Toxocariasis (toxocara catii) via feces/soil contamination Plague (yersinia pestis) via fleas Leishmaniasis (leishmania) via biting flying insects Cat Scratch Disease (bartonella henselae) Murine Typhus (Rickettsia typhi) via fleas Feline tapeworm (Dipylidium caninum) via fleas E coli via contaminated soil Babesiosis (babesia) via ticks Hookworm (ancylostoma duodenale) Giardiasis (giardia) via contaminated soil and water Leptospirosis (leptospira) via contaminated soil and water Ringworm (over 40 species of skin-infecting fungus) Sparganosis (spirometra) via contaminated water cryptosporiosis (from cat-feces contaminated water) Rickettsia felis (currently an outbreak in southern California) Apfia felis (another form of cat-scratch fever) Pasteurella motocida (potentially fatal, from cat saliva/bites) MRSA (antibiotic-resistant Staph aureus) Campylobacteriosis (Campylobacter jejunei) Campnocytophagna caminorosus (from cat saliva, body fluids) Salmonellosis (a 'super strain' unique to cats) Platyhelmenthines (flatworms)--more than nine species Sporothrix schenckii & S. brasiliensis (fungi which attack living tissue) Trypanosoma cruzii (Chaga's disease--destroys heart muscle) Chlamydia psittacii (mammalian strain of "parrot fever") Tularemia (weaponized by the US, Russian & Japanese govts.) Quite possibly SARS coronaviruses 1 + 2.
Streptococcus & staph.

If you violate people for keeping undersize fish and other resource offenses, then citing people for poaching by proxy with their hoards of invasive felines is a matter of maintaining the very credibility of government.
