

Overall Sentiment







Many people are often tempted to discard their clothes simply because they lack sewing skills or don't have creative ideas for fixing them. Others may not have access to the proper tools, such as a sewing machine, to repair items properly. Jennifer's program helps address this issue by not only assisting with clothing repairs but also encouraging the repurposing of fabric-based household items.

Fabric waste is a far more significant issue than most realize. Without proper education and awareness, many people do not understand that their overconsumption can lead to problems of the same magnitude, or even greater. When I visit local thrift stores or even Goodwill, I often wonder if they can manage the volume of clothing donations they receive.

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

Dear Chair Sugimura nd Members of the Committee,

My name is Erin O'Kief, I am the Development Director at Hui No'eau Visual Arts Center. All of us at Hui No'eau are deeply grateful for the \$75,000 allocated to Hui No'eau's Youth & Family Arts Education Outreach Programs in the proposed FY26 Budget. Hui Youth Outreach Programs are now benefitting more than 14,000 Maui County keiki annually through a wide range of FREE arts programming delivered during school, after school at seven Elementary Schools, in accessible community spaces, and through partnerships with Ka Hale A Ke Ola Homeless Resource Centers, Lahaina Public Library, L_na'i Public & School Library, Moloka'i Arts Center, and many others schools and organizations across Maui County.

Engagement in the arts benefits the entire community. According to an American Academy of Arts & Sciences Report (2021), arts education programs build well-rounded individuals; broadens understanding and appreciation of other cultures and histories; supports social and emotional development; builds empathy, reduces intolerance, and generates acceptance of others; improves school engagement and culture; develops valuable life and career skills; and strengthens community and civic engagement. The report also states that art can offer ways to preserve cultural heritage by engaging marginalized populations whose histories and culture have been suppressed or forgotten. The arts also provide shared experiences in public spaces—a community connection that brings wellbeing and cohesiveness to all. According to a study by Americans for the Arts, 72% of Americans believe "the arts unify our communities regardless of age, race, and ethnicity.

We ask the Committee to please support Hui No'eau's Youth Outreach Programs in FY26. Your support will ensure continued, cost free access to these invaluable programs for Maui County keiki of all ages. I leave you with these testimonials from some of the Hui's community partners, teachers, and students who have benefitted from the program within the last year:

- Misty Bannister, Ka Hale A Ke Ola Homeless Resource Center Children's Services Coordinator shares: "Hui No'eau's amazing teaching artists have been the BEST with our children! They have become part of our children's lives and bring them so much joy. The children and I always look forward to our in person art days every week. Parents have also been enjoying time spent with their children in the groups as well, which promotes such healthy parents and child relationships and such precious moments of bonding."

- A teacher from Lahaina Intermediate School shares this after a recent field trip to the Hui: "It was so much fun to see them sculpt and paint and see some of the natural talents come up! Even if they didn't feel like it's "their thing" it was a healing and fun day away from school to learn important Aina based information and art skills. We're so grateful. We're also so grateful you found and covered our transportation. It really made us feel wanted and we appreciate the opportunity after such a hard year."

- Chelsea Trevino, Branch Manager at L_na'i Public & School Library shares: "[Hui No'eau's Art2Go Art] kits have become a mainstay for our library with parents calling and anticipating the arrival of the next kit. The partnership has been a blessing for our community at a time when prices on the island have increased substantially, especially for items such as art and craft supplies...."

A parent on L_na'i shares: "I just wanted to ask if you could bring more arts to our L_na'i keiki? Our keiki's love when you guys come here once a month at our L_na'i Library and share all the ways our kids can make art. From the jewelry making, to recycled items, to modeling clay, and so much more. They love it all, as well as the 'Art to Go' Kits. Mahalo Nui for all you've done for our L_na'i keiki."

A teacher from a recent Kahului Elementary School Field Trip shares: "The students loved using a variety of art medias to construct the i'iwi bird habitat and the model of the bird. Most of them have experience watercoloring but most of them have not used modeling clay to construct something. This was the highlight for most students. I thought it was great that the lesson was set around a native bird and gave not only the children awareness but also the adults about how we can help and appreciate the endangered animals of Hawaii."

- Sam Zender, Hui No'eau Youth Teaching Artist shares this about weekly art lessons taught at Ka Hale A Ke Ola Homeless Resource Centers: "Since I have been a part of this program, I have been a witness to the resilience of kids in the face of hardship and tragedy. This program is a

sanctuary from their "day-to-day" -- a place where they can come and explore making something that is their own, make a colorful mess, or just laugh because their hands are somehow covered in glitter. I have come to know the kids quite well. When conflict or misfortune happens to one family, emotions ripple throughout. Many times, I

come in and change what we are doing because the kids are responding to another family moving out. As I know they are feeling the loss of their friends, we can try and do something more lighthearted and fun. Other days, it is great to challenge them by trying a new skill. Speaking of skills, the kids have grown so much in the time I've known them! In the beginning, they would tell me, "I can't do that." "Do it for me". Now, the same kids can be counted on to share what they know with newer kids. Even when we are trying new things, I don't hear "I can't." They try it, knowing that we are there to help them figure out the hard parts. We did ribbon leis for Lei Day last year. It was such a triumph for the kids. They jumped in and asked me to demonstrate over and over and then they took off and were helping each other. One of the five year olds was sitting with one of the older kids. The younger boy was struggling to understand the rhythm of ribbon weaving and the older boy responded: "It's easy. It's just like going to the beach." I thought that was very cool so I asked him to explain what he meant. "Just like going to the beach. You watch the waves." I found this amazing as this child has often been impatient with projects that have a lot of steps or difficult details, so I loved that he found peace and quiet in ribbon weaving. I also had parents who were excited about the project so I found myself teaching adults who had never had a chance to learn even though it is a part of their culture. One mother was sharing pictures of leis created by her Tongan relatives and was inspired to want to learn how to make leis in her family's custom. When we started, a lot of these kids were struggling with basic motor skills and I am so proud of how much they have learned. Originally, we had to closely supervise when we were using scissors because the kids were unsure and awkward and often unsafe. They are now much more comfortable and proficient with scissors, markers and paint-brushes and this is sure to be of benefit in school. This self-assurance in their own abilities and a willingness to try new things is what I really hope they take with them."

Dear Chair Sugimura and Members of the Committee,

On behalf of the Maui Food Bank, I am very appreciative of the support that Maui County has provided over the years. We are incredibly appreciative of the ability to bring our funding back to \$400,000 for FY26 to support our efforts to nourish those in need.

Daily we are reminded of our important role as a safety net for our community. Just last month, a neighbor reached out to us in a desperate situation, in need of fresh produce. She suffers from acute kidney disease and relies solely on fresh fruits and vegetables for her diet. With no funds to buy groceries and unable to consume the canned goods provided by her local pantry, we stepped in to help. We assembled a box filled with locally grown, fresh produce, ensuring she had the nourishment she needed. This is a powerful example of how the County's funding can support the health and well-being of our community.

Who we are and who we serve

For 30 years, Maui Food Bank has provided daily and emergency assistance to those facing food insecurity in Maui County. Maui Food Bank distributes food to families and individuals on Maui, Molokai and Lanai through direct service programs and through our network of 170 agency partners. Last year, we served on average 44,000 people each month, distributing a total of 8.7 million pounds of nutritious food, including 2.3 million pounds of fresh produce. This includes people in need living in the rural communities of Hana, Molokai and Lanai. Of those served, 40% are children and youth.

Prior to the fires we spent \$1.5 million on food purchasing and distributed on average 250,000 pounds of food per month. Since the fires we are now spending \$6 million a year to source food and distribute an average of 700,000 pounds of food, of that 200,000 pounds is fresh produce. In relation to the above we used to only have 8-9 containers delivered a year, now we have almost eight containers a month.



Nourishing Lives, Feeding Futures

New facility, disaster preparedness

We are currently conducting strategic planning that will include a new, expanded facility to help us with serving the Maui County community. Right now, we have three warehouse spaces that are separated by miles and are not conducive to serving the community much less the next disaster in an efficient manner. Building a new facility will allow us to be better prepared for the next disaster and allow our staff to have greater efficiency in serving the overall community.

Commitment to the community

We have added a dignified shopping space in Lahaina called "Da Market" that allows families affected by the fires to shop at no cost. Fresh produce and protein are amongst the varied offerings. By May this year we will have two mobile distribution trucks that will go into neighborhoods with the greatest needs. Lastly, we are committed to providing fresh produce and protein as well as ethnic food selections for our families by working with our local farmers, ranchers and fishermen.

We have already seen the powerful impact of partnering with local farmers. Through our Fresh 4 All program, we purchase and pick up fresh produce from local farmers, wholesalers, and farmers' markets, reducing transportation and access barriers for families in need. Our 'Ai Holo program works with 15 local farmers to deliver weekly boxes of fresh produce, dairy, and proteins to low-income children and families in rural areas like Hāna, Moloka'i, and Lāna'i.

Fresh, healthy food should not be a luxury. Yet for too many families, the rising cost of living forces impossible choices between rent, utilities, medicine, and meals.

Safety Repairs Performed:

The existing tub and surround were badly damaged, with sections duct taped to cover holes, so they were replaced with a new shower pan, shower surround, and mold-resistant drywall. A partial re-roof was completed to address two active leaks—one over the shower and one in the kitchen—and damaged drywall in those areas was also replaced. Additionally, both the bathroom and kitchen sink cabinets were replaced due to severe rot, benefiting both homeowners by preventing future pest and mold issues.

The fiberglass shower enclosure and pan were demolished and replaced with a new shower pan, tiled walls, and updated plumbing fixtures as needed. A built-in seating area and three grab bars were also installed in the shower to enhance safety and accessibility.



Safety Repairs Performed:

A complete re-roof was performed to address a leak in the kitchen ceiling that began during an earthquake, after insurance assistance was denied due to prior damage. Grab bars were installed in the shower to provide better stability while bathing. A small section of drywall in the kitchen, where the tape had started to lift, was repaired. Additionally, the shower was waterproofed around the bottom to prevent further damage to the walls.

Higgins (Paia):

Safety Repairs Performed:

The deteriorating railing on the ramp to the home's entrance was replaced due to weather-related rot, as it was unsafe for the 71-year-old homeowner, who has increasing difficulty ambulating. While the ramp itself was in fair condition and did not require repairs, the railing was vital for stability, and its replacement ensured safer access for the homeowner and the two others with disabilities living in the home.

The roof of the home had started to detach, and the deck had holes due to weather damage. The exterior windows and doors also had leaks, and the master bathroom leaked due to missing grout. The rotted planks on the deck were replaced, the windows and doors were sealed with caulk, and the grout in the master bathroom was removed and replaced. Finally, the outside laundry/mud room was re-roofed. These improvements benefited the woman/applicant, her estranged husband, and two children living in the home.

Safety Repairs Performed:

The roof was repaired due to a leak, and the damaged ceiling was addressed. The sinking toilet was fixed by replacing the subfloor, and the leaking sink was repaired by replacing the supply lines. 




Auntie lived in her childhood home, which was over 90 years old and in much disrepair. The focus of the project was to create a usable kitchen for her, as her previous one was ripped out by her daughter and son-in-law, who took the materials and never returned. Auntie had been cooking outside in her open garage, exposed to the elements, especially the rain in Haiku. A new kitchen was built for her, providing a full, functioning space and ending her need to cook outside.



Feliciano (Makawao):

Safety Repairs Performed:


The roof over the bedroom and bathroom had significant damage and leaked, causing the ceiling to sag. The team applied tar and sealant over the holes and seams in the tin roof, and reinforced the sagging areas. The bathroom had damaged walls around the tub, a rotted subfloor, and an unstable toilet. The toilet, vanity, and tub were removed, and a new shower was tiled, along with the installation of a taller toilet and new vanity. Several broken and termite-damaged windows were replaced in the kitchen, front of the house, and back bedroom. The front exterior door was replaced with a weatherproof door to address the rotting jamb. These repairs addressed issues for uncle that had made the bathroom unusable and fixed the leaky roof and windows.



Felix (Wailuku):

Safety Repairs Performed:

The tub was removed and replaced with a fiberglass shower pan and tiled walls to make bathing easier. Grab bars were installed in the shower for added support, and a handrail was added in the hallway to assist with movement around the home. Damaged areas of the laminate floor were repaired and replaced to eliminate tripping hazards, ensuring safer mobility throughout the home.



Nakoa (Wailuku):

Safety Repairs Performed:

The leaks from the roof caused both decks to rot severely. The old set of stairs and decks were removed, and new materials were used to rebuild them, creating a safe entry.



Fox (Makawao):

Safety Repairs Performed:

The exterior of the home was deteriorating, creating a health and safety hazard. The homeowner's insurance company had stated that unless these issues were fixed, the policy would not be renewed, potentially leading to the loss of the home. Portions of the front and back decks had rotted boards and handrails, which were replaced to prevent falls or injuries. Gaps in the back deck's guardrails were also connected, and handrails were installed at all stairways, ensuring a secure and safer environment for the family.





Helekahi (Hana):

Safety Repairs Performed:

The front deck, including the roof, walkway, guardrails, and ramp, was extremely rotted and was replaced. Two broken windows were replaced, and holes in the ceiling, which were leaking, were repaired.



Kaauwai (Molokai):

Safety Repairs Performed:

The front door and steps leading up to it were replaced. Screens were added to seven windows, and the roof was patched to fix the leaks. These improvements benefited both homeowners.



Kekahuna (Lahaina):

Safety Repairs Performed:

The bathtub was replaced with a stand-up shower to accommodate a resident using an ADA scooter, improving safety and accessibility. Grab bars were installed for added stability, and a section of carpet flooring was replaced to make movement easier for wheelchair access. These repairs benefited four people living in the home.



Lono (Hana):

Safety Repairs Performed:

The bathroom was renovated by removing the old vanity, toilet, and shower, replacing the completely rotted subfloor that exposed the plumbing underneath, and installing new plumbing. A new bath vanity, toilet, and shower were also installed to improve functionality and safety. These repairs benefited one person living in the home.



Demello (Molokai):

Safety Repairs Performed:

The bathtub was replaced with a fiberglass shower pan and surround to make bathing easier, and grab bars along with toilet safety rails were installed for better mobility and support. These modifications were made to improve accessibility for someone in a wheelchair. The repairs benefited four people living in the home.



Marie (Napili-Honokowai):

Safety Repairs Performed:

The repairs focused on making the bedroom livable by addressing the leaking roof, replacing the damaged floor that exposed the ground underneath, and installing interior walls. 

The tub was replaced with a shallow shower pan and surround walls to reduce fall risks, and the rotted subfloor was reinforced. An ADA toilet and new bath vanity were installed, and the roof leak was addressed to prevent further damage. These repairs benefited two people.

Safety Repairs Performed:

Following the completion of the cleanup, removal of toxic substances, debris, and soft goods, and the storage of personal belongings, the home underwent a fresh coat of paint. Now Jamie and Justin stepped in and took the initiative to measure the floor space, kitchen, and attic. Jamie promptly ordered all necessary materials and coordinated the delivery of the goods. Contract work commenced immediately, with insulation replacement, flooring installation, and cabinet installation taking place. Jamie kept me informed of each day's progress from January 3rd to February 22nd, until the project was fully completed. I am in my home now and that couldn't have happened without their help.

- We serve clients who would otherwise face **significant barriers to care** due to geographic isolation and medical needs.

2. Unique Services for a Unique Community

- Lāna'i Kinaole is the only home grown licensed Home Health provider offering **in-home skilled nursing and supportive services** on Lāna'i.
- Many of our clients are not eligible for services under **Kupuna Care or Title III** due to age, income, or the type of medical insurance i.e. Medicaid or medical services required i.e. specialty wound care, in home long term (6 weeks or greater) IV medications, etc.
- This program ensures that **no one is left behind**—regardless of eligibility status.

3. Critical County Support

- The County's line-item grant has been **instrumental in sustaining our services** over the past several years, ensuring funding some of the labor costs of staff to ensure we are able to provide services to a segment of the population – we cannot admit everyone that would like to enroll (many seniors).
- This grant was initially provided to **help us launch and stabilize our home health program**, with the hope that we could pursue additional grants and funding over time.
- We've continued to **maximize the County's investment** while seeking other funding streams to grow and strengthen our program.

4. Impact on the Lāna'i Community

• Our services help clients **age in place with dignity**, avoid unnecessary ER visits, hospitalizations, and lengthy hospitalizations off island inpatient while being able to return to their home and stay connected to their families and culture.

- By providing care at home, we also **reduce strain on caregivers** and help prevent early institutionalization.
- We've been able to reach **some of the most medically vulnerable individuals** in our community, thanks to this funding.

5. Importance of Continued Funding

- Continued County support is **essential** to maintain this lifeline of care.
- Without it, many clients would be forced to **travel off-island for services**, which can be physically, emotionally, and financially draining.
- Sustaining this program ensures that **residents of Lāna'i receive equitable access** to health care.
- We have also developed in collaboration with Maui college, a nursing assistant class on Lanai. This has helped nearly 20 students pass over the past few years. Not all work with our team, but some have and some still do.

Thank you so much for your past support and for recognizing the unique challenges our small rural community faces. We humbly ask for your **continued investment** in this critical service so we can continue to care for our elderly neighbors in need. Aloha,

My name is Hedy Udarbe President of the Lahaina-Honolua Senior Citizens Club. I am here to ask you to support all programs that impact the lives of our senior citizens. With the wild fire behind us, the seniors are slowly getting back to normal. They were devastated when the Kaunoa West Maui Center where they held their club's monthly meeting was engulfed in fire. Arleen Gerbig diligently looked for a location and with Debbie Cabebe 's help they found one. Debbie is MEO's CEO.

MEO opened their door and found a room to conduct our monthly meetings. 70% of our members lost their houses to wildfire and 10% whose houses were not burned but unhabitable. They were relocated all over Maui - most have to move several times. You never saw so many happy faces when they were informed that MEO will accommodate us and provide transportation to and from the meeting. Seeing their fellow members, catching up with each other, sharing their losses and comforting each other. Together they slowly heal.

Please continue to fund the MEO Transportation. There are many seniors who can no longer drive. Soon, I will be one of them. They depend on the MEO bus to take them to the Ocean View Day Care Center, grocery shopping, post office, shopping at Queen Kaahumanu Center, Maui Mall, Target and Walmart, to the bank, to their doctor's appointment and to the excursions sponsored by MEO. Transportation also allows our seniors to participate in many activities and events at the Senior Centers throughout the community. Activities like aerobics, tai chi, oil painting and computer classes where our seniors learn new skills.

Many of the seniors live alone. Attending these activities helps them make new friends. Interact with other seniors keeps their minds alert and bodies strong.

MEO drivers are very patient with the seniors. They remained calm in a stressful situation. They bond with the Kupunas.

I would like to share a case where a dialysis patient from Rainbow Dialysis was being driven home at 8:45pm. On the way home, the MEO driver noticed that the patient's arm where the fistula was in place was bleeding and blood dripping. The patient was not aware that he was bleeding. The MEO driver made a quick decision, called dispatch that she was driving patient to Liberty Dialysis where it's closer than Rainbow. Dispatch called Liberty Dialysis, informed them of the situation and upon arrival a nurse was waiting, came on board the MEO bus and assist the patient.
