Chair and Members:

Your Budget and Finance Committee, having met on February 27, 2018, makes reference to County Communication 18-50, from the Budget Director, transmitting a proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2018 BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI AS IT PERTAINS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION, RECREATION AND SUPPORT SERVICES PROGRAM."

The purpose of the proposed bill is to amend the Fiscal Year ("FY") 2018 Budget for the Department of Parks and Recreation, Section 3.B.10.c., by increasing the equivalent personnel for the Recreation and Support Services Program by 2.0. The additional equivalent personnel will assist in the management of operations and maintenance of County park facilities in the Central district.

The Director of Parks and Recreation said the Central district includes Kahului, Waihee, Wailuku, and Waikapu. He said the addition of the Maui Lani Regional Park, Kehalani Mauka Park, and Central Maui Regional Sports Complex has increased the responsibilities of the district.

The Deputy Director of Parks and Recreation said the Central district has more than double the number of employees, parks, and park facilities than any other district in the County. She said dividing the Central district into two components would allow for better management and maintenance.

The Deputy Director said the increase of laborer positions in recent years has outpaced management positions in the Department. She said managerial support is needed to address policy and procedure changes, workers' compensation and other legal issues, and personnel matters. The

two additional positions will address these issues and assist the Department with future growth.

Your Committee noted the Department could provide more recreational facilities to the public without increasing labor costs by forming public-private partnerships. The Deputy Director said stringent requirements set forth in bargaining union contracts and State law make executing partnerships difficult, but the Department considers them whenever feasible.

Your Committee notes the proposed bill would add two equivalent personnel, a central district supervisor and an office operations assistant. Authorizing two equivalent personnel in the FY 2018 Budget would allow for the creation and recruitment of the positions prior to the start of FY 2019. Although both positions are unfunded for FY 2018, the positions may be filled if sufficient funds are available.

Your Committee voted 9-0 to recommend passage of the proposed bill on first reading and filing of the communication. Committee Chair Hokama, Vice-Chair White, and members Atay, Carroll, Cochran, Crivello, Guzman, King, and Sugimura voted "aye."

Your Budget and Finance Committee RECOMMENDS the following:

- 1. That Bill _______ (2018), attached hereto, entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2018 BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI AS IT PERTAINS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION, RECREATION AND SUPPORT SERVICES PROGRAM," be PASSED ON FIRST READING and be ORDERED TO PRINT; and
