BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

An effective CIP program demands an ability to respond to unanticipated planning, design, permitting, and construction issues in a timely manner.	
CBS-xxxx	d. Lead and Copper Rule Revision Compliance	1,502,403"
	<u>Funding for Lead and Copper Rule Revision ("LCRR") Compliance consists of two phases. Phase 1 is the development of a gap assessment evaluating LCRR requirements against the Department of Water Supply's existing compliance practices to determine what actions need to be taken to comply with the LCRR. Phase 2 includes development of a service line material inventory, community outreach deliverables, lead service line replacement plan, and strengthening drinking water treatment requirements.</u>
