BANK OF AMERICA'S COMMITMENT TO PROVIDE MORTGAGES FOR NATIVE HAWAIIANS ON HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS (GREAT-19)

<u>Description:</u> The Committee is in receipt of the following:

- County Communication 19-107, from Councilmember Michael J. Molina, relating to the United States Federal Reserve System's order requiring the Bank of America to provide mortgages on Hawaiian Home Lands.
- 2. County Communication 19-108, from Presiding Officer Pro Tempore Tasha Kama, relating to Bank of America's \$150,000,000 loan commitment for Native Hawaiians on Hawaiian Home Lands.
- 3. County Communication 19-337, from Presiding Officer Pro Tempore transmitting proposed Tasha Kama. а resolution "AUTHORIZING THE EMPLOYMENT OF SPECIAL COUNSEL TO INVESTIGATE AND LITIGATE ACTIONABLE CLAIMS AGAINST BANK OF AMERICA AND THE BANKING AND **MORTGAGE** INDUSTRY." The purpose of the proposed resolution is to authorize the employment of special counsel to investigate and litigate actionable claims against Bank of America and the banking and mortgage industry.

The purpose of the proposed resolution is to urge Corporation Counsel to work with special counsel Bronster Fujichaku Robbins to file legal claims on the County's behalf under Resolution 20-97.

AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES OF THE COUNCIL (VARIOUS) (GREAT-6(1))

<u>Description:</u> The Committee is in receipt of the following:

- 2. Correspondence dated January 13, 2021, from Committee Chair J. Molina, transmitting a proposed resolution entitled Michael "AMENDING THE RULES OF THE COUNCIL." The purpose of the proposed resolution is to incorporate various amendments to Rule 2(B) of the Rules of the Council relating to conducting meetings via video conferencing if allowed by State law or in the event of a County, State, or Federal emergency of significant health crisis or pandemic; the use of Rule 7(G) relating to an urgency that cannot be met if the matter is sent to committee, a matter relating to a County, State, or Federal emergency, or action required to preserve the health, safety, and well-being of residents of the County; and a new Rule 29 relating to a limitation on clarifying questions of testifiers, as attached in Exhibit "A" to the proposed resolution.
