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PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that in accordance with Section 9-4 of the Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended, the public is invited to present comments before the Council of the County of Maui on FRIDAY, APRIL 17, 2020, beginning at 6:00 p.m. or soon thereafter, online via BlueJeans, on the PROPOSED OPERATING BUDGET for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021 (FY 2021) and CAPITAL PROGRAM as submitted by the Mayor to the Council of the County of Maui pursuant to Section 9-2 of the Revised Charter of the County of Maui.

This meeting is being held online only, to prevent the transmission of COVID 19.

Pursuant to Sections 9-5 and 9-6 of the Revised Charter of the County of Maui, the Council shall adopt an OPERATING BUDGET for FY 2021 and CAPITAL PROGRAM on or before June 10, 2020.

The PROPOSED OPERATING BUDGET and CAPITAL PROGRAM may be examined between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., by appointment, on regular business days in the Office of the County Clerk, County of Maui, 7<sup>th</sup> Floor, Kalana O Maui Building, 200 South High Street, Wailuku, Maui, Hawaii, and online at <https://mauicounty.legistar.com>.

"Board Packets", as defined in Section 92-7.5 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes, are available for inspection at the Office of the County Clerk, between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., by appointment, on regular business days. "Board Packets" are also available electronically as soon as practicable upon request.

Individuals may provide oral testimony by phone or videoconference. To join the meeting by phone, call 1-408-740-7256 or 1-888-240-2560 (toll free) and input meeting ID 592474137 followed by Passcode 1139. If the connection between any testifier and the videoconference is lost, the public hearing will still continue. Members of the public interested in information about offering testimony at the public hearing may contact the Office of the County Clerk (808-270-7748) prior to the public hearing.

Each testifier shall be allowed to speak for up to three minutes. If approved by the presiding officer and announced prior to any oral testimony being taken, the testifier may be allowed one minute to conclude their testimony. No further oral testimony by the testifier shall be permitted. An individual's request to testify may be deemed withdrawn if the individual does not answer when called to testify.
