Chair and Members:

Your Budget, Finance, and Economic Development Committee, having met on September 5, 2025, makes reference to Bill 99 (2025), entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2026 BUDGET, APPENDIX B, DEPARTMENT OF WATER SUPPLY, WATER FUND, PRESERVATION/RESTORATION RATE."

Bill 99's purpose is to amend the Fiscal Year 2026 Budget, Appendix B, Revenues – Fees, Rates, Assessments and Taxes, Department of Water Supply, Water Fund, by establishing a new rate, entitled "Preservation/Restoration Rate," for water used primarily for native Hawaiian species habitat preservation or restoration.

Your Committee notes that while Ordinance 5841 (2025) established the rate in the Maui County Code, a budget ordinance to amend Appendix B is necessary to effectuate the rate.

Your Committee is in receipt of a proposed CD1 version of Bill 99 (2025), entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2026 BUDGET, APPENDIX B, DEPARTMENT OF WATER SUPPLY, WATER FUND, PRESERVATION RATE," from the Budget Director.

The proposed CD1 version corrects the title of the rate to align with Ordinance 5841 and clarify Bill 99's effective date is retroactive to July 1, 2025.

Your Committee noted Bill 99, CD1, provides, for every 1,000 gallons, an all-usage rate of \$4.98, and water shortage rates of \$4.98, \$5.23, and \$5.49 for Stages 1 through 3, respectively.

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Your Committee discussed that water used for habitat preservation and restoration should not be charged at a higher rate than water used for agriculture because preservation and restoration serve important community and environmental purposes.

Your Committee agreed to further amend Bill 99 to incorporate a rate schedule that mirrors the existing agricultural rate. Under the amendment, for every 1,000 gallons, the preservation rate is set as follows:

Your Committee questioned the potential revenue impact of the new rate and discussed whether the number of qualifying customers would materially affect the County's revenues. The Director of Water Supply said the Department expects a limited number of customers to qualify, so the fiscal impact is anticipated to be minimal.

Your Committee also discussed whether the County has authority to establish a new water rate and whether Public Utilities Commission rules apply. The Director explained that government entities are not subject to regulation by the Public Utilities Commission.

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Your Committee voted 8-0 to recommend passage of Bill 99, CD1 (2025), on first reading. Committee Chair Sugimura, Vice-Chair Kama, and members Cook, Johnson, Paltin, Rawlins-Fernandez, Sinenci, and U'u-Hodgins voted "aye." Committee member Lee was excused.

Your Committee is in receipt of Bill 99, CD1 (2025), approved as to form and legality by the Department of the Corporation Counsel, incorporating your Committee's recommended revisions and nonsubstantive revisions.

Your Budget, Finance, and Economic Development Committee RECOMMENDS that Bill 99, CD1 (2025), attached, entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2026 BUDGET, APPENDIX B, DEPARTMENT OF WATER SUPPLY, WATER FUND, PRESERVATION RATE," be PASSED ON FIRST READING and be ORDERED TO PRINT.

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2026 BUDGET, APPENDIX B, DEPARTMENT OF WATER SUPPLY, WATER FUND, PRESERVATION RATE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 5816, as amended, "Fiscal Year 2026 Budget," Appendix B, Revenues – Fees, Rates, Assessments and Taxes, Department of Water Supply, Water Fund, is amended to add a new category, "Preservation Rate," following Non-dwelling Agricultural Rate, to read as follows:
