Dear Chair U'u-Hodgins and Members of the Committee on Government Relations, Ethics, and Transparency:

The Disability and Communication Access Board (DCAB) supports Resolution 25-153, which approves for inclusion in the 2026 Hawai'i State Association of the Counties Legislative Package a State Bill Relating to the Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact.

The proposed bill would allow licensed psychologists from other states to provide services in Hawai'i through telepsychology, as well as limited in-person practice across state lines. This measure would expand access to mental health care, particularly for people with disabilities who often face barriers to in-person services, such as limited accessible transportation.

Access to timely mental health care is essential for all community members. Prolonged wait times can worsen mental health conditions and increase hardship for individuals with disabilities. Allowing out-of-state psychologists to practice in Hawai'i would reduce these wait times and improve access to critical services both through telehealth and in-person care.

DCAB supports this resolution as a necessary step to improving access to mental health services in Hawai'i.
