Chair and Members:

Your Water and Infrastructure Committee, having met on August 5, 2019, refers to a Miscellaneous Communication dated May 21, 2019, from the County Clerk, relating to the Central Maui Landfill ("CML") Land Purchase Project ("Project"), CBS-3567.

Your Committee notes the following project description for CBS-3567:

The acquisition of this 17 acres completes the Central Maui Landfill subdivision parcel, approved by the County Development Services Agency in 2009. The additional land will allow for the development of a dedicated Emergency Debris Sorting and Recovery site and other ancillary facilities.

Your Committee notes the following project justification for CBS-3567:

The County does not currently have sufficient land for FEMA-approved emergency debris management. The County needs a permanent solution with larger land area to be prepared for future emergencies, as well as other landfill and refuse related infrastructure facilities. The land is currently available, as sugar cane cultivation has ceased in these fields adjacent to the Central Maui Landfill.

The Director of Environmental Management provided a written Project status update, including a site map.

The Director of Environmental Management said during the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget session that the Council reduced the Project appropriation from \$1,000,000 to \$200,000. Your Committee notes the Council also withheld the bond authorization and requested the matter be referred to your Water and Infrastructure Committee.

The Acting Solid Waste Division Chief stated that to stage debris from the 2016 Iao Valley flood, the Department leased the Project site from A&B Properties. The Director explained the size of the 17-acre Project area was based on the debris volume from that flood event; however, a much larger area is needed to accommodate debris from a Category 4 hurricane, the required basis for the Department's update of its countywide emergency debris management plan.

The Acting Solid Waste Division Chief stated the 17-acre area was appraised at \$720,000. He said A&B Properties would prefer to sell the entire 63-acre parcel, rather than subdivide it, since the remainder would be less desirable to other buyers. Based on the appraisal, the entire parcel is estimated to cost \$2,660,000.

The Acting Solid Waste Division Chief said the proximity of the parcel to the CML is ideal, because the debris will be disposed there after it is processed and reduced. The Director explained a designated site for emergency debris management, pre-approved by the federal government, will allow the County to be reimbursed for disaster costs.

Your Committee inquired whether the significant amount of additional area could be used if the entire parcel is acquired. The Acting Solid Waste Division Chief said the Department has identified needs for additional land, including expanding Environmental Protection and Sustainability Division functions, creating a CML maintenance area, and possibly consolidating the collection baseyards. He said the Department has already purchased a nearby property to address these needs, but said the land purchase could also provide area to support those functions.

Your Committee noted in a large disaster, debris will need to be managed within the disaster area itself, and questioned the need for such a large Project area. The Director said regional sites are being identified for the emergency debris management plan, but eventually the debris will need to be transported to a central area for processing.

Your Committee inquired whether Federal Emergency Management Agency funds could apply to the Project, and the Acting Solid Waste Division Chief responded that funds would be available only after a disaster declaration.

Your Committee acknowledged the need to have available a large area of land to prepare for the anticipated need to clear and process debris after a natural disaster.

Your Committee notes further review of the Project would be more appropriately done by your Economic Development and Budget Committee, which can consider recommending approval of a budget adjustment and bond authorization.

Your Committee voted 6-0 to recommend referral of the communication to your Economic Development and Budget Committee. Committee Chair Lee, Vice-Chair Paltin, and members Kama, Molina, Rawlins-Fernandez, and Sinenci voted "aye." Committee member Hokama was excused.

Your Water and Infrastructure Committee RECOMMENDS that the Miscellaneous Communication be REFERRED to your Economic Development and Budget Committee.



BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 4985, Bill No. 34 (2019), is amended by amending Section 1 to read as follows:

"SECTION 1. Authorization of General Obligation Bonds. Pursuant to Chapter 47, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended, and particularly Part I thereof, there are hereby authorized to be issued and sold from time to time general obligation bonds of the County of Maui, State of Hawaii (the "County") in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed [\$51,927,700] \$52,127,700 (the "Bonds"), the proceeds derived from the sale of which shall be used to pay all or part of the cost of appropriations for the public improvements of the County described in Section 2 hereof."

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 4985, Bill No. 34 (2019), is amended by amending Section 2 to read as follows:

"SECTION 2. <u>Disposition of Bond Proceeds</u>. All or any portion of the proceeds derived from the sale of the Bonds or any notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds shall be used to pay all or part of the cost of any of the public improvements listed below in accordance with appropriations contained in the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget, including amendments and supplements thereto, duly approved by the Council of the County (the "Council") for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020 (the "Fiscal Year 2020 Budget"); provided, however, that pursuant to Section 47-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the part of such proceeds which are in excess of the amounts required for the purposes for which the Bonds are initially issued from time to time, or which may not be applied to such purposes, or which the Council deems should not be applied to such

purposes, may be applied to finance such other public improvements of the County as the Council shall, by ordinance approved by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of all of its members, determine; and provided further that the actual use and application of the proceeds of Bonds issued pursuant to this ordinance shall not in any way affect the validity or legality of such Bonds. No proceeds of the Bonds shall be applied to any public improvement listed in this section unless and until there shall be a valid appropriation of general obligation bond proceeds in effect for such public improvement. The public improvements provided for or to be provided for in the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget, to be financed with proceeds from the sale of the Bonds, are as follows:

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 4985, BILL NO. 34 (2019), RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI ISSUANCE, SALE AND DELIVERY OF SAID BONDS (DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT – CENTRAL MAUI LANDFILL LAND PURCHASE)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 4985, Bill No. 34 (2019), is amended by amending Section 1 to read as follows:

"SECTION 1. <u>Authorization of General Obligation Bonds</u>. Pursuant to Chapter 47, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended, and particularly Part I thereof, there are hereby authorized to be issued and sold from time to time general obligation bonds of the County of Maui, State of Hawaii (the "County") in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed [\$66,927,700] \$68,927,700 (the "Bonds"), the proceeds derived from the sale of which shall be used to pay all or part of the cost of appropriations for the public improvements of the County described in Section 2 hereof."

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 4985, Bill No. 34 (2019), is amended by amending Section 2 to read as follows:

"SECTION 2. Disposition of Bond Proceeds. All or any portion of the proceeds derived from the sale of the Bonds or any notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds shall be used to pay all or part of the cost of any of the public improvements listed below in accordance with appropriations contained in the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget, including amendments and supplements thereto, duly approved by the Council of the County (the "Council") for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020 (the "Fiscal Year 2020 Budget"); provided, however, that pursuant to Section 47-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the part of such proceeds which are in excess of the amounts required for the purposes for which the Bonds are initially issued from time to time, or which may not be applied to such purposes, or which the Council deems should not be applied to such

purposes, may be applied to finance such other public improvements of the County as the Council shall, by ordinance approved by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of all of its members, determine; and provided further that the actual use and application of the proceeds of Bonds issued pursuant to this ordinance shall not in any way affect the validity or legality of such Bonds. No proceeds of the Bonds shall be applied to any public improvement listed in this section unless and until there shall be a valid appropriation of general obligation bond proceeds in effect for such public improvement. The public improvements provided for or to be provided for in the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget, to be financed with proceeds from the sale of the Bonds, are as follows:
