"12.40.320 Mapulehu Cultural Preserve. Mapulehu Cultural Preserve refers to the area identified as tax map key (2) 5-7-008:076 and located at 8303 Kamehameha V. Highway, Kaunakakai, Molokai, Hawai'i."

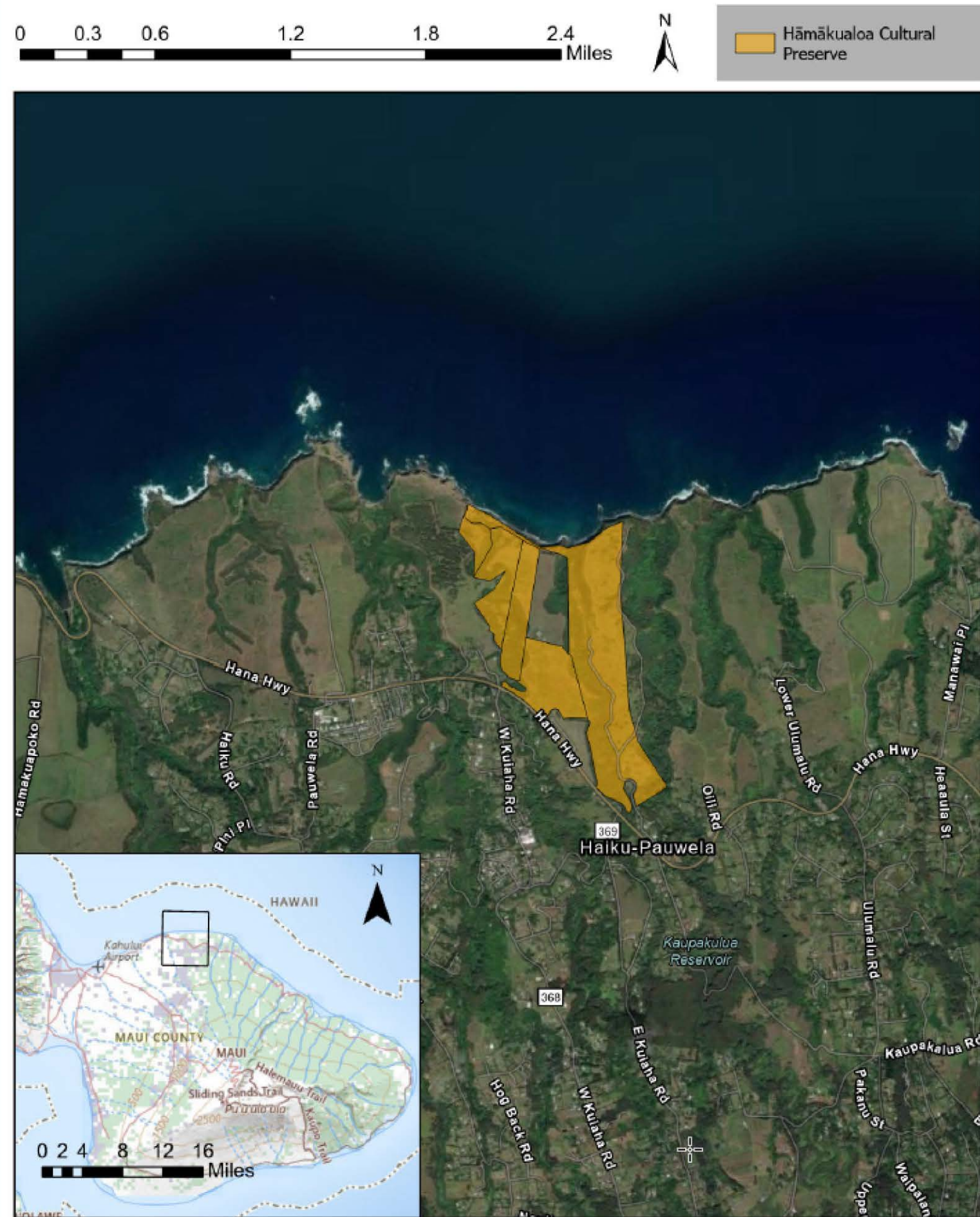

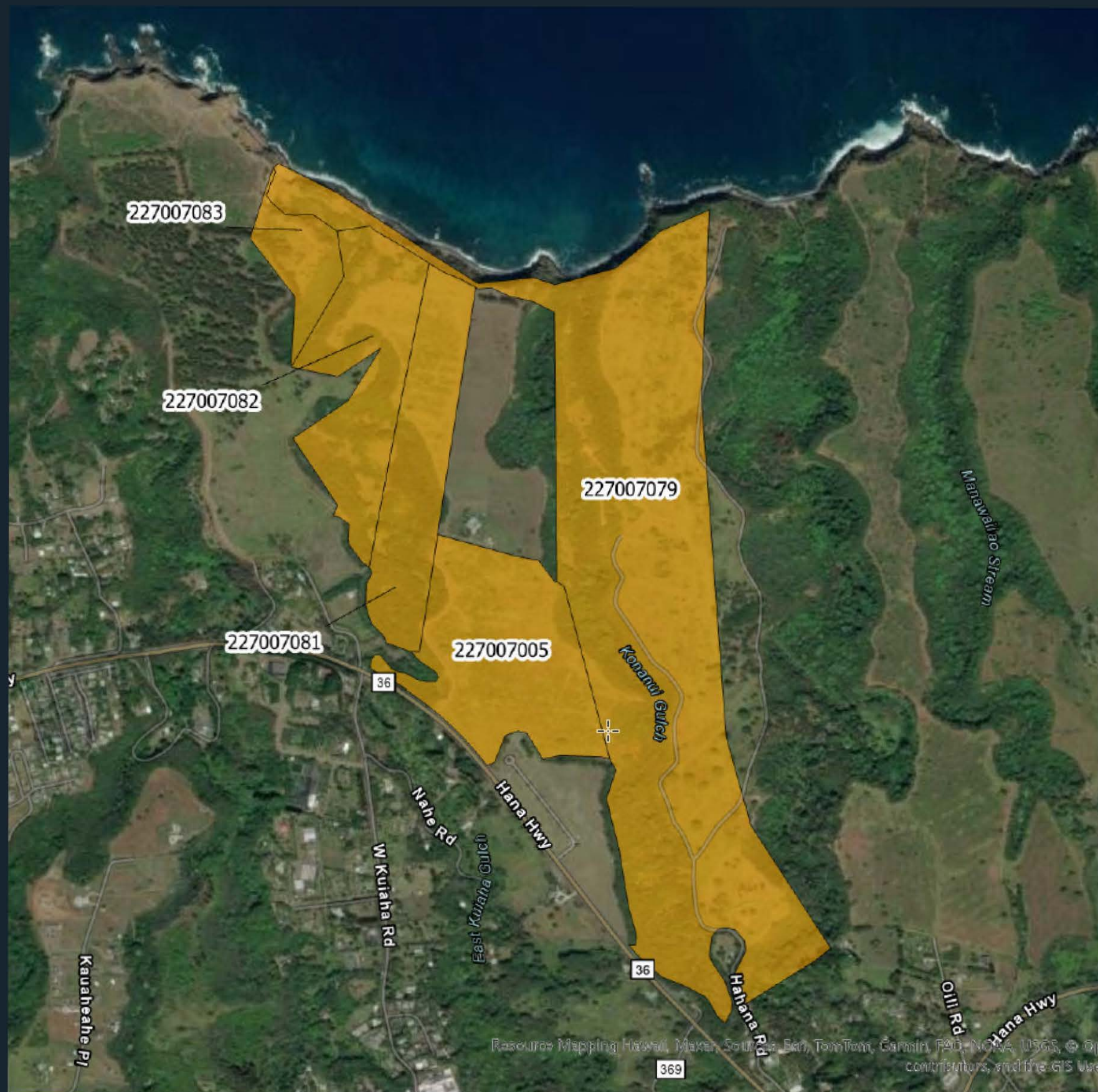
