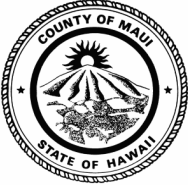

BICYCLE-TOUR PUBLIC SAFETY AND RELATED LITIGATION CONCERNS (GREAT-44)

Description: The Committee is in receipt of the following:

1. County Communication 21-453, from Councilmember Michael J. Molina, transmitting a proposed resolution entitled "URGING THE MAYOR TO ADDRESS BICYCLE TOUR PUBLIC SAFETY AND RELATED LITIGATION CONCERNS." The purpose of the proposed resolution is to urge the Mayor to address bicycle-tour public safety and related litigation concerns on Maui Island.
2. Correspondence dated October 29, 2021, from the Department of the Corporation Counsel, transmitting a proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5.22, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO BICYCLE TOUR BUSINESSES." The purpose of the proposed bill is to amend Chapter 5.22, Maui County Code, to establish limits and restrictions for commercial bicycle-tour businesses to address public safety, traffic, illegal parking, and related litigation concerns on Maui Island.

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE U.S. IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS ENFORCEMENT HOMELAND SECURITY INVESTIGATIONS (GREAT-42)

Description: The Committee is in receipt of County Communication 21-413, from the Acting Chief of Police, transmitting a proposed bill entitled “A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI TO ENTER INTO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE U.S. IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS ENFORCEMENT HOMELAND SECURITY INVESTIGATIONS.” The purpose of the proposed bill is to authorize the Department of Police to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the Department of Homeland Security, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), Homeland Security Investigations. The agreement would permit ICE to designate custom officers in the Department of Police to provide appropriate training in the use of body-worn cameras as described in the Memorandum of Understanding, attached as Exhibit “1.”

Status: The Committee may consider whether to recommend passage of the proposed bill on first reading, with or without revisions. The Committee may also consider the filing of County Communication 21-413 and other related action.

ESTABLISHING A SISTER-CITY RELATIONSHIP WITH SAN CRISTOBAL ISLAND, GALAPAGOS, REPUBLIC OF ECUADOR (GREAT-39)

Description: The Committee is in receipt of County Communication 21-308, from Councilmember Kelly Takaya King, transmitting a proposed resolution entitled “ESTABLISHING A SISTER-CITY RELATIONSHIP WITH SAN CRISTOBAL ISLAND, GALAPAGOS, REPUBLIC OF ECUADOR.” The purpose of the proposed resolution is to authorize the Mayor to formalize a sister-city relationship between the County and San Cristobal Island, Galapagos, Republic of Ecuador, to strengthen the bonds initiated through cultural, business, education, and economic exchanges, and furthering the ties of friendship and promoting goodwill.

CONNECTIVITY

This online meeting is being conducted in accordance with the Governor's most recent emergency proclamation on COVID-19. The proclamation partially suspends the Sunshine Law, and meetings can be conducted without Councilmembers or members of the public being physically present in the same location. Nothing said today or included in the agenda is intended to create obligations in excess of those required under the Sunshine Law and the emergency proclamation.

But if it is unable to do so in a reasonable amount of time, the Committee will continue its meeting, record it on BlueJeans, and after the meeting, forward the recording to Akaku to be included with archived meeting videos.

If connectivity affecting quorum cannot be restored within 30 minutes, the meeting will automatically reconvene the following Tuesday at 9 a.m., using the same virtual connections, unless the Committee announces a different date and time.
