

**Challenge:**

- Parks CIP projects are not getting completed in an efficient or trackable manner.
- Money intended for park related improvements is continuously not being used for its intent.

**Recommendations:** Better project tracking. A better process is needed to improve the efficiency in tracking and completing CIP projects.

More projects need to be specifically line itemed in the budget to provide accountability, transparency, ability for public to see where their money is allocated.

I'm writing to you to express grave concerns I have that the Kulanihakoi Replacement Bridge Project will adversely affect ongoing native Hawaiian cultural practices.

As I have stated in a previous interview, the cultural resources and practices in Kulanihakoi River where construction will take place will affect my family's cultural practices which continues today.

The re-route road is constructed on lands where a living, breathing fresh water spring exist. This kumu wai (fresh water source) runs mauka-to-kai (mountain-to-sea) and is crucial for the survival of our fish, limu and reef life. For me this is "the circle of life". The water from mauka needs to connect to the kai which is a key element to heal, to rejuvenate reef and sea life. Heal the reefs is to heal the Honua (planet).

The practice of offerings to this spring by my father Moki Kalanikau were offerings of gratitude, forgiveness and to honor our Ohana aumakua, the mo'o. Personally it is disrespectful to tamper and harm our religion. To modify or even cover this spring is smothering or choking our Ohana aumakua.

**Questions:**

**1) Wendy, can you tell me what is FHWA? Because FHWA made a Section 106 "no historic properties affected" determination on the project. And SHPD has concurred with that determination.**

**2) Wendy can you provide SHPD's records and contact on this determination?**

**3) In a previous comment in an email regards to this project, the Section 106 comments of concerns is outside the Area of Potential Affect. Can you explain how the area of construction of the re-route road and replacement bridge is not an Area of Potential Affect?**

**4) And Wendy, as I had requested in a earlier meeting session with others, yourself and the archaeologist (Trevor Yucha?), would myself, ohana members or 'Aha Moku Council members be able to have complete access to the construction of the bridge project from beginning to end? Because of the cultural sensitivity to resources and practices.**

**Also I asked what is the possibility that our own monitors be compensated by the County or the Contractor. You were going to check on this request. Is this still considered?**

**The old culvert boxes under the old South Kihei road is in bad shape, deteriorated and a safety hazard, yes we need a new replacement bridge (not concrete boxes) that can service the flowing floods from mauka to makai. And the thought of the County's design, knowingly, when the project is done, Kulanihakoi river will be the same height as the newly completed replacement culvert drain and paved South Kihei Road. Any flow of water in this river, light or heavy, will flow over the road. Just trying to process the sense of it.**

**I look forward to hearing from you to these important questions of concern that needs to be address.**

## **Native Plants and Species in Kulanihakoi River**

### **Akulikuli - Background Information**

This succulent plant is a natural feature in Hawaiian wetlands, providing habitat for invertebrates used as food by native waterbirds.

"Seaside purslane" is one of the few plants that were listed as an emergency food during World War II in a manual called "Emergency Food Plants and Poisonous Plants of the Islands of the Pacific" by the War Department. The manual states that "the purpose of this manual is to aid the individual who becomes separated from his unit...so that this individual can live off the land." It then briefly identifies the plant and how to prepare it. [3]

### **Modern Use**

All fleshy parts are said to be edible and can be eaten raw or cooked. [2,4] The leaves have a slight salty taste and seems to hold its saltiness even when not grown in a seaside environment. [David Eickhoff, Native Plants Hawai'i]

'Ākulikuli was the plant of choice for cleaning the stagnant, murky waters in the Ala Wai Canal (Waikīkī) on O'ahu. Patented platforms of these plants were placed in the canal and the roots helped filter and clear the water of toxins and other unwanted materials.

The flowers can be used in making a beautiful lei but are difficult to make because of requiring a large volume of flowers. [Rick Barboza, Hui Kū Maoli Ola]

**Mau'i** – Used to mend broken bones on humans and animals (horse, cattle, etc.) Prepared in a paste form by pounding the plant and salt together.

**Tobacco Plant** – Found and located in Kulanihakoi River. Need more time to research the possibility if the Blackburn Sphinx moth exist in the area and the laying of eggs on the tobacco plant leaf.

**Ae'o** – Hawaiian Stilt Bird exists in Kulanihakoi River quite frequent

**Kinehi (Spanish Needle)** – You can eat the leaves or cook it. Great for various infections both viral and bacterial. A liver protectant, treat diabetes, a supplement for chronic hepatitis, cure heart disease, and more natural treatment.
