SUBJECT: AMENDMENTS TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2018 BUDGET

On behalf of the Department of Environmental Management, I am transmitting the attached proposed bills for the purpose of deleting a \$1,659,979 appropriation for a Transfer to the Countywide Sewer Capital Improvement Reserve Fund under the Wastewater Administration Program and re-appropriating the funding under the Wastewater Operations Program.

The additional funding under the Wastewater Operations Program will be utilized for the replacement of three switchgears at the Lahaina Wastewater Reclamation Facility that are near or at the end of useful service life. SUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR 2018 REQUEST FOR BUDGET AMENDMENT

We are requesting to transfer funds of \$1,659,979 from our Countywide Sewer Capital Reserve Fund (index code 919002) to index code/subobject code 919035B/6016 to fund replacement of three (3) 12.47 kilovolt electrical switchgear at the Lahaina Wastewater Reclamation Facility (WWRF). The three switchgear are known as USS-1, USS-3, and USS-4, and are located at the 75-side building, 85-side area, and blower building area, respectively. The switchgear range in age from 25 to 40 years old, and are near or at end of useful service life. Their replacement is for electrical service reliability as they are used to provide power to the entire WWRF.
