Pursuant to Sections 9-5 and 9-6 of the Revised Charter of the County of Maui, the Council shall adopt an OPERATING BUDGET for FY 2022 and CAPITAL PROGRAM on or before June 10, 2021.

"Board Packets", as defined in Section 92-7.5 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes, are available for inspection at the Office of the County Clerk, 200 South High Street, Wailuku, Hawaii. "Board Packets" are also available electronically as soon as practicable upon request.

Testifiers will be asked to disconnect from the video conference public hearing once their testimony has concluded.
