When purchasing our property, our understanding was that The Fairways would be developed with homes comparable to ours. Affordable housing does not fit in that picture.

Another fact brought up in the meeting is that the fill was dirt from the plantation and may contain harmful chemicals. That is very alarming!

It's sad to see that the residents have to suffer and taxpayers had to foot the bill to cover up the mistakes of the individuals responsible for the project in the first place. Now, we as taxpayers have to pay more to alleviate the problem.
