at a cost of \$70,000.

*The Key Management Facility Upgrade for the Public Safety Radio System is a license expansion to increase the number of licensed users from our current maximum of 1,000 to the system maximum of 64,000. This is a two-tier option on the system, and we have more than 1,000 users under the current MPD deployment. The upgrade allows us to manage the entire fleet to keep our encryption keys in both the subscriber radios as well as the Dispatch consoles. It also allows for the future deployment of encryption to other system users as needed.*

1. Which facility is the work being planned for?

*The upgrade of the Key Management Facility will be accomplished in the primary PSRS Zone Core at the Wailuku Police Station and at the Pu'umahoe Dynamic System Resiliency (backup) PSRS Zone Core.*

2. What type of work is needed and why is it necessary? Who will perform the work and how long is it anticipated to take?

*The work required is the input of the Motorola system license to expand the Key Management Facility user database. It will be accomplished by Motorola and their local provider, Scientel Solutions, and should be accomplished within a day at each site.*

b. Provide information on the \$179,500 request for a MCC7500 dispatch console.

*The additional MCC7500 Dispatch Console is requested for the Wailuku Police Station Dispatch Center. This additional OP position will allow for Dispatch operations to expand as emergency communications with field units surge due to unforeseen events in the community. Currently there are only enough MCC7500 positions to handle the current communications requirements for current operations. The requested MCC7500 will allow for an additional Dispatcher to handle radio calls supporting emergency or special operations in the various Districts. An additional benefit is the reduced impact to ongoing Dispatch operations should one of the other positions require maintenance or repair.*

10. Provide a summary of criminal activity statistics for Maui County. Include by district, and type of activity that occurred per month for FY2017, and FY2018, to date.

*The requested statistics requested is attached.*

VEHICLE REPLACEMENT  
S.O.P. 104.1

I. PURPOSE

To establish guidelines for the replacement of Departmental vehicles.

II. POLICY

Officer and employee safety remains a paramount concern with the Maui Police Department. In providing basic police service to the citizens of Maui County, Police Officers are required to patrol and respond to incidents. The vehicles utilized by the patrol function are required to perform strenuous duties for prolonged periods of time. Maintaining a fleet of police vehicles that are reliable with minimum downtime is essential in the delivery of police services. It is the policy of the Maui Police Department to replace vehicles according to this directive.

III. MINIMUM SPECIFICATIONS

- A. The minimum specifications for Departmental vehicles will be determined by the requesting element.
- B. Patrol fleet vehicles shall be four door, full size sedans. Patrol fleet vehicles shall be equipped with the special police packages manufactured exclusively for use in law enforcement. Marked 4x4 patrol wagons are utilized in lieu of patrol vehicles in certain circumstances and shall be considered patrol fleet vehicles for the purposes of replacements.
- C. These high-performance, emergency vehicles have "special features" which include the following;
  - 1. Engine, transmission, power train and axle
  - 2. Chassis, frame mounts, suspension & brake system
  - 3. Cooling and exhaust system
  - 4. Gauge instrumentation and calibrated speedometer
  - 5. Transistorized voltage regulator
  - 6. Wheels & speed rated tires
  - 7. Headlight wig-wag Flashers and halogen spotlight
  - 8. High pressure compressor cut-off air conditioning system
  - 9. Security wall partitions
  - 10. Mobile communication organizer
  - 11. Molded prisoner transport seat & restraining system
  - 12. Power windows & locks which are deactivated in the rear
  - 13. Power distribution box

Each vehicle is properly identified with police markings (except for traffic enforcement) and has a light bar assembly, siren, public address system and a mobile radio.

IV. REPLACEMENT CRITERIA

A. The fleet program requires the regular replacement of patrol fleet vehicles to ensure that the vehicles in use will provide the level of performance and operational efficiencies expected. The following are the minimum replacement criteria for patrol fleet vehicles;

1. Four years of service.
2. Ninety thousand (90,000) miles or more of service
3. Repair cost exceeds value of vehicle

**Exceptions:** Vehicles which are considered total wrecks due to collisions and vehicles with poor repair records and requiring major repairs are traded in earlier than scheduled. Vehicles with excellent repair records, no major repairs needed, and in good condition are retained longer than the four year period, regardless of mileage.

B. The unmarked fleet are vehicles that are assigned to Detectives/Officers in the Investigative Service Bureau and to certain supervisory/staff members of the Department. These vehicles usually are five passenger and full-sized, however, not necessarily the same size as the patrol sedans. Most of these vehicles have audible sirens and portable lights for emergency use. These vehicles do not perform routine patrol duty.


1. Nine years of service
2. Sixty thousand (60,000) miles or more of service
3. Repair cost exceeds value of vehicle

**Exceptions:** Vehicles which are considered total wrecks due to collisions and vehicles with poor repair records and requiring major repairs are traded in earlier than scheduled. Vehicles with excellent repair records, no major repairs needed, and in good condition are retained longer than the nine year period, regardless of mileage.

C. Other fleet vehicles may include GO IVs, Cushmans, All Terrain Vehicles (ATVs), Pickup Trucks, and vehicles utilized for special purposes not including normal patrol duties. Some of these vehicles may have audible sirens and portable lights for emergency use.

1. Nine years of service
2. Sixty thousand (60,000) miles or more of service
3. Repair cost exceeds value of vehicle

**Exceptions:** Vehicles which are considered total wrecks due to collisions and vehicles with poor repair records and requiring major repairs are traded in earlier than scheduled. Vehicles with excellent repair records, no major repairs needed, and in good condition are retained longer than the nine year period, regardless of mileage.
