SUBJECT: EMERGENCY AMENDMENT TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2018

BUDGET

The Mayor's Office, in conjunction with the Department of Public Works, hereby transmits the attached proposed bill for the purpose of adding a \$1,000,000 emergency appropriation in the Fiscal Year 2018 Budget under the "Road, Bridge, and Drainage Maintenance Program – Highway Fund" for the removal of dead trees along Piiholo Road.

The \$1,000,000 emergency appropriation will be funded by increasing Carryover/Savings Highway Fund and Estimated Revenues in the amount of \$1,000,000. A Certification of Additional Revenue for Fiscal Year 2018 certifying the availability of Highway Fund Carryover/Savings is attached.

Yesterday, on November 29, 2017, Acting Mayor Keith Regan issued and transmitted to Council Services an emergency proclamation, declaring that the county needs to remove more than 400 dead eucalyptus trees in the county owned rights of way along Piiholo Road before any more falling trees cause property damage, injury or death this winter. As noted in the emergency proclamation, dead trees pose an imminent danger of death, injury, and property damage to our residents and visitors using Piiholo Road, warranting preemptive and protective action.

As safety of our community is a top priority, we request that this budget amendment be considered as soon as possible. Thank you in advance for considering our request for expeditious review, discussion and appropriate action on this critical matter.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

PROCLAMATION

By the authority vested in me as Mayor by the Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended, and the Constitution and laws of the State of Hawaii, in order to provide relief for disaster damages, losses, and suffering, and to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the people, and pursuant to the authority granted to me by Mayor Alan M. Arakawa, by his letter dated November 22, 2017, to serve as Acting Mayor during Mayor Arakawa's absence from 12:41 p.m., Thursday, November 22, 2017, until his return, anticipated to be Monday, December 4, 2017, at approximately 4:39 p.m., I, KEITH A. REGAN, Acting Mayor of the County of Maui of the State of Hawaii, hereby determine, designate and proclaim as follows:

WHEREAS, Chapter 127A, Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") empowers me, Keith A. Regan, as Acting Mayor of the County of Maui of the State of Hawaii, as the sole judge of the existence of imminent danger or threat of an emergency or disaster in any portion of the county; and

WHEREAS, the County owned rights of way in the Pilholo Road area on the island of Maui have in excess of 400 dead eucalyptus trees ranging from 70—100 feet in height, and there have been recent and numerous incidents of such trees falling onto Pilholo Road which endanger passing motorists or pedestrians and pose an imminent threat to life and property, and based on the fact that the County is entering the rainy season and the National Weather service forecasts a wetter than average season, and the fact that rain-softened soil combined with tall dead trees which have been consistently falling and are likely to fall more frequently, especially in the event of heavy winds, and based upon the expertise available to me, I have determined that the dead trees pose an imminent danger of death, injury, and property damage to residents of Maui County, and visitors using Pilholo Road, thereby endangering the health, safety, and welfare of the people, which warrants preemptive and protective action in order to provide for the health, safety, and welfare of the people; and

WHEREAS, there is need for the County government to provide immediate services to mitigate this hazardous situation before it causes property damage, injury or death;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to Section 14(b), HRS Chapter 127A, I, KEITH A. REGAN, Acting Mayor of the County of Maui, do hereby determine that the County of Maui is in imminent danger and that there is the threat of an emergency or disaster for a portion of the county due to the imminent falling of dead trees from the County's right of way along Pliholo Road on the island of Maui, and I DO HEREBY PROCLAIM that a local state of emergency exists as of \(\frac{4:20p}{2:20p}\) (time), this \(\frac{29H}{2:44}\) day of November, 2017, which shall continue until terminated by any separate proclamation, or which shall automatically terminate sixty days after issuance of this PROCLAMATION, whichever occurs first. Pursuant to this Proclamation, I hereby exercise any and all powers listed in Sections 12 and 13 of Chapter 127A, HRS.

SUBJECT: COUNTY COMMUNICATION 17-486 RELATING TO EMERGENCY REMOVAL OF DEAD TREES ON PIIHOLO ROAD

The purpose of this letter is to provide an update on the bids received for the proposed subject project. The Department of Public Works was asked to execute this project should funding be approved, and we have put together a scope of work and vesterday received bids.

We determined that there are 60 trees within the County right-of-way (from the Piiholo zipline entrance down to the end of the grove of dead Eucalyptus trees) which we numbered with white paint. Attempts to number the trees within Piiholo Ranch's property was abandoned due to the proximity of the adjacent gulch, but a visual count estimated about 300, all located within 35 feet of the edge of pavement. Piiholo Ranch has agreed in principle, to allowing us to use their property to lay down the County trees and their trees so as to reduce hauling costs to the landfill. Accordingly, we bid the project in two alternatives:

 Bid Alternate A: Removal of 60 Eucalyptus trees located along Piiholo Road in the vicinity of TMK: (2) 2-4-012:080, within the County right-of-way. Trees Honorable Alan M. Arakawa For Transmittal to: Honorable Mike White, Council Chair December 14, 2017 Page 2

are to be cut to one to two feet (1-2') stumps. Trees to be removed are numbered with white paint or are identified by marking on the pavement. Remove all green waste each day to the Central Maui Landfill.

 Bid Alternate B: Cutting down approximately 360 Eucalyptus trees located along Piiholo Road in the vicinity of TMK: (2) 2-4-012:080, within 35 feet of the edge of pavement. Trees are to be cut to one to two feet (1-2') stumps. All green waste and fallen trees are to remain on the property identified by TMK: 2-4-012:080.

Alternate A's low bid was \$342,420 and Alternate B's low bid was \$448,818, both low bids were from C. Hayes Excavation.

In the last six to eight (6-8) weeks, our Makawao Baseyard has responded to eight (8) trees falling in this grove of dead trees, and another Eucalyptus tree fell near Mile Marker 3 (above the grove area). The cost to the Highway Fund to remove and dispose of the trees averaged \$2,000 per tree, depending on the size of the tree, number of branches, and whether it entangled with utility lines. While our crews are quick to respond, we must acknowledge that they are working in typically very dangerous conditions where more trees can fall at any time. In fact, during one of the callouts, another tree did fall and the crew was essentially sandwiched between the two fallen trees. Motorists waiting for our crews, as well as MPD are also potentially in harm's way while they wait for the tree to be removed.

The proposed work will also cause Piiholo Road to be closed from approximately 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., with the bid specs requiring all work to be done within 60 days. Alternative B is anticipated to have fewer road closure days, or possibly more single-lane closures, as trees will be mostly felled away from the roadway.
